ABOUT THE SERIES

Colorado School of Mines and Western New Mexico University have each won 12 games in the 24-game all-time series. The teams first met in 1965 when CSM posted a 48-7 victory over the Mustangs. Colorado School of Mines, which has won its past four games against the Mustangs, recorded a 10-6 victory at WNMU last season on October 14th at Ben Altamirano Field in Silver City, New Mexico. Western New Mexico's last victory over CSM came in 1989 (42-18). Below is a complete list of the CSM - WNMU all-time series.

THE HEAD COACHES

Bob Stitt is in his eighth season as the head coach at CSM and has recorded a 47-37 (.560) overall record (including a 3-3 mark in 2007). Stitt's .560 winning percentage is the highest by a CSM football coach who has coached at least 20 games and the highest for a modern day coach at CSM. In addition, Stitt's 47 wins are the third most in CSM history and trail only Marv Kay (84 wins from 1969-1995) and Fritz Brennecke (78 wins from 1947-1969).

Western New Mexico University is led by first-year head coach Bernie Busken, who has posted a 2-4 overall record (2-2 RMAC) with the Mustangs thus far in 2007. Busken served as an assistant coach at WNMU from 2004-06.

ALL-TIME RECORD

CSM claims a 371-515-30 (.419) all-time record in what is now its 120th season of collegiate football. The Orediggers' first-ever football game, a 6-4 win over Denver University, was played in 1888.

CSM vs. the "W's"

Colorado School of Mines is 66-88-3 all-time against the seven schools it has played that begin with the letter "W". In the 2007 season opener (September 1st), Washburn University defeated the Orediggers by the score of 27-7 at Brooks Field.

Bob Stitt returns for his eighth season as the head football coach at Colorado School of Mines in 2007.

During his first seven years, Stitt has guided the Orediggers to a 44-34 overall record, including a 30-27 mark in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference. Stitt's .564 winning percentage is the highest by a Mines football coach who has coached in at least 20 games and the highest for a modern day coach at CSM.

The Orediggers' 6-5 overall record in 2005 gave the CSM its fifth consecutive winning season, marking the first time that had happened in the history of the program (119 years). A total of 13 players earned All-RMAC honors in 2006, while RB Bryan Florendo, WR/KR Michael Curl and K Aaron Abel garnered All-Region recognition. Florendo, who in 2006 became the first Oredigger to rush for 1,000 yards (1,018) since 1939, as also selected as the Offensive Player of the Year on the NFF's All-Colorado Team.

In 2004, Stitt led the Orediggers to the best season in school history as the team went undefeated (8-0) in conference play and captured its first RMAC title since 1958. In addition, the 2004 squad posted a perfect 11-0 mark in the regular season and advanced to the NCAA Division II playoffs for the first time in program history. In the opening round, Stitt led CSM to a 52-33 home victory over Midwestern State University. Mines was defeated in the second round of the playoffs at top-ranked Pittsburg State - the eventual national runner-up - to end its season and also snap a school-record 14-game winning streak, which was the second longest in Division II at the time. The record-setting 2004 season helped earn Stitt RMAC Coach of the Year, Division II AFCA Region 5 Coach of the Year and d2football.com Southwest Regional Coach of the Year accolades.

Furthermore, Stitt was instrumental in helping senior quarterback Chad Frieauf win the 19th Annual Harlon Hill Trophy in 2004 as the top player in NCAA Division II. Frieauf, who established an NCAA Division II single-season record for passing yards (4,646) in 2004, became the first player from CSM and the RMAC to win the Harlon Hill Trophy. A total of 18 Orediggers earned both All-RMAC and NFF All-Colorado honors in 2004, while six players brought home All-Region laurels. Three players also went on to receive All-America recognition, including Frieauf (First Team), safety Daniel Leger (Honorable Mention) and wide receiver Justin Gallas.

In 2001 and 2002, Stitt led Mines to consecutive 7-4 finishes. The seven wins in 2001, which marked the first winning season for Mines since 1991 (6-4), were the most by the Orediggers since 1958. The 2001 and 2002 seasons also marked the first time since 1975 and 1976 that the CSM football team had produced back-to-back winning years.

During his tenure at CSM, Stitt has coached 79 All-RMAC performers, 17 All-Region selections and four All-Americans.

