Previous Minutes. The minutes of the meeting held on December 9, 1960 were approved.

Commencement Speaker. President Vanderwilt reported that as authorized at the November meeting, he had written to Mr. Morgan J. Davis to invite him to be the Commencement speaker. Mr. Morgan had been unable to accept. An invitation had then been extended to Mr. W. W. Keeler, Executive Vice President of Phillips Petroleum Company. In a letter dated January 6, 1961, Mr. Keeler accepted the invitation.

On motion, seconded, and unanimously passed, it was decided that an honorary degree of Doctor of Engineering should be conferred upon Mr. Keeler at the Commencement exercises on June 2, 1961.

National Science Foundation Summer Institute. President Vanderwilt reported on a summer institute for junior and senior high school teachers of chemistry and general science to be held on the campus July 17 to August 25, 1961 under the direction of Dr. James L. Hall.

Foreign Student Scholarship Program. President Vanderwilt reported that he had had two approaches regarding a scholarship program for foreign students. It was suggested by members of the Board that such a proposal should be studied by the Presidents' Association. The thought was also expressed that the United States State Department should be approached with a matter of this kind. It was recognized that something like this should not be done with state funds without prior legislative authorization. President Vanderwilt said he would discuss this with the Presidents' Association.

Use of Athletic Facilities. President Vanderwilt reviewed for the Board the use which had been made of the new gymnasium by outside groups. The Board felt that when outside groups agreed to reimburse the school for direct costs, any organized group should be allowed use of these facilities. It was agreed that such use should be on a first-come, first-serve basis or perhaps a rotating basis and also that preference should be given to youth groups.

Student Conduct. President Vanderwilt reviewed the report and recommendations made by the Student Activities Committee and the Student Policy Committee. The Student Council had taken action to establish a Code of Conduct and proposed creation of a Court of Conduct. President Vanderwilt reported that he was hopeful that in the near future something along this line could be worked out.

van Diest Gold Medal. President Vanderwilt reviewed names for consideration as members of a Selection Committee. It was moved, seconded, and unanimously passed that President

Vanderwilt be authorized to appoint a committee made up of one person from each field covered by the school, that he name a chairman for the committee, and that he ask the committee to serve for an indefinite period of time to make the yearly selection of the recipient of the van Diest Gold Medal.

Distinguished Achievement Medals. Mr. Johnston reported that the committee had met and reviewed all names recommended. After a review by the entire Board, the following selection was made for 1961 recipients:

Karl F. Dallmaus, Geol.E., 1927  
Lloyd E. Elkins, P.E., 1934  
Thomas A. Manhart, Geol.E., 1930, M.S., 1932  
Harry L. McNeill, E.M., 1924  
Domingo Moreno, E.M., 1922

The committee was asked to make recommendations on improving the method of obtaining and evaluating information on possible recipients.

Interdisciplinary Research Program. President Vanderwilt reviewed for the information of the Board, research projects which overlapped two or more departments or fields. This research, although not organized as an interdisciplinary program, falls naturally under this heading and the possibility of planned development of a broad interdisciplinary research program was being studied.

Faculty Changes. President Vanderwilt reported that upon mutual agreement of those involved Dr. Edward F. Ferrell was being transferred from the Chemistry Department to the Metallurgy Department where he will teach physical metallurgy for the second semester.

Dr. Carl L. Hiltrop who has been working under a National Science Foundation post-doctorate research fellowship in the Chemistry Department has been employed under a regular school contract as Assistant Professor of Chemistry, effective with the beginning of the second semester, at a salary based on \$6,400 for the school year.

Mr. David E. Fletcher has been employed under a regular school contract as Instructor in Physical Education and Business Manager of the Athletic Department, effective March 1, 1961, at a salary based on \$6,300 for a twelve-month year. Mr. Fletcher will replace Mr. Chris Tolos who on his request was being released from his school contract effective January 31, 1961.

The Board approved these appointments.

