In response to the request made by the Board in the September meeting, President Vanderwilt stated that he had requested Dr. Oscar H. Lentz, Professor of Economics, to make a study of the changes in "real income" between 1940 and 1958 faculty salaries at the Colorado School of Mines. The study indicates increases which on the whole seem to be comparable to the national average. The McGraw-Hill Publishing Company figures are for 1940 to 1956 and cannot be compared directly with Dr. Lentz's calculations which are for 1940 to 1958. It is hoped that it will be possible to obtain national averages for 1958 for more direct comparison by the November meeting of the Board.

Monthly Reports. Mr. Steinhauer entered the meeting and presented the monthly reports as follows: Summary of Budget Appropriations and Disbursements, as of September 30, 1958; Balance Sheet, September 30, 1958; Mill Levy Building Fund, as of September 30, 1958; Experimental Plant, Summary of Budget Appropriations and Disbursements, as of

September 30, 1958; Dining Hall, from August 20, 1958 through September 20, 1958; Statement of Income & Expense, Canteen, covering period August 21, 1953 through September 20, 1958; Statement of Income & Expense, Mines Park, as of September 20, 1958; Mines Park, Summary of Budget Receipts & Disbursements, as of September 20, 1958; Statement of Income & Expense, Prospector Park, September 20, 1958; Statement of Income & Expense, Bradford Hall, September 20, 1958; Statement of Income & Expense, New Dermitory, September 20, 1958; Statement of Income & Expense, C.S.M. Houses -Group 1, September 20, 1958; Statement of Income & Expense, C.S.M. Houses - Group 2, September 20, 1958; Statement of Income & Expense, Mines Park Houses, 29-36 inclusive, September 20, 1958; Summary of Budget Receipts & Disbursements, Mines Park Houses, 29-36, inclusive, as of September 20, 1958; Statement of Income & Expense. C.S.M. Houses, Group #1 & Mines Park Houses, 29-36, inclusive, September 20, 1958; Statement of Income & Expense, from September 7, 1957 through September 6. 1958; 1957-58 Health and Accident Plan, Associated Students of the Colorado School of Mines, Inc., September 30, 1958; Budget Period, 1957-58 Health and Accident Plan, Associated Students of the Colorado School of Mines, Inc., September 30, 1958; Statement of Income & Expense, 1958-59 Health & Accident Plan, Associated Students of the Colorado School of Mines. Inc., September 30, 1958; Budget Period, 1958-59 Health & Accident Plan, Associated Students of the Colorado School of Mines, Inc., September 30, 1958; and the Athletic Association, Summary of Budget Appropriations & Disbursements, as of September 20, 1958.

With regard to the two dormitory accounts, Mr. Steinhauer stated that he was giving consideration to combining the two accounts into one, because under the terms of the bonds, amortization is based on the joint performance of the dormitories. It was felt that it would be desirable to continue to show maintenance and operation costs separately to permit a comparison of the two.

Proposed Budget, 1959-60. The proposed budget for 1959-60 with a summary of budget receipts and budget expenditures was considered. To assist in an understanding of the proposed budget, the following were distributed:

- 1. Summary of Budget Receipts and Expenditures, 1948-49 through 1959-60.
- 2. Summary of Personal Services, 1955-56 through 1959-60.
- Summary of Maintenance and Operation, 1957-58 through 1959-60.
- Summary of Capital Outlay, 1957-58 through 1959-60.

In the proposed budget for 1959-60, Mr. Steinhauer explained, the average 15% increase in faculty salaries was used as shown on the tentative budget reviewed and tentatively approved by the Board at the meeting on September 12, 1958. A correction had been necessary, he stated, in the Personal Services which increased this item by \$11,000, with a resulting increase of like amount in the Special Appropriation to be requested. The other items on the proposed budget remain the same as the estimated budget presented to the Board on September 12, 1958.

After a full review and discussion of the comparative data presented, the budget was approved as follows:

Self-Liquidating Projects. The data on self-liquidating projects belonging to the school, copies of which had been sent earlier by Mr. Stein-hauer to each member of the Board, were reviewed. In view of the fact that Mr. Stockmar was not present, it was mutually agreed that further consideration of this problem should be deferred until Mr. Stockmar could be present.