Before coming to Colorado School of Mines, Stitt most recently served as an offensive coordinator at Harvard University, helping the Crimson set school records in total offense in a game (640 yards), passing yards in a game (405), first downs in a game (34) and points scored in an Ivy League game (63). Stitt's 1999 offense ranked first among Ivy League teams in rushing, third in scoring and fourth in total offense.

A graduate of Doane College (Nebraska), Stitt received various accolades as a running back and a return specialist - including All-State College Offensive Player of the Year in 1985 - when he played for the Tigers in the mid-80's. Stitt also played left field for the Doane baseball squad and competed in the 4x100m relay on the track & field team.

Stitt returned to coach at his alma mater after receiving his master's degree in Physical Education from the University of Northern Colorado in 1989. The offensive coordinator and offensive line coach for four years at Doane, Stitt produced three NAIA Division II All-Americans and 19 All-NIAC offensive players during his tenure. THIS WEEK IS HOMECOMING

This week's contest against Western New Mexico University will mark the 2007 Homecoming game for the Orediggers. Saturday's halftime period will be extended from 20 to 25 minutes to accommodate for CSM's Homecoming festivities. At the beginning of halftime, the Orediggers will retire the jersey (# 48) of 1942 CSM graduate Harry Campbell. Campbell, who earned his degree in Petroleum Engineering, was a member of the Orediggers' undefeated 1939 football team. Campbell recently funded the development of a new football field - the Harry D. Campbell Field - with a major gift. This will be the first jersey number that has been retired in the history of Colorado School of Mines Athletics.

ALL ABOUT WESTERN NEW MEXICO UNIVERSITY

Western New Mexico University, which was founded in 1893 and currently has a total enrollment of 2,500, is located in Silver City, New Mexico. The Mustangs compiled a 5-5 overall record during what marked their first year back in the RMAC in 2006. WNMU went 3-5 in conference play last fall, good for fifth place (tied) in the season-ending RMAC standings. First-year head coach Bernie Busken has posted a 2-4 overall record (2-2 RMAC) thus far in 2007. The all-time series between WNMU and CSM (24 games) is tied at 12 victories apiece.

WHEN THE MUSTANGS HAVE THE BALL...

WNMU running back Dakota Woodard leads the Mustangs with 208 yards rushing on 61 carries (3.4 ypc, one touchdown). Quarterbacks Jeff Polley and Thomas Herringshaw have combined to complete 91-of-175 passes for 1,211 yards and three touchdowns (nine interceptions). Wide receiver Rod Windsor leads the Mustangs with 41 receptions for 584 yards (14.2 ypc) and two scores. John Means has 22 catches for 277 yards (12.6 ypc) and one touchdown. WNMU is ranked second-to-last in the RMAC (ahead of only CSM) in rushing (67.8 ypg) and red zone offense (converting only seven of 15 opportunities). WNMU has converted on only four of 11 field goal attempts (36.4 %).

...AND WHEN THEY DON'T

WNMU linebacker Christian Serena, who was selected as the 2007 Pre-Season RMAC Defensive Player of the Year, leads the RMAC in total tackles (76) and tackles per game (12.7). Serena, who has already been selected as the RMAC's Defensive Player of the Week on two occasions in 2007, is currently tied for third in the RMAC with CSM's **Kaleb Anderson** in sacks (4.5). In 2006, Serena garnered First Team All-RMAC and RMAC Defensive Player of the Year accolades. Linebacker Darryl Horne has 36 total tackles (12 solo) while defensive back Latron Hickson (29 tackles, four passes defended), a Second Team All-RMAC selection in 2006, leads the WNMU defense with two interceptions (one returned for a touchdown). Punter Mike Whitcher, who was selected as the most recent RMAC Special Teams Player of the Week, is averaging 43.1 yards per kick (22 punts).

