### ABOUT THE SERIES

Colorado School of Mines and Washburn have met on the gridiron 14 times, with the Ichabods holding a 10-4 advantage in the all-time series dating back to 1953. The two teams played every year from 1953-1959 and again from 1961-1964 before resuming the series in 2004 when the Orediggers defeated Washburn, 34-27, in the season opener for both teams in Topeka, KS. Last year, WU captured its second straight victory over CSM with a 41-21 victory in Topeka. Following is a complete list of the CSM-Washburn all-time series.

### THE HEAD COACHES

**Bob Stitt** is in his eighth season as the head coach at CSM and claims a 44-34 (.564) overall record. Stitt's .564 winning percentage is the highest by a CSM football coach who has coached in at least 20 games and the highest for a modern day coach at CSM. In addition, Stitt's 44 wins are the third most in CSM history and trail only Marv Kay (84 wins from 1969-1995) and Fritz Brennecke (78 wins from 1947-1969). Stitt is 1-2 all-time vs. Washburn.

Washburn is led by sixth-year Head Coach **Craig Schurig**, who played his collegiate football at Colorado School of Mines. The 2005 MIAA Coach of the Year, Schurig was a four-year letterman as a defensive back for the Orediggers and was selected team captain as a senior when he garnered Second Team All-Conference accolades. Schurig earned a bachelor's degree in Petroleum Engineering from CSM in 1987. Schurig claims an overall mark of 32-25 at Washburn. Schurig is 2-1 all-time against his alma mater.

### ALL-TIME RECORD

CSM claims a 368-512-30 all-time record in 119 seasons of collegiate football. The Orediggers' first-ever football game, a 6-4 win over Denver University, was played in 1888.

### CSM vs. THE "W's"

CSM is 66-87-3 all-time against the seven schools it has played that begin with the letter "W". The Orediggers have won nine of their last 12 games against schools that begin with the letter "W". Over those 12 games, CSM has outscored its opponents, 412-242.

Bob Stitt returns for his eighth season as the head football coach at Colorado School of Mines in 2007.

During his first seven years, Stitt has guided the Orediggers to a 44-34 overall record, including a 30-27 mark in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference. Stitt's .564 winning percentage is the highest by a Mines football coach who has coached in at least 20 games and the highest for a modern day coach at CSM.

The Orediggers' 6-5 overall record in 2005 gave the CSM its fifth consecutive winning season, marking the first time that had happened in the history of the program (119 years). A total of 13 players earned All-RMAC honors in 2006, while RB Bryan Florendo, WR/KR Michael Curl and K Aaron Abel garnered All-Region recognition. Florendo, who in 2006 became the first Oredigger to rush for 1,000 yards (1,018) since 1939, as also selected as the Offensive Player of the Year on the NFF's All-Colorado Team.

In 2004, Stitt led the Orediggers to the best season in school history as the team went undefeated (8-0) in conference play and captured its first RMAC title since 1958. In addition, the 2004 squad posted a perfect 11-0 mark in the regular season and advanced to the NCAA Division II playoffs for the first time in program history. In the opening round, Stitt led CSM to a 52-33 home victory over Midwestern State University. Mines was defeated in the second round of the playoffs at top-ranked Pittsburg State - the eventual national runner-up - to end its season and also snap a school-record 14-game winning streak, which was the second longest in Division II at the time. The record-setting 2004 season helped earn Stitt RMAC Coach of the Year, Division II AFCA Region 5 Coach of the Year and d2football.com Southwest Regional Coach of the Year accolades.

Furthermore, Stitt was instrumental in helping senior quarterback Chad Frieauf win the 19th Annual Harlon Hill Trophy in 2004 as the top player in NCAA Division II. Frieauf, who established an NCAA Division II single-season record for passing yards (4,646) in 2004, became the first player from CSM and the RMAC to win the Harlon Hill Trophy. A total of 18 Orediggers earned both All-RMAC and NFF All-Colorado honors in 2004, while six players brought home All-Region laurels. Three players also went on to receive All-America recognition, including Frieauf (First Team), safety Daniel Leger (Honorable Mention) and wide receiver Justin Gallas.

In 2001 and 2002, Stitt led Mines to consecutive 7-4 finishes. The seven wins in 2001, which marked the first winning season for Mines since 1991 (6-4), were the most by the Orediggers since 1958. The 2001 and 2002 seasons also marked the first time since 1975 and 1976 that the CSM football team had produced back-to-back winning years.

During his tenure at CSM, Stitt has coached 79 All-RMAC performers, 17 All-Region selections and four All-Americans.

