Mr. Steinhauer presented the following financial statements which were discussed and accepted by the Board: Summary of Budget Appropriations and Disbursements for the period ending March 31, 1948, the Balance Sheet as of March 31, 1948, and the Dining Hall Statement of Profit and Loss for the month of March.

President Parker asked for the views of the members of the Board regarding the possible closing of the Dining Hall for the period between the close of the regular school year and the opening of the nine-weeks Summer Session. This question was discussed at length and the consensus of the Board was that the Dining Hall should not be closed during this period providing there is any appreciable demand from students for meal services, even though operation during this time might be with a substantial loss as a result of the small volume of business.

President Parker reported that on April 2, Dr. Vanderwilt, Mr. Steinhauer, and he had a conference with Mr. James A. Noonan, State Controller, and Mr. H. R. Fuchs, Executive Secretary to the Governor, concerning the request made on March 23 for transfer of certain funds to the Mill Levy Building Fund and authorization to use the \$75,000 special appropriation made by the Thirty-sixth General Assembly. Dr. Vanderwilt gave his impressions regarding this conference and, after discussion, it was decided that available Board members, President Parker, and Mr. Steinhauer should request an appointment in order to discuss this matter with the Governor in case a decision in the matter was not received from the Governor in the very near future.

President Parker recommended to the Board the granting of the respective degrees at graduation on the dates shown, as recommended by Dean M. I. Signer in a report dated March 31, 1948, addressed to the members of the Faculty. Upon motion by Mr. Bowen, seconded by Mr. Thomas and unanimously carried, the granting of the degrees in accordance with President Parker's recommendation was approved.

President Parker advised the Board that Mr. William F. Tobin had been employed, effective April 12, 1948, for the purpose of making an inventory of the School's property. He explained the proposed plans for taking and recording of this inventory. Mr. Thomas commented upon the many difficulties attached to this inventory and suggested that it might be advisable to utilize the services of a professional appraisal firm in order to facilitate the inventory procedure.

President Parker stated that he had been informed by Mr. Jose DeMorales that it would not be possible for him to be present at the 1948 Commencement to

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receive the Medal of Merit which had been conferred upon him. Upon motion of Mr. Bowen, seconded by Dr. Vandervilt and unanimously carried, it was the decision of the Board to award the Medals of Merit formerly authorized to Mr. De Moraes and Mr. Derringer in absentia if either or both of these recipients could not attend the 1948 Commencement.

President Parker presented a request that Professor Harry M. Crain be authorized to attend as official representative of the Colorado School of Mines the Conference on International Student Exchanges, to be held at the University of Michigan at Ann Arbor, May 10, 11 and 12, 1948. After consideration of the importance of this meeting, it was moved by Mr. Thomas, seconded by Mr. Bowen and unanimously carried, that Professor Crain be authorized to attend this conference as the representative of the School, with expenses paid by the institution.

The meeting then adjourned.

Mr. Steinhauer presented the following financial statements which were discussed and accepted by the Board: Summary of Budget Appropriations and Disbursements for the period ending April 30, 1948, the Balance Sheet as of April 30, 1948, and the Dining Hall Statement of Profit and Loss for the month of April.

The questionnaire regarding dining hall operations, which was circulated among the members of the student body, was discussed. It was decided that in view of the very limited demand for service during the first six weeks summer session that the dining hall would not be operated during that period.

The request formerly made to the State Controller for the transfer of certain funds to the Mill Levy Building Fund was discussed at length and upon motion by Dr. Vanderwilt, seconded by Mr. Bowen and unanimously carried, the following resolution was unanimously adopted:

RESOLVED, That the State Controller be requested to transfer and that the Governor be requested to approve the transfer from the Mineral Leasing Act funds of the Colorado School of Mines the amount of \$124,807.23 (which is the excess received from the Mineral Leasing Act during the current fiscal period over the amount budgeted as anticipated receipts from the Mineral Leasing Act for the current fiscal period) to the Mill Levy Building Fund Account of the Colorado School of Mines, there to be earmarked for the provision of physical facilities for the Petroleum Engineering Departments.

The Board then recessed for lunch at the School Dining Hall.

When the meeting reconvened, Dr. Jose Barbosa daSilva was invited to the Board meeting. He discussed with the members some phases of mining and mineral industry education in Brazil. Dr. Barbosa then left the meeting.

