2008 Homecoming Parade Information

Saturday, October 4th

When: Saturday, October 4th, 2008 @ 10:00 am

Entries must be at staging area (behind the Green Center) no later than 9:30 am. Tear-down of floats on flatbeds will occur in the old Ford dealership parking lot after the parade. A dumpster will be available for trash.

Where: Downtown Golden

Entries: Any organization that would like to participate and display their school spirit with a Float, Decorated Vehicle, Marchers, or any other creative idea!*

Rules: Entries must be no taller than 14 feet from the ground and no wider than 9.5 feet. There must be at least two exits on the float.

NO ALCOHOL

NO FIRE OR FIREWORKS

NO SMOKING

Judging: Use of Homecoming theme: 40 points

Originality: 30 points

Appearance: 30 points

Total: 100 points

Floats with the highest scores will go on to Brooks Field to be showcased during the football game.

*Note: Anyone with a Queen and/or Beast nominee may add an additional vehicle to spotlight nominees!

Homecoming Events: Rules and Regulations

All organizations are expected to behave in a sportsmanlike manner throughout the competition. Decisions made by the Homecoming Chair are final and not subject to debate. The Homecoming Chair reserves the right to disqualify any organization from any and/or all competitions.

Scoring and Details (Competitive Organizations)

1. Competing in events adds points to the overall point total for the homecoming trophy. Points will be awarded as follows:
 - 1st Place: 100 points
 - 2nd Place: 70 points
 - 3rd Place: 50 points
 - 4th Place: 35 points
 - 5th Place: 25 points
 - 6th Place: 20 points
 - No Shows: -100 points
2. The registration deadline for all events is **September 19th, 2008** and this packet must be turned into the **Student Activities Office**. Any organization not meeting this deadline will not be allowed to compete.
3. Field Events will begin at 4:00 pm. All competitors are expected to be present and ready to begin competition.
4. Field Events will be held on the North IM Field, weather permitting. If weather does not cooperate, the events will be moved to the Steinhauer Field House.
5. An organization entered in one event is entered in all events.
6. Any protests must be in written form by the organizations contact person to the Homecoming Chair immediately. The protest is subject to the discretion of the Homecoming Chair, whereby that decision is final.

Scoring and Details (Individuals and Individual Teams)

These rules apply to students not competing for the overall Homecoming Trophy.

1. The winning contestant in the individual competition for each event will win a prize. This category is not open to individuals affiliated with organizations competing for the Homecoming trophy.
2. The registration deadline for events is **September 19th, 2008**. The registration form must be turned into the **Student Activities Office**. Any individual(s) not meeting this deadline will not be allowed to compete.
3. Field Events will begin at 4:00 pm. All competitors are expected to be present and ready to begin competition.
4. Field Events will be held on the North IM Field, weather permitting. If weather does not cooperate, the events will be moved to the Steinhauer Field House.
5. Any protests must be in written form from the participant to the Homecoming Chair immediately. The protest is subject to the discretion of the Homecoming Chair, whereby that decision is final.

Competitive Events:

- **Big Wheel Relay**
Race down the north side of Greek Row on a Big Wheel! They are still as cool, if not cooler, as when we were kids.
- **Mines Pyramid**
Build a human pyramid and show your school pride by singing the school's fight song as fast as possible!
- **Six Legged Race**
This event requires five people. Their legs will be tied together in a line and all of the teams will have to race to get to the other side.
- **Tug of War**
Teams of 6 or more people will get to see who is the strongest of all.
- **Wiffle Ball**
Battle it out tournament style with the ultimate Miner League Sport!

Scoring for Competitive Events:

- 1st place: 15 points
- 2nd place: 10 points
- 3rd place: 7 points
- 4th place: 4 points
- 5th place: 3 points
- 6th place: 2 points
- 1 point for participation

After the Field Event scores are totaled, points will be handed out to each organization according to the Scoring and Details listed on the previous page.

Non-competitive Events:

- **Volleyball**
Come have fun and break a sweat with your friends while playing some easy volleyball.
- **Kickball**
Compete with a team of friends for an exciting old school game.

Queen and Beast Rules and Requirements

1. Queen and Beast will be nominated individually. Each organization may nominate a Queen, Beast, or both.
2. Applications are due by **September 19th, 2008 at 5 p.m. to the Student Activities Office.**
3. Selection will be based on:
 - a. 85% student voting
 - b. 15% faculty panel review of applications
4. Candidates must attend the Silver and Blue Luncheon on October 3rd, 2008. Details will be e-mailed to the candidates.
5. Candidates must attend the halftime show at the football game on October 4th, 2008.
6. Prizes will be awarded to both the winners and the runners up.
7. Voting online through Trailhead will begin the week of Homecoming. Details will be e-mailed to all organizations and students.
8. The organizations to which the Queen or Beast belongs will be awarded 50 points for each Homecoming royalty member.

As in the past, we are offering organizations the opportunity to earn points towards the overall Homecoming competition by volunteering to help run and clean up events. All volunteers need to check in with a member of the Homecoming Committee at each event as no shows will be penalized by a 10 point deduction per person that does not show.
