HEAD COACH PAULA KRUEGER

Paula Krueger is in her third year as the head women's basketball coach at Colorado School of Mines.

Last season, Krueger led CSM to its best season in program history as the team tallied a 19-9 overall record, including 13-6 in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

In addition, she guided the squad to the RMAC Tournament for the second straight year where the fifth-seeded Orediggers lost in the opening round at fourth-seeded Fort Hays State.

A graduate of Northern State, Krueger was a standout on the basketball court as she earned national tournament MVP honors as a senior during Northern's national championship campaign in 1993-94. In addition, Krueger was also a team captain and all-district performer on NSU's softball team. She earned NSU's prestigious Hildred Wolfe Student Athlete of the Year award as a senior.

Following her successful athletic career, Krueger served as a graduate assistant at Northern State from 1995-96 for women's basketball and softball while finishing up her studies. She received her bachelor's in education from Northern in 1995 and her master's in teaching in 1996.

After graduation, Krueger served as the assistant women's basketball coach and head softball coach at Northern State. During her six year's as assistant at NSU, she helped lead her squad to a 114-59 mark.

OREDIGGER GAME NOTES

MINES PICKED FIFTH IN PRESEASON RMAC POLL: The Colorado School of Mines women's basketball team was picked fifth out of seven teams in the Preseason RMAC East Division Poll. Regis University was picked to win the division as it received 8 first place votes and 18 points. Metro State was picked second with 23 points, while Fort Hays State was third with 43 points. Nebraska-Kearney (44 points), Mines (58), Chadron State (72) and Colorado Christian (85) rounded out the poll.

LAST TIME OUT (11/15/05): The Colorado Mines women's basketball team had five players in double-figures en route to a 98-24 win over Johnson and Wales in their first game of the regular season. **Ashley Gronewoller** led the way with 17 points nine rebounds and four assists while teammate **Angela Pearson** added 14 points and a team high 10 rebounds.

LAST TIME vs. WAYNE STATE (11/19/04): Mines placed only one player in double-figures last year in their 55-50 setback against Wayne State. Mines went into halftime with a 24-21 lead but was unable to hold off the Warriors, who outscored CSM, 34-26, in the second half. **Angela Pearson** led Mines with 11 points and 8 boards, while **Ashley Gronewoller** added eight points and seven boards. Nicole Gruntorad led Wayne State with 15 points.

LAST TIME vs. NORTHERN STATE (11/20/04): The Orediggers struggled offensively last year en route to a 81-54 loss against Northern State. Without any players in double-figures, Mines struggled to keep the score close going into half 57-27. Emily Przekawas led Mines with nine points. Noelle Hall led Northern State with 15 points.

WHAT'S BACK AND WHAT'S LOST: The Orediggers lost four of their five starters. However, senior Ashley Gronewoller returns after she has already established herself as one of the best in Mines history. Also returning for Mines are juniors Angela Pearson and Shannon Griep and sophomores Yogi Patterson, Amanda Adams, Emily Przekwas and Liz Jeffries.

SUPER SENIOR: CSM senior center **Ashley Gronewoller** will look to build upon her already successful career at Mines. Last year, Gronewoller made her second straight appearance on the First Team East Division and third straight appearance on the All-RMAC East Division Team. She finished the season averaging a team-best 12.9 points and 7.1 rebounds per game. She also led the team with 45 blocked shots, while shooting 58 percent (144-247) from the field. Gronewoller was also selected to the pre season All RMAC and All RMAC East Division Teams for the 2005-06 season.

GRONEWOLLER RECORDS: Gronewoller is also closing in on three Colorado School of Mines records. She currently ranks fifth with career points with 1,033, fourth in career rebounds with 632 and fifth in career field goals made with 410.

"ANGEL" A AMONG US: Junior forward **Angela Pearson** is also back looking to make big strides following an impressive season last year in which she was fourth on the team in scoring (8.4) and third in rebounds (5.8).

OUT OF THIS COUNTRY: Iva Tomova is originally from Varan, Bulgaria and transferred to Mines from Northeastern Junior College after a successful career at Tomova played just 15 minutes in Tuesday's season opening win against Johnson and Wales and ended the game with 15 points.

BE LIKE EICK: After sitting out last season due to injury, Sara Eickelman will be Mines' starting point guard this season. Eickelman started the season against Johnson and Wales ending with seven points and five assists. ‘

GET IT STARTED RIGHT: CSM got the season started right with a 98-24 win against Johnson and Wales on Tuesday. Over the past five years, Mines is 3-2 in season opening games. Mines won its first game last season 88-38 against Johnson and Wales which spearheaded CSM's record breaking season of 19 wins. They finished with an overall record of 19-9 and were 13-6 in the conference.

LET'S GET 60: The number 60 appears to be the good luck charm for the women's basketball team. In the past three seasons, Mines is 25-3 when it scores at least 60 points. CSM only lost once last season when it scored at least 60 points and it was on February 18, 2005 against Nebraska Kearney. Mines lost 73-62.