LAST TIME vs. WESTERN NEW MEXICO UNIVERSITY (10/14/06)

Last season, CSM defeated the Mustangs by the score of 10-6 on October 14th at Ben Altamirano Field in Silver City, New Mexico. Former CSM quarterback Garrett Mehl gave CSM an early lead with his nine-yard touchdown run in the first quarter, but WNMU responded with a 31-yard scoring pass from Rod Windsor to Jason Allison just five minutes later. CSM's Phil Supinski blocked the Mustangs' ensuing extra point attempt, and the Orediggers led by the count of 7-6 at the half. Following a scoreless third quarter of play, CSM's **Aaron Abel** connected on a career-long 50-yard field goal with just over eight

minutes remaining in the game to provide the final margin of victory. CSM's Bryan Florendo had 23 carries for 46 yards while **Rowdy Arciaga** completed 12-of-18 passes for 97 yards. Florendo and **Derek Dykstra** each caught five passes for 53 yards, as well. Dakota Woodard carried 20 times for 73 yards for the Mustangs in a losing effort. The Orediggers' **Hunter Wardlaw** (one sack) and WNMU's Darryl Horne each registered a game-high 10 tackles. WNMU finished with 285 yards of total offense, compared to 209 for Colorado School of Mines.

LOCAL FLAVOR

The Mustangs have just two Colorado natives on their 2007 roster. Colorado School of Mines has 65 players on its 2007 roster who hail from Colorado.

2007 PRE-SEASON RMAC POLL

CSM was picked seventh in the 2007 RMAC Pre-Season Coaches Poll with 47 points. Chadron State, which received eight points and brought home eight of the nine first-place votes, was tabbed first. The Eagles were followed by Nebraska - Kearney with 18 points, while Fort Lewis (30 points) and Adams State (34 points) were tabbed third and fourth, respectively. Western N.M. Univ. (40 points) and Mesa State (41 points) were selected fifth and sixth, and N.M. Highlands Univ. (53 points) and Western State (56) rounded out the poll at eighth and ninth.

PRE-SEASON ALL-RMAC SELECTIONS

Four players from CSM were named to the 2007 RMAC Football Pre-Season All-Conference Team, including offensive lineman **Stephen Immel**, defensive end **Marin Richardson**, linebacker **Hunter Wardlaw** and place-kicker **Aaron Abel**.

IN THE POLLS

Neither Colorado School of Mines nor Western New Mexico University are ranked in any of this week's Division II national polls.

CSM head coach **Bob Stitt** is 4-0 all-time against Western New Mexico University.

UP NEXT FOR CSM...FORT LEWIS COLLEGE

Following this week's game vs. Western New Mexico University, the Orediggers will travel to Durango, Colorado, to play at Fort Lewis College on Saturday, October 20th, at 12:00 p.m. at Ray Dennison Memorial Stadium. Last season, Fort Lewis College defeated the Orediggers by the score of 41-34 on October 21st at Brooks Field. FLC's Matt Gutierrez connected with Brandon Cumming on a 63-yard scoring pass to snap a 34-34 tie with just 39 seconds remaining in regulation. Justin Matherson had 16 carries for 290 yards and four touchdowns for the Skyhawks, who improved to 6-1 in the RMAC. Matherson scored on runs of 77, 82, 84 and two yards for Fort Lewis, which amassed 444 yards of total offense. CSM, which trailed by 14 points (34-20) entering the fourth quarter, found the endzone on back-to-back drives late in the game when Garrett Mehl tossed touchdown passes to **Corey Huck** and Bryan Florendo. However, when FLC began its final drive of the game with under a minute to play, the Skyhawks needed just one play to recapture the lead for good. Florendo finished with 180 yards and two scores while Mehl completed 13-of-24 passes for 155 yards and two touchdowns (no interceptions). The Orediggers, who were just 5-of-15 on third-down conversions, amassed 402 yards of total offense in a losing effort.

HIT THE SACK

With seven sacks in last week's 28-0 shutout victory at N.M. Highlands University, the Colorado School of Mines defense now has 31 sacks (208 cumulative yards lost by opponents) in 2007, which ties the all-time single-season school record in that category. **Through six games, the CSM defense currently leads the nation (NCAA Division II) in sacks per game with 5.17.** CSM established a new single-game school record for sacks with 14 during the Orediggers' 41-13 win at Oklahoma Panhandle State on September 29th. The CSM defense is currently ranked first in the RMAC with 31 sacks (resulting in a cumulative loss of 208 yards by opponents).