President Vanderwilt stated that at a recent meeting of the Presidents' Association, a number of other presidents had reported that Harry S. Allen, Staff Director, Joint Sub-Committee on Appropriations, and Mr. Con Shea, Budget Director from the Controller's Office, had requested detail on cost, methods of financing, income, amortization status, from all self-liquidating projects. Request for this information had not yet come to the Colorado School of Mines but such request can be expected any time.

Pereira & Luckman Long-Range Restudy. Mr. Steinhauer reported that the contract approved by the Board in the amount of \$6,000 with Pereira & Luckman for a long-range restudy had been approved by the Planning Division and the Joint Legislative Interim Committee on State Institution Building and Construction. A representative of Pereira & Luckman, Mr. Otto Kilian, was expected to come to Golden in a week or ten days to initiate the work which, according to the contract, was to be completed in 90 days.

Rental of Space to Research Foundation. space in the Experimental Plant used by the Metallurgy Department of the school was vacated during the summer and beginning with September, 1958, the Research Foundation took over the space vacated. According to figures presented by Mr. Edwin H. Crabtree, Director of the CSM Research Foundation, the space vacated by the school totaled 7,498 sq. ft. as compared to the floor space of 36,816 sq. ft. previously occupied by the CSMRF. The rent paid by the Research Foundation to the school for the 36,816 sq. ft. is \$750 per month in the form of leasehold improvements. It was recommended by Mr. Steinhauer that in consideration of the additional space available to the Research Foundation, the monthly rental be increased to \$900 per month in the form of leasehold improvments, effective as of September 1, 1958. It was pointed out that the school no longer had any employees on the payroll at the Experimental Plant, other than Mr. Crabtree as Director.

It was moved, duly seconded, and unanimously passed that the recommendation be approved.

Lunch Recess. The meeting recessed for lunch at the school dining hall and later reconvened in the President's Office.

Student Health and Accident Plan. 1958-59. Mr. Steinhauer reported that the plan reviewed and approved by the Board at the meeting on September 12, 1958, had been presented to the Student Council and had been given unanimous approval by the Council.

By action of the Board at its meeting on September 12, 1958, the number of faculty members on the Claims Committee was increased by one. The two faculty members of the 1957-58 Committee were Professors Jack Coke and Ivan Hebel, and inasmuch as both had indicated a desire and willingness to serve another year, President Vanderwilt recommended that they both be reappointed for another year, Dr. James Merrin be appointed as the new and third member, and that Mr. John C. Burt who had served in preceeding years under the old plan be reappointed.

On motion, duly seconded, and unanimously passed, the appointments for the 1958-59 Claims Committee as recommended were approved.

The matter of rotating membership of the faculty members of the Claims Committee was briefly considered, and it was generally agreed that the plan for the order of rotation should be explained in the memorandum to be addressed to members of the 1958-59 Claims Committee advising each of his appointment by the Board.

Fraternity Row. Mr. Steinhauer reviewed a memorandum report of a study made by him. A variety of plans were found and the biggest problem in each case seemed to be the financing. He suggested that after the restudy by Pereira & Luckman is completed, the Fraternity Row Committee be called together with representatives of the fraternity house corporations represented on Mines campus to discuss the following items:

- Review by the school of plans for a Fraternity Row.
- Review of the information received from other colleges and universities.
- 3. Statement by the fraternities regarding their future plans in reference to their willingness to locate on Fraternity Row.
- 4. Suggestions on plans from the fraternities regarding financing of new houses.

In the discussion that followed, the possible desirability and advantages that might result from scattering fraternities around rather than concentrating them in one area was brought up. It was the feeling of the Board that Pereira & Luckman should be asked to study and report on this alternative to a Fraternity Row. Also, it was the general feeling that the Fraternity Row Committee should be activated soon and that the fraternities be informed of the restudy being made by Pereira & Luckman. The Board indicated approval of Mr. Steinhauer's recommendation.

