Minutes. The minutes of the regular meeting of December 14 were reviewed. Attention was called to a typographical error in the spelling of "supersede" on Page 19. The minutes were approved.

Commencement speaker. A letter from Herbert Hoover, Jr. was read. Mr. Hoover expressed appreciation for a renewed invitation but stated he was not in a position to make a firm commitment for next May. It was mutually agreed that someone else should be invited to be the Commencement speaker. President Vanderwilt was asked to proceed accordingly.

New nominations for medalists. President Vanderwilt stated that in accordance with the discussion at a previous Board meeting, letters had been addressed to all medalists inviting nominations for new medalists. To date, seven replies have been received suggesting a few names, most of which were already on the list. Names not previously suggested, include the following:

In the discussion that followed, the name of Arthur K. Seemann was suggested by Dr. Parker as one who probably should have consideration. The hope was expressed that additional nominations might be received in time to be considered in the screened list to be ready for the February meeting.

Resignations. For information of the Board, pending resignations were reviewed as follows: Dr. Wynn B. Fife, Instructor in Chemistry; Mr. James S. Hastings, Instructor in Geology; both effective at the end of the first semester; and an Assistant Professor of Mathematics, Mr. Herbert A. Morris, effective at the end of April. Although these resignations presented special problems, the respective department heads had given assurance that reasonably satisfactory adjustments would be possible.

Intramural Field. The revised plan and cost for seeding grass on the new intramural field were reviewed and approved.

Progress Report by Fuller, Fuller and Fuller.  
The report was read for information.

period from November 20, 1956 through December 19, 1956; Statement of Income & Expense, Mines Park, December, 1956; Mines Park, Summary of Budget Receipts and Disbursements, as of December 19, 1956; Statement of Income & Expense, Prospector Park, December, 1956; Statement of Income & Expense, Bradford Hall, December, 1956; Statement of Income & Expense, C.S.M. Houses - Group 1, December, 1956; Statement of Income & Expense, C.S.M. Houses - Group 2, December, 1956; Statement of Income & Expense, Mines Park Addition, December, 1956; Summary of Budget Receipts and Disbursements, as of December 19, 1956; Statement of Income & Expense, C.S.M. Fraternity Row. Mr. Steinhauer discussed the inquiries that had come to him recently from fraternity groups relative to fraternity row and the problems faced by a number of fraternities relative to housing. He stated that most of the groups had indicated an active interest in the fraternity row and for this reason he had recommended in a memo of January 2, 1957 to the President that an architect be employed to plan the area and that work be initiated on ideas of leasing, financing regulations and other detail so that something concrete could be presented to the different house corporations. The recommendation was favorably received and the availability of qualified architects and planners was discussed.

Master Campus Plan. President Vanderwilt reviewed a proposed contract submitted late in November by Pereira & Luckman for continuing professional services in connection with the development of the school's master plan. The proposed contract had not been presented earlier because it was considered desirable to wait until the current contract had been officially completed, including payment. To complete the current contract, Pereira & Luckman needed only to submit a written report explaining the master campus plan which had been presented and accepted in October, 1956.

In the discussion that followed, it was brought out that the proposed contract by Pereira & Luckman might be in conflict with some of existing arrangements with architects. It was mutually agreed that it would be desirable to work out an arrangement to make a special study relative to a fraternity row and married student housing included in the master plan, and President Vanderwilt was authorized to negotiate with Pereira & Luckman accordingly.

January 11, 1957

Property.

Kerr Property. Mr. Steinhauer reported that Mr. Kerr had advised him of appraisals in the range of \$18,500 to \$19,500 by real estate agents who were interested in listing the property and on this basis he would sell for \$19,000. Mr. Steinhauer recommended that the offer not be accepted. Recommendation approved.

Barley Lease. Mr. Steinhauer stated that he had discussed the two lease proposals authorized by the Board with Mr. Barley but had not received a reply.

Mason Property. Mr. Steinhauer reported that an offer to purchase, as authorized by the Board, had been made to Mr. Mason but no reply had been received.

McDermott Property. Mr. McDermott had again approached him, Mr. Steinhauer said, and indicated that he would be willing to consider an offer and he had explained again to Mr. McDermott that the school was not in a position at this time to attempt to acquire his property because it was not located in the first phase of the school program.

The plan originally suggested by Mr. Stockmar for a financing arrangement that would permit amortizing the purchase price through rental of the property was discussed. It was mutually agreed that it might be well to discuss this with Mr. McDermott and if he was interested in such a possibility to try and work out an arrangement that would be mutually satisfactory. Mr. Steinhauer was authorized to proceed accordingly.

Railroad right-of-way. After discussion, it was agreed that an effort should be made to acquire certain vacated railroad right-of-way and Mr. Steinhauer was authorized to consult with the Attorney General or Judge Pyle and the indicated owners or principals.

The meeting adjourned at 12:15.

Minutes. The minutes of the regular meeting of January 11, 1957 were reviewed and approved.

Commencement Speaker. President Vanderwilt reported on an invitation that had been extended to Mr. Plato Molozemoff which it was felt would be accepted. More definite information was expected in the next couple of weeks.

Nominations for 1957 Medalists. The 15 names received in 1956 as a result of the invitation sent to all medalists were reviewed in conjunction with names received in previous years. A list of possible candidates was prepared with the understanding that it be forwarded to Board members for their study and consideration for further review and final decision by the Board at the March meeting.

Honorary Degree. A recommendation presented by Dr. L. W. LeRoy, Head of the Department of Geology, was reviewed. It was recognized that the candidate under consideration had a good record of accomplishment but one that was equalled by many others, and for this reason, it was the consensus that an honorary degree should not be awarded at this time.

Il Circolo Italiano. President Vanderwilt reported that the Il Circolo group had indicated satisfaction regarding the exchange scholarship program and wished to continue the exchange another year. Mrs. Shrednik, Chairman of Il Circolo Scholarship Committee, had stated that their group was well pleased with the good record made by their student, Alves Badini, who was scheduled to receive his Master of Science degree in May. Mrs. Shrednik had announced officially in a letter dated January 23, 1957 that the group had available \$750 for whomever might be designated by the school for the academic year, 1957-58, and expressed the hope that another Italian engineer could be found to attend the Colorado School of Mines as soon as possible. Plans would continue, President Vanderwilt stated, to complete arrangements for Dr. Robert Carpenter of the Geology Department, in accordance with his application as approved by the Board on October 12, 1956.

Leave for Gail Myers. President Vanderwilt explained the plans being made by Mr. Gail Myers, Director of Publications, for attending the University of Denver next year to complete his resident and course requirements for a doctorate. He stated that an attempt would be made to try to work out a schedule which would permit Mr. Myers to do this on a leave basis. The leave would not involve any cost to the school and a substitute would have to be provided to take care of the work during Mr. Myers' leave.

Delton D. Flanders. The termination of Mr. Flanders' contract was discussed. President Vanderwilt stated that Professor Flanders had not reported for his teaching duties since November 16, claiming illness as his reason for not coming to work. However, it has not been possible to obtain satisfactory supporting statements
