Mr. Steinhauer entered the meeting and presented the following financial statements, which were discussed and accepted: Summary of Budget Appropriations and Disbursements No. 9, for the period ending February 28, 1950, the Balance Sheet as of February 28, 1950, the Dining Hall Statement of Profit and Loss for the month of February, the canteen Statement of Profit and Loss for the month of February and a statement of Mill Levy Building Funds for the period ending February 28, 1950.

It was moved by Mr. Stockmar, seconded by Mr. Harrison and unanimously carried that the dining hall and canteen accounts be consolidated so as to reflect one profit and loss statement for the consolidated accounts, beginning July 1, 1950.

President Parker discussed some of the financial problems of the Athletic Association. It was the consensus of the Trustees that the intercollegiate program of the School is an integral part of the instructional program and that an attempt should be made to secure the approval of the proper State officials in order that the travel expenses in connection with the traveling of the team and staff members to regularly scheduled intercollegiate events away from Golden could be paid from State funds.

President Parker and Mr. Steinhauer again reported on their investigation of the four lots and improvements owned by Mr. S. L. Budaly, located at 1520 Maple Street, Golden. After consideration of the possible purchase of this property, it was moved by Mr. Harrison, seconded by Mr. Bowen and unanimously carried, that President Parker should attempt to negotiate with the owner of this property for its possible purchase by the School, subject to the approval of the Colorado State Planning Commission, at a price not to exceed \$27,500.

The members of the Board then recessed for luncheon at the school Dining Hall, after which the Board reconvened in President Parker's office. Mr. Steinhauer did not return to the meeting.

President Parker presented resolutions authorizing signatures and facsimile signatures on checks drawn against the accounts of the Colorado School of Mines in The Colorado National Bank of Denver, The United States National Bank of Denver, and The First National Bank in Golden. Upon motion by Mr. Bowen, seconded by Mr. Harrison, the following resolutions were unanimously adopted:

1. RESOLVED, That John W Vanderwilt as President and Gurnett Steinhauer as Treasurer acting jointly are hereby authorized to sign for and in the name of the Colorado School of Mines, all checks or drafts drawn upon or against its funds

which may at any time be on deposit in The Colorado National Bank of Denver, and to indorse for and in the name of the Colorado School of Mines, all checks or drafts or other instruments payable to its order or requiring its signature; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That said The Colorado National Bank of Denver, be, and it is hereby requested and authorized to pay all checks or drafts against its funds at any time on deposit in said Bank, which are signed by said John W Vanderwilt and Gurnett Steinhauer for and in the name of the Colorado School of Mines and to pay the amounts for which such checks are drawn to any person or persons named as payee or payees thereof, or the endorsee and endorsees of such persons.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the authority of said John W Vanderwilt and Gurnett Steinhauer to do each and all of the matters and things aforesaid shall continue unrevoked and irrevocable until notice in writing terminating the aforesaid authority shall be first served upon The Colorado National Bank of Denver, and shall be noted upon such copy of these resolutions as shall have been delivered to said The Colorado National Bank of Denver, which copy, when so delivered, duly signed by the president and attested by the assistant secretary of the Colorado School of Mines shall, in consideration of the transaction of any of the aforesaid business, by said The Colorado National Bank of Denver with the Colorado School of Mines operate as a contract between the Colorado School of Mines and said Bank.

2. RESOLVED, That The Colorado National Bank of Denver, Colorado, as a designated depository of this School be and it is hereby requested, authorized and directed to honor all checks, drafts or other orders for the payment of money drawn in this School's name on its account or accounts (including those drawn to the individual order of any person or persons whose names appear thereon as signer or signers thereof) when bearing or purporting to bear the facsimile signatures of the following:

John W Vanderwilt, President
Gurnett Steinhauer, Treasurer

and The Colorado National Bank of Denver, Colorado, shall be entitled to honor and to charge this School for all such checks, drafts or other orders for the payment of

money, regardless of by whom drawn or by what means the actual or purported facsimile signatures thereon may have been affixed thereto, if such facsimile signatures resemble the facsimile specimens from time to time filed with the said The Colorado National Bank of Denver, Colorado, by the Secretary or other officer of this School; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That all previous authorizations for the signing and honoring of checks, drafts or other orders for the payment of money drawn on the said The Colorado National Bank of Denver, Colorado, by this School are hereby continued in full force and effect as amplified hereby.

3. RESOLVED, That John W Vanderwilt as President and Gurnett Steinhauser as Treasurer acting jointly are hereby authorized to sign for and in the name of the Colorado School of Mines, all checks or drafts drawn upon or against its funds which may at any time be on deposit in The United States National Bank of Denver, and to indorse for and in the name of the Colorado School of Mines, all checks or drafts or other instruments payable to its order or requiring its signature; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That said The United States National Bank of Denver, be, and it is hereby requested and authorized to pay all checks or drafts against its funds at any time on deposit in said Bank, which are signed by said John W Vanderwilt and Gurnett Steinhauser for and in the name of the Colorado School of Mines and to pay the amounts for which such checks are drawn to any person or persons named as payee or payees thereof, or the endorsee and endorsees of such persons.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the authority of said John W Vanderwilt and Gurnett Steinhauser to do each and all of the matters and things aforesaid shall continue unrevoked and irrevocable until notice in writing terminating the aforesaid authority shall be first served upon The United States National Bank of Denver, and shall be noted upon such copy of these resolutions as shall have been delivered to said The United States National Bank of Denver, which copy, when so delivered, duly signed by the president and attested by the assistant secretary of the Colorado School of Mines shall, in consideration of the transaction of any of the aforesaid business, by said The United States National Bank of Denver with the Colorado School of Mines operate as a contract between the Colorado School of Mines and said Bank.

