Thereupon Mr. Harrison moved, Mr. Stockmar seconded the motion and by unanimous action the following officers were elected for the ensuing biennium:

President Parker then presented the following financial statements which were discussed and accepted: Summary of Budget Appropriations and Disbursements, No. 12, for the period ending June 30, 1949, the Balance Sheet as of June 30, 1949, and the Dining Hall Statement of Profit and Loss for the month of June, 1949.

President Parker stated that in accordance with the usual custom the newly elected President of the Board should be authorized with the President of the School to have access to the Colorado School of Mines safety deposit box at The Colorado National Bank. Whereupon motion by Mr. Bowen, seconded by Mr. Stockmar and unanimously carried, the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That Lester C. Thomas, President of the Board of Trustees of the Colorado School of Mines, and Ben H. Parker, President of the Colorado School of Mines, be and they are hereby authorized to open the safety deposit box at The Colorado National Bank held in the name of "The President and Board of Trustees of the Colorado School of Mines."

President Parker suggested that he be authorized to execute change orders pertaining to construction contracts for the remodeling of the Old Power Plant Building. Mr. Harrison moved, Mr. Bowen seconded the motion, and by unanimous vote the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That the Board of Trustees of the Colorado School of Mines, Golden, Colorado, does hereby authorize Ben H. Parker, President, Colorado School of Mines, or John J. Kelley, Director of Development and Planning, Colorado School of Mines, to sign Change Orders pertaining to construction contracts for remodeling of the Old Heating Plant Building for the Colorado School of Mines.

President Parker presented a list of funds not on deposit with the State Treasurer together with explanations showing the reason that each fund is not on deposit with the State Treasurer. It was the consensus of the Board that this statement should be submitted to the State Controller, in accordance with his request dated May 25, 1949.

President Parker was requested to ask the holders of Distinguished Achievement Medals to suggest alumni for consideration for like awards.

The question of Faculty attendance at the Seventy-fifth Anniversary banquet was discussed and President Parker was authorized to take appropriate action to insure reasonable Faculty participation.

Mr. Harrison stated that he felt that all major buildings on the campus should be appropriately marked when constructed, with bronze plaques showing the name of the building, the date of construction, the membership of the Board of Trustees at the time of construction, the name of the President of the School and the name of the architect. He stated also that in view of the long period of service rendered to the school by Mr. Fred C. Steinhauser, former member and President of the Board of Trustees, and his particular interest in the Field House that the Field House should be named "Steinhauser Field House" in his honor. He further expressed his feeling that the new Chemistry Building when constructed should be named "Coolbaugh Hall" in recognition of the many years of service devoted by Dr. E. F. Coolbaugh, President Emeritus. It was then moved by Mr. Harrison, seconded by Mr. Bowen and unanimously carried:

1. That the Field House be named "Steinhauser Field House";
2. That the new Chemistry Building be named "Coolbaugh Hall";
3. That President Parker take the necessary steps to obtain suitable plaques for the Steinhauser Field House and the Central Heating Plant and that the name of Mr. Arthur L. Hae, Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds, be included with the names of other officers appearing on the plaque to be mounted on the Central Heating Plant.

Mr. Harrison suggested that a suitable commemorative medal or other souvenir be obtained for distribution at the time of the Seventy-fifth Anniversary observance. President Parker stated that the Seventy-fifth Anniversary Committee had made investigations of commemorative tokens and was planning to have a medal struck for use on this occasion.

Mr. Thomas asked for discussion concerning the employment of additional public relations personnel. After considerable discussion of this matter it was the consensus of the Trustees that present administrative officers should attempt to intensify their public relations work rather than to place such duties in the hands of others employed especially for this purpose. In this connection it was suggested that invitations to visit the

campus should be extended to all legislators and to the non-legislative members of the commission appointed to study state institutions.

The meeting then adjourned.

President Parker presented the following financial statements which were discussed and accepted: Summary of Budget Appropriations and Disbursements, No. 1, for the period ending July 31, 1940, the Balance Sheet as of July 31, 1940, and the Dining Hall Statement of Profit and Loss for the month of July, 1940.

