Minutes. The minutes of the regular meeting of June 13, 1958 were approved. A retyped Page 20 of the June 13, 1958 minutes was distributed to all Board members present.

Self-Survey Report. The self-survey report prepared as an application for membership in North Central Association was given to each member of the Board of Trustees. It was explained that accreditation by North Central Association would be a necessary prerequisite for future accreditation by Engineers' Council for Professional Development, and that the submission of a self-survey report was the first step in the accreditation procedure. In answering a question regarding the value of accreditation, the statement was made that many state boards for professional registration require ECPD accreditation as a necessary qualification for registration as a professional engineer.

Subsurface Geology in Petroleum Exploration. A copy of the symposium edited by Dr. John D. Haun and Dr. L. W. LeRoy, Subsurface Geology in Petroleum Exploration, was given to each member of the Board.

Rocky Mountain Science Council. A memorandum establishing the Rocky Mountain Science Council was considered, and the preamble, purposes, scope and function, membership, organization, meeting dates, and registration fee were discussed. Also Kuhn's memorandum stating the relationship with the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education, and the possible advantages and disadvantages of affiliation with the Council were outlined. Although no formal vote was taken, it was the consensus that affiliation with the Rocky Mountain Science Council was desirable. The danger of joining too many organizations was pointed out, but it was felt by members of the Board that the Rocky Mountain Science Council might offer benefits to the school and to Rocky Mountain education in general. The matter of fee was considered, but it was thought that there was no danger at this point because of Paragraph 8 of the memorandum which permits any institution to withdraw at any time simply by a written notice from the chief administrative officer to the Chairman of the Executive Committee of the Council.

Advance Loan on Textbooks. The recommendation of the Research Committee of the Graduate School that the Colorado School of Mines Foundation, Inc. grant some financial help to faculty members in assisting preparation of laboratory manuals and textbooks was discussed in a general way. It was pointed out by members of the Board that no state funds could be used for this purpose. It was the feeling of the Board that under proper conditions activities of this sort should be strongly encouraged by the Foundation. This was qualified to the extent that a loan, if granted, probably should be repaid from the royalties and that financial assistance should

not be given until after the author had demonstrated a definite start and his ability to finish the publication, and also that the school was satisfied that the publication would reflect with credit to the school and to the author. It was pointed out that before being accepted by a reliable publishing house, a considerable amount of screening would be done by the publishing house before final acceptance of the publication.

Report on Western Coking Coals. A memorandum from Mr. Edwin H. Crabtree regarding his Report on Western Coking Coals was reviewed. The Board felt that it would be a mistake to wait for joint publication by the U. S. Bureau of Mines and the Research Foundation, and urged that the Foundation push the Bureau of Mines for permission to publish earlier and separately. If the Research Foundation published the report in the Mines Magazine, separates probably should be run for distribution. The idea was to bring the separates from the several issues together into one report.

Monthly Reports. Mr. Steinbauer entered the meeting and reviewed the monthly reports as follows: Summary of Budget Appropriation and Disbursements as of June 30, 1958; Balance Sheet, June 30, 1958; Mill Levy Building Fund as of June 30, 1958; Experimental Plant, Summary of Budget Appropriation and Disbursements as of June 30, 1958; Dining Hall from May 24, 1958 through June 20, 1958; Statement of Income & Expense, Canteen, covering period May 21, 1958 through June 20, 1958; Statement of Income & Expense, Mines Park, as of

June 20, 1958; Mines Park, Summary of Budget Receipts & Disbursements as of June 20, 1958; Statement of Income & Expense, Prospector Park, June 20, 1958; Statement of Income & Expense, Bradford Hall, June 20, 1958; Statement of Income & Expense, New Dormitory, June 20, 1958; Statement of Income & Expense, CSM Houses - Group 1, June 20, 1958; Statement of Income & Expense, CSM Houses - Group 2, June 20, 1958; Statement of Income & Expense, Mines Park Houses, 29-36 Inclusive as of June 20, 1958; Summary of Budget Receipts and Disbursements, Mines Park Houses, 29-36 Inclusive as of June 20, 1958; Statement of Income & Expense, CSM Houses Group 1 & Mines Park Houses 29-36 Inclusive as of June 20, 1958; Statement of Income & Expense, 1957-58 Health & Accident Plan, Associated Students of the Colorado School of Mines, Inc., June 30, 1958; Budget Period, 1957-58 Health and Accident Plan, Associated Students of the Colorado School of Mines, Inc., June 30, 1958; Athletic Association, Summary of Budget Appropriations and Disbursements as of June 20, 1958.

During the discussion of the Mines Park Budget, the suggestion was made that the school pledge or commit the net income from Mines Park to keep the money from general state funds. Perhaps it might be committed to start student housing or a fraternity row.

In discussing the Athletic Association Budget, it was noted that the budget was over-expended in a number of items. Members of the Board discussed means of control to keep the Athletic Association within its budget. The Business Office will study means of Athletic Association Budget control.

Date of August Meeting. Board members present were polled. Mr. Coors stated that he would be out of town on both August 12 and 13; Messrs. Bowen and Stockmar were doubtful of being able to attend a meeting in Golden on either the 8th, 12th, or 13th; Dr. Parker stated that he would be in town on the 8th. Dr. Parker suggested that the meeting date be set for August 8, and that about a week prior to the date, telephone calls be made to Board members to arrange for a possible alternate meeting date.

