The minutes of the special session held on March 11, 1959 were approved. On motion, duly seconded, and unanimously passed, the bills recorded in the minutes of March 11, 1959 were approved.

Tuition. Dr. Parker and Dr. Vanderwilt reviewed the telephoned request by Mr. Allen Dines, Chairman of the Joint Budget Committee of the State Legislature, that the Colorado School of Mines increase tuition for new out-of-state students \$300 and for previously registered out-of-state students \$50, effective September 1, 1959. Both reported that Mr. Dines had been advised such an increase would not be feasible. Advance applications received in the Admissions Office were down 10% below last year at the same time and it was felt that such an increase would tend to cut enrollment, thus total receipts from tuition would not be increased.

The feeling was expressed that it might be desirable to give some consideration to future tuition increases but that unless absolutely necessary, tuition should not be raised without more advance notice to students and prospective students.

Mineral Science Degree. President Vanderwilt read a letter from Dr. James Boyd, Kennecott Copper Corporation, dated March 11, 1959 in which Dr. Boyd gave his views and comments on the proposed degree.

It seemed to be the general feeling of the members of the Board that at this time the school is at a crossroads. Should we concentrate on mineral engineering or should we become a general science school of which there are many?

The idea of having advisory groups to assist the school, and/or individual departments, in formulation of educational goals was discussed. It was pointed out by Dr. Vanderwilt that Mr. Cecil Greene, President, Texas Instruments, Inc., had suggested such an arrangement for the Department of Geophysics some time ago. It was felt that such a group, or groups, composed of perhaps four to six persons, who were interested in the welfare of the school could be of great value in steering the school in the direction of the best educational needs of the future. It was recognized that the department heads would have to take the initiative since it would be their final decision as to taking recommendations made. The entire idea was favorably received.

No action was taken with regard to the Mineral Science degree.

Monthly Reports. Mr. Steinhauer entered the meeting and distributed the monthly reports as follows: Summary of Budget Appropriation and Disbursements, as of March 20, 1959; Balance Sheet, March 31, 1959; Mill Levy Building Fund, as of March 31, 1959; Experimental Plant, Summary of Budget Appropriation and Disbursements, as of March 31, 1969; Dining Hall, from February 20, 1959 through March 20, 1959; Canteen, Statement of Income & Expense, covering period from February 20, 1959 through March 20, 1959; Statement of Income & Expense, Mines Park, as of March 30, 1959; Mines Park, Summary of Budget Receipts & Disbursements, as of March 20, 1959; Statement of Income & Expense, Prospector Park, as of March 20, 1959; Statement of Income & Expense, Mines Bradford Hall & New Dormitory. as of March 20, 1959; Statement of Income & Expense, C.S.M. Houses-Group 1, as of March 20, 1959; Statement of Income & Expense, C.S.M. Houses-Group 2, as of March 20, 1959; Statement of Income & Expense, Mines Park Houses, 29-36 Inclusive, as of March 20, 1959; Summary of Budget Receipts and Disbursements, Mines Park Houses, 29-36 Inclusive, as of March 20, 1959; Statement of Income & Expense, C.S.M. Houses Group #1 & Mines Park Houses, 29-36 Inclusive, as of March 20, 1959; Statement of Income & Expense, Associated Students of the Colorado School of Mines, Inc., March 31, 1959; Budget Period, 1958-59 Health and Accident Plan, Associated Students of the Colorado School of Mines, Inc., March 31, 1989; and Athletic Association, Summary of Budget Appropriations and Disbursements, as of March 20, 1959.

Student Loans. With regard to the student loans as shown on the Balance Sheet, Mr. Steinhauer pointed out that repayment was being made at the rate of \$2,600 per month. He stated that loans under the U.S. National Defense Education Act would probably be started the following week.

Attention was called to the fact that the Alumni Association had an amount of approximately \$10,000 for student loans and it was hoped they would be willing to set up a companion program to the school program for administering this fund.