Before coming to Colorado School of Mines, Stitt most recently served as an offensive coordinator at Harvard University, helping the Crimson set school records in total offense in a game (640 yards), passing yards in a game (405), first downs in a game (34) and points scored in an Ivy League game (63). Stitt's 1999 offense ranked first among Ivy League teams in rushing, third in scoring and fourth in total offense.

A graduate of Doane College (Nebraska), Stitt received various accolades as a running back and a return specialist - including All-State College Offensive Player of the Year in 1985 - when he played for the Tigers in the mid-80's. Stitt also played left field for the Doane baseball squad and competed in the 4x100m relay on the track & field team.

Stitt returned to coach at his alma mater after receiving his master's degree in Physical Education from the University of Northern Colorado in 1989. The offensive coordinator and offensive line coach for four years at Doane, Stitt produced three NAIA Division II All-Americans and 19 All-NIAC offensive players during his tenure. Stitt went on to coach

### ALL ABOUT WASHBURN UNIVERSITY

In 2006, the Ichabods went 7-4 overall en route to recorded their third straight winning season. Washburn University, which tied for fourth place in the MIAA (6-3) in 2006 and concluded the year ranked # 10 in the *d2football.com* Southwest Regional rankings, is picked to finish third in the 2007 MIAA Pre-Season Poll. The Ichabods return 15 starters in 2007, with six on offense, eight on defense and one on special teams.

### WHEN THE ICHABODS HAVE THE BALL...

WU senior quarterback Jordan Brill started six games in 2006, passing for 1,348 yards and 11 touchdowns. Senior Ra'Shawn Mosley returns in 2007 after leading the Ichabods with 690 yards rushing on 100 carries in eight games last fall. Jake Lebahn, the only senior wide receiver, started three games last season and finished with 15 receptions for 245 yards and two touchdowns. Washburn, which lost 34-24 at home to Chadron State last week, averaged 25.0 points per game, 162.5 yards rushing per game and 166.1 yards passing per game in 2006.

### ...AND WHEN THEY DON'T

Juniors Mitch Birt and Eric Lawrence return on the defensive line for the Ichabods. Lawrence has started every game of his Washburn career and Birt played in 10 games as a sophomore. Zach Watkins, the 2006 MIAA Freshman of the Year, led the MIAA with 100 tackles from his inside linebacker spot last season. The Ichabods return one starter at cornerback in senior Cary Williams, who had four interceptions and nine passes defended in 2006. The Ichabods, who allowed 333 yards rushing to Chadron State in last week's season opener, allowed 16.4 points per game, 107.7 yards rushing per game and 199.7 yards passing per game a season ago.

## WASHBURN UNIVERSITY IN THE POLLS

In addition to being ranked third in the MIAA Pre-Season Poll, the Ichabods appeared in several 2007 national pre-season polls (24th in the *d2football.com* poll, and 25th in the AFCA NCAA Division II coaches poll) prior to their Aug. 25th home loss to Chadron State.

## COLORADO CONNECTION

Washburn University has five student-athletes on its roster who hail from Colorado, including Lloyd Bias (WR / Aurora / Grandview H.S.), Justin Cooper (RB / Denver / Overland H.S.), Jahmil Taylor (LB / Aurora / Grandview H.S.), Jeff Rickard (OL / Westminster / Standley Lake H.S.) and Bill Boyer (OL / Lakewood / Green Mountain H.S.).

## LAST TIME vs. WASHBURN UNIVERSITY (09/02/06)

The Colorado School of Mines football team dropped its 2006 season opener, 41-21, at Washburn University in non-conference action at Yager Stadium at Moore Bowl in Topeka, Kansas. Washburn jumped out to a 24-0 lead halfway through the second quarter, but CSM managed to cut the deficit to 10 points at the half thanks to **Derek Dykstra's** 16-yard touchdown reception and Garrett Mehl's eight-yard TD scramble. Washburn tallied the first 10 points of the second half to take a 34-14 advantage, but a 33-yard scoring run by Mehl trimmed the lead to 13. With under three minutes to go in the contest, Jordan Brill's fifth touchdown pass of the afternoon provided the final margin of victory as the Ichabods clinched a victory in what was also their season-opening game. Mehl completed 29 passes for 246 yards and also led the Orediggers with 61 yards rushing. Dykstra finished with 13 receptions for 131 yards in the losing effort. Brill finished with 309 yards passing for Washburn while Trent Hearn recorded 99 yards rushing on 22 carries.