Student Health Budget. Mr. Steinhauer reviewed the status of the Student Health Budget for 1958-59. He pointed out that all insurance companies had refused to insure the plan on the old basis. The Security Life and Accident Company of Denver had submitted a proposal to insure true medical expenses but no expenses of the infirmary. Under the plan they would agree to pay all physicians' fees for service outside of Golden -- in other words, those services not performed by the school physician. They would pay certain hospital charges, extras, and X-ray charges. For this coverage Security

Life would charge \$2.50 a student a semester plus a prorated fee for the summer terms. Such a program would protect the Colorado School of Mines from a type of catastrophe such as the food poisoning at Wild Horse Park, but would not protect the Student Health Plan from extraordinary expenses such as incurred during the recent flu epidemic. Mr. Steinhauer had been informed by Mr. Jack Burt, Agent, that the insurance company would entertain a counter-proposal to the one just offered. It was the feeling of the Board that nothing could be gained by a counter-proposal.

The question of self-insurance was raised, and it was pointed out that the Claims Committee had referred to the original agreement and were concerned about the legality of committing or pledging funds reserved for a new infirmary to support the Student Health Budget. The original agreement was studied by members of the Board, and it was agreed that the old agreement was unworkable, and that the Student Health Plan would not be in effect for 1958-59 unless portions of the agreement could be changed. It was agreed that a new agreement should be submitted to the Student Council stating various alternatives, including the necessity of dropping the Health Plan if the agreement was not modified. It was suggested that the Student Council either amend or rewrite the Health Plan to permit self-insurance. It was later suggested that the Claims Committee propose a change in the agreement permitting self-insurance and refer the new proposal to the Student Council by mail. Board members offered to meet with the Claims Committee to discuss the need for a change, the urgency, and to point out to the Claims Committee members, including the students, that a new agreement must be in effect by September 6, 1958. It was agreed that an attempt would be made to have a final report and recommendation to the Board at their next meeting.

Report on IBM. Mr. Steinhauer reviewed the history of the proposed IBM installation on the campus and pointed out that we would not at this time be permitted to have our own IBM installation on the campus, and that if we wished to use IBM facilities, work must be routed through the State Department of Revenue. In a letter dated March 17, 1958, President Vanderwilt was advised that the Governor had directed Mr. John Healy, Deputy Director, Department of Revenue, to survey the needs of the Colorado School of Mines and prepare a proposal outlining the Revenue Department's suggested services. A specific study was made of registration and registrar's needs. The proposal was submitted, amounting to the sum of \$1,370.00 a year for the Department of Revenue to handle registration, starting with the first semester, 1958-59, and prepare grade reports as they came due. It was apparent to the school that this original proposal was unsatisfactory in that permanent records would have to be transported to Denver, and an alternate proposal was made that the Colorado School of Mines rent its own punch card machine and transport the cards to Denver for processing.

Mr. Steinhauer pointed out that the school had entered into an agreement with the Department of Revenue to put all registration and grade report material on punch cards to be processed by the Department of Revenue IBM machines. This was to start with registration for the 1958-59 fall semester, if all arrangements could be made, and it was agreed that this would be on a trial basis. It was suggested by members of the Board that a date deadline be placed on each transmittal to the Department of Revenue and that a detailed record of service be kept. This would serve as documentary evidence if the Department of Revenue services proved to be unsatisfactory.

Alcohol Permit. It was moved, duly seconded, and unanimously passed that the following resolution be accepted:

RESOLVED, That Ben H. Parker, President of the Board of Trustees of the Colorado School of Mines, be and he hereby is authorized to execute on behalf of the Colorado School of Mines the application, Form 1447, from the Internal Revenue Service, for the renewal of Colorado School of Mines Basic Permit TF-COLO-26 for the use of alcohol, free of tax, for the year 1959.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That Gurnett Steinhauer, Business Manager and Treasurer of the Colorado School of Mines, be and he hereby is authorized to execute on behalf of the Colorado School of Mines the application for permit to procure alcohol free of tax, Form 1450 from the Internal Revenue Service for the year 1959.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That John W Vanderwilt, President, and Gurnett Steinhauer, Business Manager and Treasurer, be and they are hereby authorized to execute on behalf of the Colorado School of Mines the monthly report, "Record of Tax-Free Alcohol Received and Used," required by the Treasury Department of the United States.

That the signature of either John W Vanderwilt or Gurnett Steinhauer shall be sufficient to complete the execution of said report.

That the authorization granted by this resolution shall be effective as of January 1, 1959.

Report on Fraternity Row. Mr. Steinhauer reviewed the status of a possible Fraternity Row at the Colorado School of Mines. He stated that he was gathering data from other schools with reference to site planning, sale or leasing of ground, financing program, etc.

It was pointed out by members of the Board that several fraternities are interested in Fraternity Row, and that they need to know of the Colorado School of Mines' plans regarding Fraternity Row in order that they may plan for the future and raise the necessary funds if a Fraternity Row is to be established. It was felt that it is necessary to provide an answer as soon as possible to fraternities who wish to build either in Fraternity Row or at some other location.

The meeting adjourned at 12:15 p.m.
