### HEAD COACH PRYOR ORSER

Pryor Orser is in his fifth year as the head coach of the Colorado School of Mines men's basketball team. He claims an overall record of 57-74, including a 35-55 mark in Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference games.

In 2004-05, he guided the squad to a 16-12 record (10-9 RMAC) and a berth in the RMAC Tournament. In addition, Orser guided CSM to a 74-71 upset of then No. 1-ranked Metro State on Jan. 22 in Volk Gym.

He was instrumental in helping senior guard Stephen Bahl earn First Team All-RMAC, First Team All Region and Third Team All-American honors. In addition, he was also named the North Central Region Player of the Year.

Orser has coached a total of 11 All-Conference players at CSM, including three Freshmen of the Year, most recently Ben Mohr a season ago.

Orser received his Bachelor of Science in Business Administration with minors in Economics and History in 1990 from Eastern Montana College and his Masters of Education in 1995 from Montana State University-Billings.

His previous coaching experience includes a four-year tenure at Northwest College in Wyo., where he worked as the head coach of the women's basketball program and an assistant to the men's basketball program. He also served a two-year stint as the assistant men's coach at Carroll College in Helena, Mont., and a three-year stint as the men's assistant at Montana State University at Billings.

## OREDIGGER GAME NOTES

**CSM PICKED FIFTH IN RMAC PRESEASON POLL:** The Colorado School of Mines men's basketball team was picked fifth in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference East Division Preseason Poll with 62 total points. Metro State was tabbed No. 1 with 21 points and seven first place votes to narrowly edge Nebraska-Kearney who received 22 points and six first place votes. They were followed by Fort Hays State (34 points and one first place vote), Regis (50), **Colorado School of Mines (62)**, Chadron State (70) and Colorado Christian (85).

**UP NEXT:** CSM will conclude the regular season with home games against Metro State and Regis on Friday and Saturday night in Volk Gym. Tipoff for both games is 8:00 pm.

**LAST WEEK:** CSM won at Chadron State, 47-45, on Thursday night, but fell at second-ranked Fort Hays State, 81-60, on Saturday night.

**AGAINST CHADRON STATE (2/9):** Colorado School of Mines junior guard **Franklin Ryk** tallied 14 points and eight rebounds to lift the Orediggers to a 47-45 win at Chadron State. Junior center **Ian Elseth** added 12 points and eight boards, while senior guard **Travis Test** chipped in nine points and dropped six dimes.

**AGAINST FORT HAYS STATE (2/11):** Fort Hays State, ranked second in Division II, raced out to a 42-25 lead at halftime and defeated Colorado School of Mines, 81-60, at Gross Memorial Coliseum. CSM was led by senior guard **Travis Test** who scored 16 points and added five boards and three assists. Junior forward **Davey Iverson** registered 11 points, six rebounds and two blocked shots, while junior guard **Franklin Ryk** tallied 13 points.

**ABOUT COLORADO CHRISTIAN:** The Cougars enter the week at 9-14 overall and tied with CSM in RMAC play at 6-9. Over the weekend, CCU fell at Fort Hays State, 78-61, and defeated Chadron State, 65-56, behind 21 points from Josh Gallagher. The Cougars have five players who average double figures, including Brian Stamer who posts an RMAC-best 20.9 points per game to go along with 8.5 rebounds per night. Peter Bailey (11.3 ppg), Gallagher (10.5 ppg), Troy Johnson (11.0 ppg) and Micah Kohls (10.7 ppg) also average double digits. As a team, CCU averages 71.2 points per game and shoots 47 percent from the floor, 39 percent from three-point land and 73 percent from the foul line.

**ABOUT NEBRASKA-KEARNEY:** The Lopers begin the week at 18-5 overall and 13-2 in the RMAC and have won five straight and seven of eight overall. Last weekend, UNK handed Regis (87-67) and Metro State (85-75) losses in Kearney. Dusty Jura, who was one assist shy of a triple double in UNK's win over CSM two weeks ago, leads the team in both scoring (18.8 ppg) and rebounding (9.1 rpg). Chris Dean posts 13.0 points and 6.0 rebounds per night, while James Lane (12.8 ppg) and Chad Burger (11.4 ppg) also score in double figures. The Lopers average an RMAC leading 81.0 points per game and shoot an RMAC best 51 percent from the floor. UNK also shoots 40 percent from three-point land and 68 percent from the foul line.

**WE MEET AGAIN:** This will be the second meeting for CSM with both Colorado Christian and Nebraska-Kearney in less than two weeks. Back on Jan. 31, the Orediggers fell to CCU, 65-62, in Volk Gym. On Feb. 3, the Orediggers dropped a 72-62 decision at UNK.

**HOME SWEET HOME:** Prior to this year, CSM had been close to unbeatable at home as it was 19-1 over its 20 home games entering this season. CSM is 6-5 at Volk Gymnasium this season. Prior to losing to Fort Lewis on Dec. 16, CSM had won seven straight home games.

**ROAD WOES:** In contrast, CSM has not fared as well on the road as it is just 5-16 over its last 21 road games. CSM broke a 10-game road losing streak with a 68-52 win at Western State on Dec. 10. Prior to that win, the Orediggers had not won on the road since Dec. 20, 2004, an 82-74 win at Adams State.