## STITT IN OPENERS

CSM Head Coach **Bob Stitt** is now 4-3 in season openers after last season's 41-21 loss at Washburn University to open the 2006 season. CSM lost its first game under Stitt, 43-34, to MidAmerica Nazarene, but rebounded to win four straight openers from 2001-04. Despite dropping their last two season-opening contests, the Orediggers are 15-5 in openers over the last 20 years. In overall season openers, CSM is 57-56-5.

## 2007 PRE-SEASON RMAC POLL

CSM was picked seventh in the 2007 RMAC Pre-Season Coaches Poll with 47 points. Chadron State, which received eight points and brought home eight of the nine first-place votes, was tabbed first. The Eagles were followed by Nebraska - Kearney with 18 points, while Fort Lewis (30 points) and Adams State (34 points) were tabbed third and fourth, respectively. Western N.M. Univ. (40 points) and Mesa State (41 points) were selected fifth and sixth, and N.M. Highlands Univ. (53 points) and Western State (56) rounded out the poll at eighth and ninth.

## PRE-SEASON ALL-RMAC SELECTIONS

Four players from Colorado School of Mines have been named to the 2007 RMAC Football Pre-Season All-Conference Team, including offensive lineman **Stephen Immel**, defensive end **Marin Richardson**, linebacker **Hunter Wardlaw** and kicker **Aaron Abel**.

## HIGH FIVE

CSM recorded five consecutive winning seasons from 2001-05, establishing a program record. Prior to 2001, the Orediggers had not enjoyed a winning season since 1991 (6-4).

## HEATON THINGS UP

**Marty Heaton** returns for his second season as the Associate Head Coach and Defensive Coordinator for the Orediggers. In 2006, Heaton's defense finished second in the RMAC in with 31 sacks, including four from **Hunter Wardlaw** and a team-most six from **Marin Richardson**. Wardlaw garnered Honorable Mention All-RMAC and NFF Honorable Mention All-Colorado accolades a season ago while posting team-highs in tackles (94) and tackles for a loss (7.5). Richardson, who earned NFF Second Team

All-Colorado honors last year, registered 62 tackles and 6.5 tackles for a loss in 2006. Before his arrival at CSM, Heaton spent the six seasons at Adams State College as the Grizzlies assistant head coach and defensive coordinator. At Adams State, Heaton's defense led the RMAC in total defense, pass defense and sacks in 2003. In 2004, the Grizzlies were ranked at the top of nearly every defensive category in the RMAC and were named the NCAA Division II Defense of the Year by the College Sports Report. In addition, the ASC defense finished the 2004 season ranked eighth in the nation in scoring defense, 11th in pass efficiency defense, 12th in total defense and 15th in rushing defense. In 2005, Heaton's defense led the RMAC in pass defense, total defense, pass efficiency defense, sacks and opponent first downs. It also ranked 27th in NCAA Division II in total defense and 35th in rushing defense. Heaton guided several All-RMAC and All-Region players at Adams State, including three-time All-American and two-time RMAC Defensive Player of the Year Adam McGurk. ASC's Charles Allgood, a 2004 All-American and Cactus Bowl participant, as well as 2005 RMAC Defensive Lineman of the Year Ernesto Villasenor, also flourished under Heaton.

### CATCHING ON

CSM has had at least one wide receiver top the 100-yard mark in 29 of the last 40 games. In fact, **Derek Dykstra** had two of the Orediggers' three 100-yard receiving efforts in 2006, accomplishing those in the first two games last fall. Bryan Florendo had CSM's other 100-yard receiving game in 2006, snaring 11 passes for 118 yards at home against N.M. Highlands University on October 7th.

### IN A RUSH?

Oredigger fans will be acquainting themselves with some new names in CSM's offensive backfield in 2007. Junior **Corey Huck**, who is listed as the starting tailback on the CSM depth chart, carried the ball just nine times (30 yards) during his sophomore campaign in 2006. Redshirt freshman quarterback **Keenan Bruchez** is CSM's only other returner who gained notable rushing yardage last season (16 carries, 87 yards).

### JUST KICKIN' IT

Senior **Aaron Abel** returns for his fourth and final season as the Orediggers' kicker in 2007. A First Team All-RMAC and Second Team NFF All-Colorado selection as a junior, Abel led CSM in scoring with 63 points in 2006. A two-time Academic All-RMAC qualifier, Abel also connected on a career-long 50-yard FG at Western N.M. University on Oct. 14th, 2006. Abel, who garnered Second Team All-RMAC laurels following his freshman and sophomore seasons, also punted nine times (long of 51 yards) for a 39.1 average in 2006. In 2005, Abel connected on a game-winning 27-yard FG with three seconds left in a 27-26 win at Chadron State. For his career, Abel has connected on 135-of-143 extra point tries (94.4 %) and 31-of-45 FG attempts (68.9 %). Abel, who holds CSM records for single-season extra points made (64) and career extra points made (135), begins the 2007 season with 228 career points scored (79 as a freshman, 86 as a sophomore and 63 as a junior), just 12 shy of the all-time mark held by former Oredigger running back Greg Marshall (1989-92).