CSM Alumni Association. President Vanderwilt reported that after a number of consultations with Mr. George Roll, Executive Manager of the Alumni Association, it had been decided that the Association would occupy the school-owned house at 1612 Illinois. According to reports, relatively little work and cost would be entailed in remodeling and Mr. Roll hoped to effect the move by November 1 or earlier.

In the discussion that followed, it was recognized that a separate house would have certain advantages for the Alumni Association office and this also would be to the advantage of the school because the space in Guggenheim would be needed for school use later on.

Placement Service. President Vanderwilt read a letter dated October 6, 1958 addressed to him by Malcolm E. Collier, President, Colorado School of Mines Alumni Association, which read as follows:

"Sometime ago a committee consisting of Clyde Johnson, George Roll and myself discussed with you the problem confronting the Alumni Association relative to the operation of the Placement Service.

"This matter was discussed at length by the Executive Committee of the Alumni Association at the last meeting. We feel that the Association can no longer operate the Placement Service properly with its present staff. The budget will not cover hiring another employee of sufficient capacity to handle the job.

"Many of the Committee feel that the school can handle the service better since a good many of the companies seeking engineers write directly to the school. The school is in direct contact with the representatives of the companies when they go to the school for interviews with the graduating students.

"The Executive Committee has therefore adopted a resolution directing me to write you requesting that the school take over the operation of the Placement Service. I have been requested to state that the Alumni Association is willing to help in any way, through acting on committees or otherwise, in the operation of the Placement Service.

"It is my sincere belief that the school can handle the Placement Service in such a way that it can be of greater service to the alumni than can the Alumni Association itself."

In the discussion that followed, the members of the Board were in agreement and favorable to the school taking on the responsibility of a placement service as suggested by the Executive Committee of the Alumni Association. However, the Board felt that before taking action, it should have further information on the best kind of placement service suited to the Colorado School of Mines, with indicated cost, and President Vanderwilt was requested to arrange for a study and a report with recommendations, and further to advise Mr. Collier of the Board's action.

Mr. and Mrs. Theodore C. Paulson Gift.
In view of the suggestion made at the Board meeting of September 12, 1958 that it might be desirable to conserve the capital amount of this gift and use income for purchase of books. President Vanderwilt stated he had carefully reviewed the correspondence received from the Paulsons and found that it stated clearly the desire of the donors to use the amount of the gift rather than to invest it. Therefore,

he had considered it best not to write to the donors asking whether they would consider a change.

Property.

Aller Property, 1218 Sixteenth Street.
Mr. Steinhauer reported that on recent advice received,
Mrs. Meeth, sister and guardian of Mrs. Aller, now had
as her attorney, a Mr. Michael Reidy of Denver, and
that Mrs. Meeth had decided not to sell the property
at this time but to rent it out as income producing
property. He had not yet been able to contact Mr.
Reidy but would do so in the future.

Weber Property, 907 Fifteenth Street.

In regard to the Weber property, Mr. Steinhauer stated that after advising Mrs. Weber of the appraised price of \$13,810, he had been informed that the Webers wished to dispose of this property and the price seemed all right, but they preferred to wait until they had located another piece of property on which to build. Mrs. Weber felt this could be done in a year. The suggestion had been made that the school purchase the property and rent it back to them, but they said they would prefer to wait before entering into any agreement.

Jenkins Property, 906 Sixteenth Street.
Mr. Steinhauer stated that the purchase agreement presented to Mr. Jenkins some weeks ago had not yet been returned. Through an attorney, Mr. Jenkins had advised that it was his understanding that the house should be available, rent free, during the time between the sale and occupancy of Jenkins' new residence. Mr. Steinhauer stated that the attorney had been advised that this was not correct, but that Mr. Jenkins was to pay \$100 a month rent.

It was the feeling of the Board that Mr. Jenkins should be given notice with reasonable time, say ten days to two weeks, for acceptance of the contract; otherwise, the offer by the school to purchase the property would be withdrawn.

CSM Research Foundation Report. The report on Prospector Service for September, 1958, was circulated for the information of the Board.

The question was raised as to whether the monthly Prospector Service reports could be simplified in the interest of economy.

The meeting adjourned at 2:05 p.m.