**BATTLE TESTED:** Senior point guard **Travis Test** has been very productive in running the show for CSM this season as he is third on the team at 10.5 points per game and has dished out a team-best 89 assists compared to 46 turnovers. Test has scored in double figures in seven of the last 10 games, including a career-best 21 points in a Jan. 31 loss to Colorado Christian. He is fourth in the RMAC in assists (3.9 apg) and tied his career-high with seven assists against both Chadron State and Fort Hays State three weeks ago.

**LESS IS NOT MOHR:** Sophomore forward **Ben Mohr** earned RMAC Freshman of the Year honors last season. It marked the third time in the last four seasons that a player from CSM had won the award as Mohr joined Stephen Bahl (2001-02) and Kevin Wagstaff (2002-03). Mohr has missed the last five games and six of the last seven due to injury.

**IF I COULD BE LIKE RYK:** Junior guard **Franklin Ryk** is the top returning scorer for CSM as he averaged 8.3 points per game last season. This season, Ryk is fourth on the team in scoring at 9.8 points per game. He has missed out on his first career double-double on two occasions this season as he came up one rebound short each time against St. Martin's and Gwynedd Mercy. In a Jan. 20 overtime win at Metro State, Ryk scored 17 points as he was 5-of-5 from three-point land. He is averaging 13.3 points per game over the last four.

**HE'S NOT ALLEN, BUT:** Junior forward **Davey Iverson** is back for his third year at CSM. The 6-foot-6 Iverson has played in all 78 games during his career and has averaged 6.7 points, 5.1 rebounds and 1.1 blocked shots per game. He started all but one game as a freshman, came off the bench in all but one game last season and has started 14-of-23 games this season.

**WE WANT MOORES:** Junior center **Clayton Moores** has grabbed at least five rebounds in 10 games this year and dished out a career-best five assists in a loss to Fort Lewis on Dec. 16. In a Jan. 20 win at Metro State, Moores notched his first career double double with a career-best 16 points and 10 rebounds.

**BLOCK PARTY:** Juniors **Davey Iverson** and **Clayton Moores** are making it tough for opponents to come into the paint as each ranks in the top-3 of the RMAC in blocked shots. Iverson ranks second in the conference with 39 blocks (1.7 bpg), while Moores is third with 38 (1.65 bpg). CSM is ranked first in the RMAC in blocked shots with 94 (4.1 bpg).

**KYLE HAS STYLE:** Freshman guard **Kyle Pape** has made big strides throughout the season. After scoring just 18 points in the first four games, Pape is averaging 16.1 points over the last 17 games (273 total), including 15 in double figures. He had his string snapped at five games of scoring at least 20 points in a Jan. 14 win over CSU-Pueblo. He is leading the team in scoring at 13.9 points per game (10th in the RMAC) and is a strong candidate for RMAC Freshman of the Year as he is also averaging 3.2 rebounds and 2.4 assists per night.

**HELP FROM THE NORTHWEST:** Junior center **Ian Elseth**, who played at Snow Junior College last season and at Oregon State in 2001-02, is currently second on the team in scoring (11.7 ppg) and leads the team in rebounding (6.1 rpg). He has led the team in scoring six times and has 13 double digit scoring games. Elseth ranks second in the RMAC in field goal percentage (.585), 11th in rebounding (6.1 rpg) and 20th in scoring (11.7 ppg). He posted a career-high 12 rebounds in a Jan. 28 win over Chadron State.

**GOOD COMPANY:** In high school, Elseth was named to the Oregon All-State First Team along with former Arizona standout Salim Stoudamire, currently with the Atlanta Hawks in the NBA, and former Kansas stars Aaron Miles and Michael Lee. Miles is currently playing with the Golden State Warriors in the NBA.

**THE AUSTRALIAN DUO:** The CSM roster features a pair of student-athletes from Australia. Sophomore guard **Alex Hayman** is from Sydney, while freshman guard **Troy Sandley** is from Eltham.

**CASEY ON THE COURT:** Freshman guard **Casey O'Hayre** made his first appearance of the season in the Dec. 17 loss to Adams State. He was pulled out of his redshirt season and will play the rest of the year. O'Hayre posted four points, two assists and a steal in 17 minutes in a win over UCCS on Jan. 7 and came back in a Jan. 14 win over CSU-Pueblo with career highs in points (5), rebounds (2) and assists (3) in nine minutes. He tied his career high with five points in a Feb. 3 loss at Nebraska-Kearney.

**GRANT'S GOOD WEEK:** Freshman guard **Grant Gunhus** recently had his best two games of the season. In a Jan. 5 loss at N.M. Highlands, he posted a career-best eight points and topped that in a Jan. 7 win at UCCS with 11 points in six minutes of action. In the two games, he hit 7-of-9 shots, including 5-of-7 from three-point land.

**CLOSE CALLS:** CSM has played its share of close games this year, but has also been involved in its share of blowouts. The Orediggers are 4-4 in games decided by 11 points or more and 5-8 in games decided by 10 points or less. CSM has lost games by two points to St. Martin's, two points in overtime to Fort Lewis, five points to Adams State and North Dakota, four points at New Mexico Highlands, four points to sixth-ranked Fort Hays and three points to Colorado Christian.

**MISSED GAMES:** Several of CSM's starters and key reserves have missed games this season due to injuries or illness. Freshman guard **Kyle Pape** (Colorado Christian and Nebraska-Kearney) and junior center **Ian Elseth** (Metro State and Regis) have both missed two games, junior guard **Franklin Ryk** (Western State, Fort Lewis and Adams State) has missed three games and sophomore forward **Ben Mohr** has missed eight games, including the last five and six of the last seven overall.