President Parker stated that Dr. Vanderwilt, as President of the School on April 1, 1950, should be authorized with the President of the Board to have access to the Colorado School of Mines safety deposit box at the Colorado National Bank. Whereupon motion by Mr. Bowen, seconded by Mr. Harrison and unanimously carried, the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED, That Lester C. Thomas, President of the Board of Trustees of the Colorado School of Mines, and John W. Vanderwilt, President of the Colorado School of Mines, be and they are authorized hereby to open the safety deposit box at The Colorado National Bank held in the name of "The President and the Board of Trustees of the Colorado School of Mines."

President Parker presented a letter from Dr. James Underhill, dated March 4, 1950, in which he stated that he was not able to accept the proposal of the Trustees to honor him by naming the Civil Engineering and Mining Building for him.

Mr. Harrison stated that in view of the outstanding services to the School performed by Dr. Regis Chauvenet, former president, he felt that it would be appropriate to honor the memory of Dr. Chauvenet by naming the old power plant building, when remodeled to house both the Civil Engineering Department and the Mining Department, the "Chauvenet Building." It was then moved by Mr. Harrison, seconded by Mr. Bowen and unanimously carried, that this structure be named the "Chauvenet Building."

Mr. Steinhauer then entered the meeting. He discussed the old accounts owing to the School from former students and the steps which had been taken to collect these accounts. After consideration of this matter, it was moved by Mr. Bowen, seconded by Dr. Vanderwilt and unanimously carried, that such accounts representing debts contracted prior to 1943 be written off the books as worthless.

President Parker stated that he and Mr. Steinhauer had met with Mr. George S. Groves of the Gold Uranium Mining Company and the Edgar Gold Mines, Incorporated, and had negotiated a tentative agreement subject to the approval of the Colorado State Planning Commission, for the purchase by the School of the Goodyear, Newton, and Sunnyside lodes and the lease to the School of the Miami Tunnel and related properties formerly leased from the North American Mining Company, for a total consideration of \$5,000. Upon motion by Mr. Harrison, seconded by Mr. Bowen and unanimously carried, the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED, That in view of the limited term of the present lease to the Colorado School of Mines of the property embracing the Experimental Mine, the value of improvements installed upon the Experimental Mine property, and the advisability of avoiding the expense which would be involved in the moving of these improvements to another location upon the expiration of the present lease, it appears advisable to secure fee title to the real estate upon which these improvements are situated;

THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the President of the Colorado School of Mines is hereby instructed to request authority from the Colorado State Planning Commission for the purchase by the Colorado School of Mines from the Edgar Gold Mines, Incorporated, the following mining claims:

and to lease from the Edgar Gold Mines, Incorporated, for use solely in connection with educational work and as an experimental area, the following described premises situate in the Spanish Bar Mining District in the County of Clear Creek and State of Colorado, to-wit:

All parts of that portion of the Edgar mine opened through the Miami Tunnel, including the portions thereof from the Miami Tunnel level to the surface, being that portion of the following named claims opened through or on or above the level of the Miami Tunnel, to-wit: Edgar Union Survey No. 1144, Oakland Survey No. 1361, Little Amabelle Survey No. 11324, Edgar No. 1 Survey No. 983, Edgar No. 2 Survey No. 518, together with the right to work and mine the above premises from the Miami Tunnel level to the surface, with the right to use, for the purposes hereinafter mentioned, the Miami Tunnel to the Edgar drift, the Edgar drift on the Miami Tunnel level to the Edgar shaft, the Edgar shaft and the Brown raise, also the right-of-way for surveying and similar instruction work through the Edgar drift on the Central Tunnel level from Brown raise to the Central Tunnel and thence through the Central

Tunnel to the entrance thereof; all for a total consideration of \$5,000; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the consideration for this transaction be paid from the School of Mines Tax Fund.

President Parker informed the Board of the desire of the State Highway Department to secure right-of-way rights through the Prospector Park area in the near future. It was the consensus of the Trustees that this right should not be granted until satisfactory arrangements are concluded with the State Highway Department whereby the School would obtain property of value equal to that upon which right-of-way rights are granted. It was the further consensus of the Trustees that the State Highway Department should be informed that the westerly half of Pioneer Park is the only property presently suitable for campus expansion and that the assistance of the Highway Department in the possible acquisition of this site should be attempted.

Mr. Steinhauser then left the meeting.