President Vanderwilt reported that through a gift of 100 shares of Cyprus Mining Company stock, Mrs. James L. Bruce was setting up a memorial loan fund which would yield about \$240 annually in dividends to be used for student loans.

Mines Park Streets. An item on the Mines Park Summary of Budget Receipts and Disbursements raised the question of whether the streets within Mines Park were considered public or private. Since there was little likelihood that the city would ever maintain the streets, and hence there

would be no advantage to the school of having the streets ever considered public streets, Mr. Steinhauer was asked to have the City Council go on record as having the streets declared private streets.

Health and Accident Plan. An examination of the Student Health & Accident statement raised the question as to whether the medical expenses of Philip Howell who was shot in a hazing incident on March 12 should be paid under the Student Health & Accident Plan. Investigation showed that the Claims Committee of the health program had already approved the check for payment and it had been sent to Howell.

The feeling was expressed that this might be a good opportunity to strengthen the anti-hazing regulations by making it clear to the student body that this loss to the health fund is a direct result of their own actions. The question was brought up whether Howell was entitled to payment of hospital expenses if he was engaged in an illegal act, such as hazing. It was felt that the students should be protected, but they should not be encouraged to help such things happen.

A review of the Student Health and Accident Plan with regard to payment of this and similar claims was considered desirable.

Research Foundation Lease. President Vanderwilt presented a proposal by Mr. Edwin Crabtree for erection of buildings on land leased from the state. The lease provided that buildings erected on this land should be approved by the Board of Trustees of the school prior to erection.

The Board approved a plot plan including two permanent buildings and one temporary building.

Faculty Insurance. Action on a proposal to increase the benefits under the faculty insurance plan was deferred. It was felt that no increase in commitments should be made until we know the amount of the new appropriation.

Budget. Mr. Steinhauer reviewed the proposed budget for 1959-60. No action was taken because final figures on the special appropriation had not yet been determined and because of the proposed bill before the Legislature eliminating the mill levy tax receipts. However, on the basis of the governor's recommended special appropriation for

1959-60, preliminary figures as determined by the governor's budget office indicated that the school would have a deficit of around \$36,000, allowing the No. 1 priorities recommended by the school budget committee for maintenance and operation and capital outlay. However, on the basis of estimated income arrived at by the Business Office of the school, the deficit for this period would amount to nearly \$100,000. This difference reflects the variance in student receipts as shown by the governor's budget office and our Business Office, and we are confident that the estimate by the Business Office is the more realistic one.

Faculty Salaries. President Vandervilt reviewed the proposed method of arriving at faculty salary increases as proposed by Dean Kuhn. No action was taken pending final action by the Legislature on the special appropriation.

Kilian (Luckman) Report. The administration reported that the work performed under the contract with Charles Luckman Associates was satisfactorily completed. It was moved, duly seconded, and unanimously passed that the work be accepted as satisfactory and complete.

Fraternity Roy. President Vanderwilt reported that a meeting had been arranged for April 13 for the purpose of presenting to the house corporations of the fraternities what is in the offing as to terms and conditions of the proposed fraternity row. The school intends to present figures on cost of construction, operating budget, debt service requirements, and the assistance to be furnished by the school, as well as the school's anticipated requirements, including a house mother for each fraternity and prohibition of the use of liquor.

There followed a general discussion on the responsibilities of the school to fraternities, fraternities to the school, and the general relationship structure. The feeling was expressed that the fraternities should conform to the needs and requirements of the school. The subject of drinking alcoholic beverages in the fraternity houses now on campus was brought up. It was the consensus of the Board members that the school should be the one to take the stand against the use of liquor in fraternity houses and require the fraternities to conform. It was recognized that not only would. damage be caused to the school, but the school would be in an untenable position if liquor laws were broken or if anything untoward should happen involving the use of liquor on campus or in fraternity

houses. Members of the Board present felt that fraternities would cooperate if a clear policy was announced, and if they would not cooperate, they could not justify the existence of their fraternities on campus. It was also recognized that enforcement procedures would have to be followed to make the ruling against the use of liquor in fraternities effective.

The meeting adjourned at 12:45 p.m.
