### HEAD COACH PAULA KRUEGER

Paula Krueger is in her third year as the head women's basketball coach at Colorado School of Mines.

Last season, Krueger led CSM to its best season in program history as the team tallied a 19-9 overall record, including 13-6 in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

In addition, she guided the squad to the RMAC Tournament for the second straight year where the fifth-seeded Orediggers lost in the opening round to fourth-seeded Fort Hays State.

A graduate of Northern State, Krueger was a standout on the basketball court as she earned national tournament MVP honors as a senior during Northern's national championship campaign in 1993-94. In addition, Krueger was also a team captain and all-district performer on NSU's softball team. She earned NSU's prestigious Hildred Wolfe Student Athlete of the Year award as a senior.

Following her successful athletic career, Krueger served as a graduate assistant at Northern State from 1995-96 for women's basketball and softball while finishing up her studies. She received her bachelor's in education from Northern in 1995 and her master's in teaching in 1996.

After graduation, Krueger served as the assistant women's basketball coach and head softball coach at Northern State. During her six year's as assistant at NSU, she helped lead her squad to a 114-59 mark.

## OREDIGGER GAME NOTES

**MINES CURRENTLY FIFTH IN RMAC:** The Colorado School of Mines women's basketball team is fifth in the East Division of the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference. Mines is behind Regis who is in first, Fort Hays State second, Metro State third and Nebraska-Kearney who sits in fourth. Chadron State and Colorado Christian round out the division in sixth and seventh.

**LAST WEEK (1/20, 1/21):** The Colorado School of Mines women's basketball split their games this weekend, with a 52-39 loss to Fort Hays on Friday and a 67-54 win over Chadron State Saturday night.

**AGAINST FORT HAYS:** The Orediggers went into Friday's game against Fort Hays ready to go as they kept the game even going into halftime tied 17-17. The second half Mines struggled, shooting only 17.6 % from the field and turning over the ball 12 times. Fort Hays capitalized on Mines' mistakes and outscored the Orediggers 35-22 giving them a 52-39 win. Hays improved to 10-1 in the conference while Mines fell to 4-6. Despite losing, Ashley Gronewoller broke the school record for most career rebounds Friday night against Fort Hays.

**AGAINST CHADRON:** Mines was able to pressure Chadron from the get go, shooting 62.5% from the field in the first half Mines had a 38-24 lead. Mines continued the pressure in the second, and put in thier second line to rest their starting line up and avoid any injurys. Gronewoller ended with 22 points while Liz Jeffries was a perfect 4-4 from three, ending with 14 points.

**COLORADO CHRISTIAN:** The Cougars come into this game with a 4-17 record and are currently trailing in the East Division with a 1-10 conference record. They are led by Sara Davis who is averaging 15.5 points per game and 6.4 rebounds. Last year, Mines won both matchups against the Cougars.

**OUTLOOK ON NEBRASKA-KEARNEY:** UNK currently is right in front of the Orediggers in the East Division with an 8-3 record. A win would be huge for the Orediggers on Friday night to get closer to over taking the fourth position in the Division. The Lopers come into the game after losing two straight to Division leader Regis and third place Metro State. Kearney has five people averaging in double figures for points this season, with Kalee Modlin leading the way with 14.2ppg and 7.0 rebounds.

**SUPER SENIOR ASHLEY GRONEWOLLER:** This season, Gronewoller is averaging 14.1 points and 8.2 rebounds. She was named the RMAC Player of the Week in week 3. Currently, Gronewoller ranks 12th in the RMAC with a 14.1 average for points per game, is third in rebounding (8.2), is third with a .561 field goal percentage and is second in blocked shots with a total of 39.

**GRONEWOLLER RECORDS:** Gronewoller is also closing in on three Colorado School of Mines records. This past weekend against Fort Hays, Gronewoller broke the school record for most career rebounds. She now has the record with 778. She also ranks second with career points with 1,284 and second in career field goals made with 513. Here is a showing of who Gronewoller is chasing in these categories.

**“ANGEL”A AMONG US:** Junior forward **Angela Pearson** continues to follow her impressive season last year in which she was fourth on the team in scoring (8.4) and third in rebounds (5.8). This season, Pearson currently is second on the team in rebounds, averaging 5.9 per game and is averaging 10.5 points per game, third on the team. Pearson sat out Saturday night against Chadron State due to a concussion she suffered the night before against Fort Hays.

**OUT OF THIS COUNTRY:** Iva Tomova is originally from Varna, Bulgaria and transferred to Mines from Northeastern Junior College, after a successful career at her junior college, Tomova is first on the team with 54 assists in 18 games played, which puts her 11th in the RMAC. She also is second on the team with a 13.1 points per game average, which puts her 15th in the RMAC. She also is ranked sixth in the RMAC with a .836 free throw percentage. Tomova struggled Friday night against Fort Hays, but bounced back Saturday scoring eight points and led the team with seven rebounds.

**JEFFRIES BREAKS OUT:** Sophomore Liz Jeffries broke out this past weekend against Chadron State. Jeffries ended the night 4-5 from the field and a perfect 4-4 from three. She chipped in 14 points and two rebounds in Mines’ 67-54 win over the Eagles. Jeffries currently ranks fifth on the team with 5.3 points per game and is third in assists with 45.

**BE LIKE EICK:** After sitting out last season due to injury, Sara Eickelman will be Mines’ starting point guard this season. She currently is second on the team with 54 assists, which puts her 14th in the RMAC. Eickelman led Mines on Friday against Fort Hays with 14 points and shooting a perfect 6-6 from the free throw line.

**CRISP BEGINNING:** Freshman Kelsey Crist has started her collegiate career off on a high note. Averaging 6.3 ppg and 5.1 rebounds, Crist has proven to be a big addition to the Orediggers team this season, becoming one of the starters. Crist She currently ranks fourth on the team in scoring (6.4) and third in rebounds (5.3). This past weekend, Crist had a team high along with a team high for the season with four steals against Chadron State.

**LET’S GET 60:** The number 60 appears to be the good luck charm for the women’s basketball team. In the past three seasons, Mines is 25-3 when it scores at least 60 points. This season, Mines is 8-2 when they score at least 60.

**HOME SWEET HOME:** Mines is close to unbeatable at home this season, with a 7-2 home record. Mines lost for the second time this season at home this weekend against Fort Hays on Friday. They bounced back however, with a win on Saturday against Chadron. They will play their last home game until February 18th this Tuesday January, 31 against Colorado Christian.