This letter was discussed and it was decided that the only suggestion contained in Mr. Waltman's letter that could be adopted was that of having tuition for field courses included as a part of scholarship allowances.

President Parker explained to the Board members the necessity for authorization to sign checks drawn on the fund deposited in The Colorado National Bank, Denver, designated as the "Colorado School of Mines, Protective Construction Fund". Upon motion by Mr. Thomas, seconded by Mr. Bowen, the following resolution was unanimously adopted:

Mr. Steinbauer presented the following financial statements which were discussed and accepted by the Board: Summary of Budget Appropriations and Disbursements for the period ending May 31, 1948, the Balance Sheet as of May 31, 1948, and the Dining Hall Statement of Profit and Loss for the month of May, 1948.

President Parker presented a letter, dated June 3, 1948, from the Attorney General with regard to the prerogative of the Board of Trustees in the determination of the need of funds appropriated to the School under Section 1, Chapter 21, Session Laws of 1947. After a lengthy discussion of this opinion and the action of State officials in withholding funds appropriated under this law, it was decided to secure legal advice from outside the office of the Attorney General regarding further action in this matter. After a consideration of attorneys from whom the Board might request such advice, it was unanimously decided to call upon Mr. Fred Farrar for the desired advice and counsel.

The members of the Board then recessed for lunch. Mr. Steinbauer did not attend the meeting when it reconvened.

President Parker presented a proposed contract, dated May 19, 1948, between the South Denver Coal & Feed Co. and the Colorado School of Mines for coal to be delivered to the School for the period July 1, 1948 - June 30, 1949, and a report showing the bids received for coal to be furnished during this period. These bids were as follows:

President Parker presented a letter, dated May 16, 1948, from Mr. Patrick Mercier, President of the "M" Club, requesting formal recognition of the John Mason Award by the School. President Parker recommended that this award be officially recognized. Upon motion by Mr. Bowen, seconded by Mr. Thomas and unanimously passed, the Board of Trustees gave its recognition of the John Mason Award under the terms outlined in Mr. Mercier's letter.

President Parker presented a request from a student committee consisting of Messrs. R. John Morgan, W. D. Butner, John Hyland, Edward M. Warren and Maxwell Silverman requesting authorization for the establishment of a carrier current radio station as an official student activity. After some discussion of this request, it was decided that the need for the proposed radio station and programs on the school campus was small and that the proposed plans would call for an undue amount of time on the part of a small group of students. In view of these facts, upon motion by Mr. Bowen, seconded by Mr. Thomas and unanimously carried, the request was denied.

Eng., 1936, and a parchment diploma for Mr. Balwant Singh Negi, who received the degree of Master of Geophysical Engineering, May 28, 1948. These certificates and the diploma were signed by Mr. Thomas S. Harrison, President of the Board of Trustees, and Mr. Lester C. Thomas, Assistant Secretary of the Board of Trustees, and by President Parker.

After a study of this letter and Public Law 796, 80th Congress, the following resolution was moved by Dr. Vanderwilt, seconded by Mr. Bowen and unanimously adopted:

BE IT RESOLVED, That the Board of Trustees of the Colorado School of Mines requests, pursuant to Section 505 (a) of the Lanham Act (Public Law 849, 76th Congress) as added by Public Law 796, 80th Congress, that the Housing and Home Finance Agency, Public Housing Administration, relinquish and transfer to the Colorado School of Mines without monetary consideration all contractual rights of the Federal Government (including the right to revenues and other proceeds) and all property right, title and interest of the United States in and with respect to the temporary housing located in the City of Golden, Jefferson County, Colorado, on land which is owned by the Colorado School of Mines and controlled by the Board of Trustees;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That Ben H. Parker, President, or Gurnett Steinbauer, Business Manager, is hereby authorized to request on behalf of the Colorado School of Mines said relinquishment and transfer of the Federal Government's interest in said housing.

President Parker stated that he would like to take a vacation of approximately one-half month during the latter half of July. It was the consensus of the Board that this vacation be granted.

President Parker presented a letter from Mr. Warren Dronen containing statements regarding residence. After a study of the statements as presented, it was the consensus of the Board that Mr. Dronen does not meet the established requirements for a Colorado resident.
