HEAD COACH PAULA KRUEGER

2007-08 marks Paula Krueger's fifth year as the head women's basketball coach at Colorado School of Mines.

Last season, Krueger led the Orediggers to a 15-13 overall record and a 12-7 mark in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference. CSM qualified as the #6 seed in the annual RMAC Shootout, marking the fourth time in as many years that the Orediggers had reached the post season. Two of Krueger's players, Iva Tomova (First Team All-East Division) and Angela Pearson (Honorable Mention All-East Division), earned recognition on the 2006-07 All-RMAC squads.

In 2005-06, Krueger guided CSM to a 16-14 overall record (8-11 RMAC) as the Orediggers reached the RMAC Shootout title game for the first time in the history of the program. At the conclusion of the 2005-06 season, Ashley Gronewoller was named First Team All-RMAC. Gronewoller graduated as the all-time leading scorer and rebounder at CSM.

Krueger's team enjoyed its best-ever season in 2004-05, compiling a 19-9 overall record (13-6 RMAC) and reaching the RMAC Shootout for the second straight year.

In Krueger's first season at the helm (2003-04), the Orediggers went 10-9 in conference play and qualified as the #7 seed in the RMAC Shootout. CSM's 12-16 overall record was an eight-game improvement from the previous year.

A graduate of Northern State, Krueger was a standout on the Wolves' women's basketball team, earning national tournament MVP honors as a senior during the team's national championship campaign in 1993-94. In addition, Krueger was also a team captain and All-District performer on NSU's softball team. Krueger earned NSU's prestigious Hildred Wolfe Student Athlete of the Year award as a senior.

Following her collegiate playing career, Krueger served as a graduate assistant for the Wolves' women's basketball and softball teams (1995-96) while finishing her studies. Krueger received her bachelor's degree in Education from NSU in 1995 and her master's degree in Teaching in 1996.

After her graduation, Krueger moved to Nevada where she taught and coached at Pahrump Valley High School for one year before returning to Northern State in 1997 to serve as the assistant women's basketball coach and head softball coach. During her six years as an assistant on the NSU hoops squad, Krueger helped guide the Wolves to a 114-59 mark.

Krueger and her husband, Brad, make their home in Golden.

OREDIGGER GAME NOTES

CSM PICKED FOURTH IN RMAC PRESEASON POLL: The Colorado School of Mines women's basketball team was picked fourth in the 2007-08 Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Women's Basketball East Division Preseason Poll. The Orediggers received 90 total points to finish behind East Division favorite Nebraska-Kearney and runner-up Metro State. Kearney received five first place votes and 25 total points, while Metro garnered five first place votes and 31 total points. Regis finished third with 43 points and was followed by MINES (90), UC-Colorado Springs (111), Colorado Christian (136) and Chadron State (157).

CSM UPSETS KEARNEY: The Orediggers went into Nebraska-Kearney this past weekend and came away with a 73-61 victory. It is only the second loss for the Lopers in conference play.

UP NEXT: CSM will return to action on February 1st and 2nd with two conference road games. The Orediggers will travel to face west side opponent, Regis University on Friday and then will go on to face west side UC-Colorado Springs on Saturday.

LAST TIME OUT (1/24-1/26): The Colorado School of Mines women's basketball team split a pair of home conference games this past weekend. The Orediggers lost a close one this weekend to Chadron State 58-60 in overtime. They were able to bounce back however and take out the RMAC West Division leader Nebraska-Kearney 73-61.

ABOUT REGIS UNIVERSITY: The Rangers currently hold a 5-6 RMAC record and 9-10 overall record. They sit right behind the Orediggers in the RMAC standings in fifth place so Friday's night is crucial when it comes to the RMAC standings. They are led by three individuals who average over 10 points per game. Paulina Tuell leads the way with her 15.6 points per game average, while Stevi Seitz leads the team averaging 7.3 boards per game not to mention her 15.1 ppg. Breanna Burley is the third ranger who averages in double figures with 10.4 ppg.

ABOUT UCCS: UCCS sits at the bottom of the RMAC West Division with a 3-8 conference record and 9-13 overall record. The Mountain Lions are definitely not out of the picture as every game counts for them. They are led by Tonya Tripps 15.5 points per game average and 8.2 boards per game average.

FROM THE "PEANUT GALLERY": Junior Sara "Peanut" Eickelman will continue to be the backbone for Mines this season as the starting point guard. Eickelman was the only player to start in all 28 game last season. Eickelman currently leads the Orediggers in assists, averaging 2.8 per game ranking her seventh in the RMAC. She also is ranked sixth in the RMAC with an average of 2.00 steals per game. Eickelman had a career weekend as she scored a career high on Thursday night against Chadron State, she finished with 22 points. She then went on to score 16 against Kearney on Saturday.

"GOLDEN GIRL" DALTON: A Golden, Colo. native, Emily Dalton proved herself as one of the top players after her impressive play on the court last season as a true freshman. Dalton got the roll as a starter in 06-07 just three games into the season, she then went on to start the next 25 games for the Orediggers. Dalton currently leads the team with her 13.7 points per game average. Dalton led Mines with 25 points in Saturday's win at Kearney. She currently is ranked 10th in the RMAC with her 13.7 points per game average. She has also scored in double figures in 14 of the Orediggers 21 games.

STEVIE IS A "WONDER": A transfer from Fresno State, Stevie Hagemeister will be one of the Orediggers starters this season. The Orediggers expect big things from the 6-0 forward who played in 11 games last season for the Fresno State Bulldogs. Gaffney played only nine minutes this weekend against Chadron and ended with four points and six boards.

BRECCA GAFFNEY: After redshirting the 2006-07 season due to shoulder surgery, Gaffney returns to the starting lineup for the Orediggers this year. Gaffney showed exactly why Mines missed her on the court last season as she is second on the team this season averaging 9.6 ppg and leads the team with 7.2 boards per game ranking her seventh in the RMAC. Gaffney played only nine minutes this weekend against Chadron and ended with four points and six boards.

ONE SAVVY OREDIGGER: Savannah "Savy" Afoa will be the starting center for the Orediggers this season. After coming in as a starter in the middle of the season last year. Afoa is third in the RMAC with 27 blocked shots on the season. Afoa had a team high of six boards this weekend against Kearney.
