MEETING & Event Requirements

COVID- 19 POLICY UPDATE:

The Colorado School of Mines has updated their policies regarding masks on campus. As of November 1st, 2021, masks are **required** in all indoor spaces regardless of vaccination status. For clubs and organizations, this means that you will need to require masks for all of your events taking place indoors. Food is still permitted and is currently not required to be individually packaged, and individuals may remove their masks while actively eating and drinking in indoor spaces that allow food and drink.

MEETING & EVENT REQUIREMENTS:

As a reminder, all student organization meetings and events must be submitted via Engage for approval. In addition to submitting your events to Engage for approval, you also much reserve any spaces that you want to utilize on campus. Campus Events requires that you all request your spaces at least 3 days in advance to ensure they can properly staff buildings for your events, get your spaces set up in a timely manner, etc. Campus Events will not be fully staffing November 20th - 28th due to campus being closed part of that time, so please book far in advance if you are needing space any of those dates!

REGISTRATION REMINDER:

To be able to be a fully registered student organization and plan meetings and events, all student organizations must go through the annual renewal process to become registered. If your organization is not listed <u>here</u>, please contact the Clubs and Organizations Coordinator, Haley Hannaman, at hhannaman@mines.edu. This is a requirement for ALL student organizations, regardless of what governing body you fall under.

As a reminder, all advisor agreements must be turned in no later than December 31st, 2021. If you do not have an advisor agreement on file by that point, your organization will be switched to inactive until you are able to find an advisor to serve for your organization. To lock your excel sheet make sure you are on the home tab, then click the format tool within the cells section, and move your way down to protect sheet, then fill in the password given to you. You may only use the password given by SAIL.

Later SAIL will be requiring clubs to bring their inventory to a staging area to begin the tagging process for club items.