### ANYONE FOR PANCAKES?

Led by **Stephen Immel**, **James Reeves**, **James Tyree**, **Brandon Joy**, **Brian Lincoln** and **Zach Meints**, the 2006 offensive line helped pave the way for former Oredigger Bryan Florendo (1,018 yards) to become CSM's first 1,000-yard rusher since 1939. Immel, Reeves and Tyree, all of whom are seniors this year, were also part of the Oredigger offensive line that helped CSM average 459.1 yards of offense per game (12th in all of NCAA Division II) in 2005. CSM was ranked sixth in the nation in passing offense (313.2 ypg) and 25th in scoring (34.0 ppg) in 2005, as well. When the Orediggers captured the RMAC crown in 2004, Immel, Reeves and Tyree helped to anchor a CSM offense that led the nation in passing (366.6 ypg) and finished second in the country in total offense (529.1 ypg). The 2004 CSM offense was also sixth in the nation in scoring (39.6 ppg). Even more, the CSM offensive line allowed only 15 sacks in 548 pass attempts in 2004.

### THAT'S RICH

Senior defensive lineman **Marin Richardson** earned Second Team All-RMAC honors for the second straight season in 2006 after registering 62 tackles, 6.5 tackles for a loss

and a team-high six sacks. Also a two-time National Football Foundation (NFF) Second-Team All-Colorado selection, Richardson was named the RMAC's Freshman Defensive Player of the Year in 2004.

### GOT A LITTLE CAPTAIN IN YOU?

Defensive lineman **Marin Richardson** and wide receiver Derek Dykstra will serve as Colorado School of Mines' team captains in 2007.

### HE'LL DO IT ALL...

Senior **Derek Dykstra**, who returns for his sixth season with the Orediggers, is listed as a starter at wide receiver, punt returner and long / short snapper. Dykstra, who redshirted as a true freshman in 2002 and was subsequently granted a medical redshirt by the NCAA in 2003, enters the 2007 season with 118 career receptions for 1,320 yards and seven touchdowns. The recipient of Second Team All-RMAC recognition last year and an Honorable Mention All-RMAC selection in 2005, Dykstra also has 14 career punt returns for 122 yards (8.7 ypr).

### (WARD)LAW OF THE LAND

Sophomore linebacker Hunter Wardlaw garnered Honorable Mention All-RMAC and Honorable Mention NFF All-Colorado accolades in 2006 while posting team-highs in tackles (94) and tackles for a loss (7.5; resulting in 44 yards lost by opponents). Wardlaw also finished with four sacks, one forced fumble, two fumble recoveries, one interception, three passes defended and one kickoff return (11 yards) during his initial season in an Oredigger uniform.

### HIT THE SACK

The CSM defense set a single-season school record with 31 sacks last year. The previous Oredigger of 28 sacks was established during the 2002 campaign.

### OPONENTS WERE AT A LOSS IN 2006

The CSM defense registered 63 tackles for a loss last season, resulting in a cumulative total of 281 yards lost by opponents.

### POINTS ON THE BOARD

When the Orediggers endured a 57-0 setback at Chadron State on Sept. 23rd, 2006, it snapped a 73-game consecutive scoring streak that dated back to October 23rd, 1999. The last time the Orediggers were shutout prior to that was Oct. 16, 1999, a 47-0 loss to Mesa State. During that 73-game stretch, CSM blanked three opponents of its own, with the most recent coming on Sept. 11, 2004 (58-0 victory at Western State). During Stitt's tenure as coach at CSM, the Orediggers have scored at least 30 points on 43 occasions (out of 78 games). The 69 points scored against Panhandle State on Sept. 30th, 2006, were the most since CSM posted 75 in a win at N.M. Highlands University on October 25th, 2003.

### POINTS OFF THE BOARD

In 2006, the Orediggers limited two teams to fewer than 10 points, shutting out Oklahoma Panhandle State University by the score of 69-0, and defeating Western N.M. Univ. by the count of 10-6. The Orediggers have not held three opponents under 10 points in the same season since 1981.