HEATON THINGS UP

Marty Heaton returns for his second season as the Associate Head Coach and Defensive Coordinator at CSM. Before his arrival at Mines, Heaton spent the six seasons at Adams State as the Grizzlies' assistant head coach and defensive coordinator. In 2006, Heaton's defense finished second in the RMAC in with 31 sacks, including 4.0 from **Hunter Wardlaw** and 6.0 from **Marin Richardson**. At Adams State, Heaton's defense led the RMAC in total defense, pass defense and sacks

in 2003. In 2005, Heaton's defense led the RMAC in pass defense, total defense, pass efficiency defense, sacks and opponent first downs. It also ranked 27th in NCAA Division II in total defense and 35th in rushing defense. In 2004, the Grizzlies were ranked at the top of the RMAC in several defensive categories and were selected as the NCAA Division II Defense of the Year by the College Sports Report. In addition, the ASC defense finished the 2004 season ranked eighth in the nation in scoring defense, 11th in pass efficiency defense, 12th in total defense and 15th in rushing defense. Heaton coached several All-RMAC and All-Region players at Adams State, including three-time All-American and two-time RMAC Defensive Player of the Year Adam McGurk.

ASC's Charles Allgood, a 2004 All-American and Cactus Bowl participant, as well as 2005 RMAC Defensive Lineman of the Year Ernesto Villaseñor, also flourished under Heaton. Currently, the CSM defense is ranked first in the RMAC in sacks (31) and third in both rushing defense (81.7 yards rushing allowed per game) and total defense (262.8 yards allowed per game). The CSM defense has only allowed six first-quarter points through six games in 2007. The only opening-stanza score that the Oredigger defense has allowed this season was a touchdown against fifth-ranked Chadron State on September 22nd at Brooks Field.

DYNAMIC DYKSTRA

Senior **Derek Dykstra** returns for his sixth season with the Orediggers in 2007. Dykstra, who redshirted as a true freshman in 2002 and was subsequently granted a medical redshirt by the NCAA in 2003, is the owner of 128 career receptions for 1,521 yards (11.9 ypc) and 10 touchdowns. The recipient of Second Team All-RMAC recognition last year and an Honorable Mention All-RMAC selection in 2005, Dykstra also has 19 career punt returns for 145 yards (7.6 ypr). Dykstra caught a pair of scoring passes (three and 25 yards) from **David Pesek** in CSM's 28-0 victory at New Mexico Highlands University on October 6th.

THAT'S RICH

Senior **Marin Richardson's** one-yard scoring run on September 29th at Oklahoma Panhandle State was his third touchdown of the 2007 season. Richardson, who is tied for the team lead in scoring (18 points) through six games, also had a one-yard scoring run on September 22nd against fifth-ranked Chadron State College and a five-yard touchdown run on September 8th at Fort Hays State University. For the season, Richardson has 12 carries for 27 yards (2.2 ypc). Richardson, a defensive lineman by trade, is currently third on the Orediggers with 3.5 sacks. Even more, Richardson is tied with teammate **James Tucker** for sixth on the team with 24 total tackles. Richardson, who has also been credited with one QB hurry in 2007, earned Second Team All-RMAC honors for the second straight season in 2006 after registering 62 tackles, 6.5 tackles for a loss and a team-high six sacks. Also a two-time National Football Foundation (NFF) Second-Team All-Colorado selection, Richardson was named the RMAC's Freshman Defensive Player of the Year in 2004.

ANYONE FOR PANCAKES?

Led by **Stephen Immel, James Reeves, James Tyree, Brandon Joy, Brian Lincoln** and **Zach Meints**, the 2006 offensive line helped pave the way for former Oredigger Bryan Florendo to become CSM's first 1,000-yard rusher (1,018 yards) since 1939. Immel, Reeves and Tyree, all of whom are seniors this year, were also part of the Oredigger offensive line that helped CSM average 459.1 yards of offense per game (12th in all of NCAA Division II) in 2005. CSM was ranked sixth in the nation in passing offense (313.2 ypg) and 25th in scoring (34.0 ppg) in 2005, as well. When the Orediggers captured the RMAC crown in 2004, Immel, Reeves and Tyree helped to anchor a CSM offense that led the nation in passing (366.6 ypg) and finished second in the country in total offense (529.1 ypg). The 2004 CSM offense was also sixth in the nation in scoring (39.6 ppg). Even more, the CSM offensive line allowed only 15 sacks in 548 pass attempts in 2004.

43 carries (3.5 ypc). Currently, the Orediggers are averaging just 45.0 yard rushing per contest, ranking them last in the RMAC. For the season (168 carries), CSM is averaging only 1.6 yards per carry.