President Parker stated that following submittal of quarterly allotment requests pursuant to the approved 1940-41 budget to the State Controller, the School had been notified that ten per cent of those special appropriations for the current year was to be placed in reserve and that Mr. Steinhauer had been requested to submit a new allotment request for the current quarter requesting allocation of only ninety per cent of the special appropriation for the current year. President Parker stated that upon receipt of this request he had requested Mr. Steinhauer to withhold action pending consideration by the Board of Trustees. It was the consensus of the Trustees that any modification of the budget and allotted request be withheld.

President Parker presented a bond to the United States of America in the amount of \$12,000 for Safeguarding of Public Animals, Arms, Ammunition, Supplies, Uniforms, Equipment, and Means of Transportation issued to Educational Institutions under Section 47, National Defense Act of June 3, 1916, as amended by Act of June 4, 1939. After consideration of this bond, the following resolution was moved by Mr. Harrison, seconded by Mr. Stockman and unanimously carried:

RESOLVED, That Lester G. Thomas, President of the Board of Trustees of the Colorado School of Mines, be and is hereby authorized to execute on behalf of the Colorado School of Mines a bond to the United States of America in the amount of \$12,000 for safeguarding of public animals, arms, ammunition, supplies, uniforms, equipment and means of transportation issued to educational institutions under Section 47, National Defense Act of June 3, 1916, as amended by Act of June 4, 1939; and that Carl F. Stockman, Assistant Secretary of the Board of Trustees of the Colorado School of Mines be and is hereby authorized to attend said execution.

President Parker presented letters from Dr. Francis A. Thomson and Mr. Lute J. Parkinson stating that neither of these alumni could be present to receive the Distinguished Achievement Medals authorized at the last meeting of the Board of Trustees for presentation at the Seventy-fifth Anniversary Convocation. Upon motion by Mr. Harrison, seconded by Mr. Stockman and unanimously carried, the awarding of the Distinguished Achievement Medals to Dr. Thomson and Mr. Parkinson at the Seventy-sixth annual Commencement to be held on May 26, 1940, was authorized provided these alumni can be present at that Commencement, and President Parker was requested to notify them of this action of the Board of Trustees.

The text of a proposed plaque to be installed in the Mining Building as a memorial to John Haviland O'Connor, of the Class of 1926, as prepared by the Colorado Mines Chapter of Blue Key Fraternity, was presented at the request of this Fraternity that it be granted permission to have a plaque bearing this text mounted in the Mining Building. After consideration of this proposal, it was the consensus of the Trustees that the Blue Key Fraternity should have permission to provide and install such a plaque, subject to the approval of Professor C. W. Livingston, Head of the Mining Department, but that the text should be modified to read as follows:

DEDICATED TO THE MEMORY OF

JOHN HAVILAND O'CONNOR, B.S., 1926

Colorado School of Mines

Who gave his life on May 29, 1949, at
Catavi, Bolivia, defending his fellow
engineers during a miners' strike.
His career reflected the highest ideals
of his Alma Mater and his profession.

Colorado Mines Chapter
Blue Key Fraternity

President Parker presented a letter from Mr. J. A. Nyberg, Trust Officer of the Denver National Bank, regarding a bequest in the amount of \$600 to be paid to the Colorado School of Mines in accordance with the will of Charles H. Bell, deceased. President Parker stated that if the principal sum of this bequest should be invested in securities of the highest grade and if awards under this prize plan be granted, commencing at the next Commencement, a portion of the capital of the fund would be required annually to meet the cost of the prize and as a consequence the fund would be depleted within a few years. He recommended that the first award of a prize under this fund be deferred until such time as a committee of the Faculty could make recommendations regarding a plan for the determination of the recipient of the prize and until four academic years had elapsed following the announcement of the plan of the award, in order that all students competing for the award may have full knowledge of the plan of the award. He further suggested that if this procedure were followed and if the principal of this fund should be invested in a high grade common stock, the amount of the principal together with proceeds from dividends accumulated by the time the first award was made probably would be of sufficient amount so that future earnings on the investment would be adequate to purchase the annual prize. It was the consensus of the Trustees that such a plan should be adopted provided it meets with the approval of Mrs. Charles H. Bell and her sons. President Parker was requested to secure the approval of this program.

President Parker stated that numerous requests for the release of seismograph information prepared as a result of the regular instructional program had been received. Owing to the fact that such information is based upon student work and is not necessarily of professional quality, it was the consensus of the Trustees that these data should not be released.

The meeting then adjourned.