PASSING GRADE

CSM sophomore quarterback **David Pesek** has a 122.94 QB rating, is averaging 217.3 yards passing per game and has completed 63.6 % (133-of-209) of his passes. Through CSM's first six games in 2007, Pesek has thrown for 1,304 yards and eight touchdowns.

JUST KICKIN' IT

Senior place-kicker **Aaron Abel** now has 237 career points scored (79 as a freshman, 86 as a sophomore, 63 as a junior and nine as a senior), which is just three shy of the all-time career scoring record held by former Oredigger running back Greg Marshall (240 points; 1989-92). A First Team All-RMAC and Second Team NFF All-Colorado selection as a junior, Abel led CSM in scoring with 63 points in 2006. A two-time Academic All-RMAC qualifier, Abel also connected on a career-long 50-yard field goal at WNMU on October 14th, 2006. Abel, who garnered Second Team All-RMAC laurels following his freshman and sophomore seasons, also punted nine times (long of 51 yards) for a 39.1 average in 2006. In 2005, Abel connected on a game-winning 27-yard FG with three seconds left in a 27-26 win at Chadron State. For his career, Abel has connected on 138-of-146 extra point tries (94.5 %) and 33-of-52 field goal attempts (63.5 %). Furthermore, Abel holds CSM records for single-season extra points made (64) and career extra points made (138).

GOT A LITTLE CAPTAIN IN YOU?

Defensive lineman **Marin Richardson** and wide receiver **Derek Dykstra** will serve as Colorado School of Mines' team captains in 2007.

MARC OF EXCELLENCE

Redshirt freshman defensive end **Marc Schiechl** established a new individual single-game school record with 4.0 sacks in the Orediggers' 28-0 shutout victory at New Mexico Highlands University on October 6th. Schiechl, who was subsequently selected as the RMAC's Defensive Player of the Week, currently leads the RMAC in sacks (7.5).

GIVE THAT MAN A HAN

Sophomore LB **Nick Haniszewski** leads CSM and is ranked third in the RMAC in total tackles with 55. Through six games, Haniszewski is ranked fourth in the conference in tackles per game (9.2). Haniszewski was selected as the RMAC's Special Teams Player of the Week for games played on September 15th when he blocked Adams State's potential game-tying 28-yard field goal attempt with just 16 seconds remaining in regulation to preserve the Orediggers' 10-7 victory over the Grizzlies. For Haniszewski, it was his second blocked kick of the season. Haniszewski, who has 5.5 tackles for a loss in 2007, is currently ranked second on team in both solo tackles (25) and assisted tackles (30).

FORCING THE ISSUE

Sophomore rover **Ben Tiller** is currently tied for the league lead in forced fumbles with two. Tiller, who leads the Orediggers in solo tackles (28), is third on the team in total tackles with 39. Through CSM's first six games, Tiller has also broken up two passes, recovered one fumble and blocked one field goal attempt. Presently, Tiller is ranked 16th in the RMAC in tackles per game (6.5).

ON THE HUNT

Through six games, sophomore LB **Hunter Wardlaw** is second on the Orediggers with 43 total tackles (nine solo) and has amassed 4.0 tackles for a loss, 2.0 sacks, one interception (12 yards), two passes defensed, two fumble recoveries, one forced fumble and one quarterback hurry. Even more, Wardlaw is currently tied for 12th in the RMAC in tackles per game (7.2). Wardlaw garnered Honorable Mention All-RMAC and Honorable Mention NFF All-Colorado accolades in 2006 while posting team-highs in tackles (94) and tackles for a loss (7.5). Wardlaw also finished with four sacks, one forced fumble, two fumble recoveries, one interception, three passes defensed and one kickoff return (11 yards) during his initial season in an Oredigger uniform.

OPPONENTS ARE AT A LOSS

Through six games in 2007, the Oredigger defense has recorded 49 tackles for a loss (254 yards). **Marc Schiechl** is ranked third in the RMAC and first on the team in tackles for a loss with 7.5. **Nick Haniszewski** and sophomore rover **Joey Corder** each have 5.5 TFL while redshirt freshman defensive end **Kaleb Anderson** has 5.0 stops behind the line of scrimmage. The CSM defense registered 63 tackles for a loss in 2006, resulting in a cumulative total of 281 yards surrendered by opponents.