President Vanderwilt reviewed the qualifications of Dr. Dan McLachlan, Jr. who was being recommended for employment in the Metallurgy Department at a salary of \$15,000 for a twelve-month year. Dr. McLachlan is now with the Stanford Research Institute and Professor Poole recommended that because of his outstanding qualifications, he be employed here as Professor of Metallurgy and Director of the Metals Physics Laboratory. President Vanderwilt stated the employment of such a person would improve teaching and provide opportunities for graduate students to become better qualified personnel for the minerals industry.

It was moved, seconded, and unanimously passed that President Vanderwilt be given authority to offer Dr. McLachlan a contract for the position at \$15,000 on a twelve-month basis.

Mr. Steinhauer entered the meeting at this time.

Vivian Property. Mr. Steinhauer reported that he had talked with Mr. Joseph M. Montano, a member of the Attorney General's staff. Mr. Montano had stated that before condemnation proceedings can begin an offer must first be made, in writing, to Mr. Vivian to purchase the property. This was done on February 11, 1959 and again on July 11, 1960. Mr. Montano stated there then must be another letter from the Board to Mr. Vivian stating that this is their final offer and if not accepted, it will be necessary to commence condemnation proceedings. Should Mr. Vivian not accept the final offer, the Board of Trustees must pass a resolution authorizing condemnation proceedings to acquire the property.

The Attorney General's office had informed Mr. Steinhauer that we must offer a fair market price in accordance with a recent appraisal and, in the event condemnation proceedings are started, the court in all probability will require the school to deposit in escrow with the court an amount determined by the court to be a fair price. Further, that the school will be able to obtain immediate possession within 15 or 20 days after the suit is filed and that the whole transaction can probably be consummated within 30 days. The only delay would be if Mr. Vivian would attack the constitutionality of our power of eminent domain.

Mr. Steinhauer was authorized to write another letter to Mr. Vivian offering \$19,500 as the final offer for the property.

On motion made, seconded, and unanimously passed, the following resolution was adopted:

BE IT RESOLVED by the Trustees of the Colorado School of Mines in Colorado, being the Educational



Board of Control for Colorado School of Mines, that the acquisition of the following described real property located in the County of Jefferson, State of Colorado, to-wit: Lot 10 and the Westerly half of Lot 11, Block 62, South Golden with over-all measurements of 75 feet on 16th Street by 140 feet to the alley together with all improvements thereon, is hereby deemed necessary for the expansion and improvement of said Colorado School of Mines and its related facilities and activities and that the Attorney General of this State be and is hereby directed and authorized to acquire fee simple title to said property, and all interest therein, by the exercise of the Board's power of eminent domain, as provided in Chapter 50, Article 2, Section 5, Colorado Revised Statutes 1953, through condemnation proceedings in accordance with law.

Fitterer Property, 1620 Maple Street. Mr. Steinhauer reviewed a recent offer made to the school. Mr. Steinhauer was authorized to offer \$16,000 for this property with the provision that Mrs. Fitterer be allowed to rent the house from the school for \$100 per month until such time as we need the property for campus expansion.

Smith Property, 1706 Illinois. Mr. Steinhauer had been contacted by Mr. Smith to see if the school would be interested in purchasing the property. It was agreed not to attempt to acquire the property at this time.

Clay Pit Area. Mr. Steinhauer reported that when we first talked with Mr. James Sudler about a contract they had discussed the cost of site preparation. It has since been agreed to obtain an accurate estimate in preparation for which a contour map has already been made. Three contractors will then be invited to make individual estimates and these should be in by the end of January.

Architect. It was moved, seconded, and unanimously passed that the contract not be signed with James Sudler Associates, Architects, until the site was approved.

HMFA Application. Mr. Steinhauer reported that he had not received notice of a reservation of funds for the loan application.

Mr. Coors left the meeting at this time.

Audit. President Vanderwilt reviewed the situation regarding the audit by the State Auditor's office of books of

the Colorado School of Mines Foundation and affiliated organizations. He reported on a meeting held with the Governor, State Auditor Homer Bedford and his staff, the Attorney General, and Mr. Stockmar. It was explained that these funds came as contributions from alumni, firms and corporations, philanthropic foundations, and friends of the school who contributed money with the understanding that these gifts would be administered as private funds and not as state funds and the wishes of the donors had to be respected. It was finally agreed by the auditors that they were concerned only with state funds and not interested in private funds and also that they would permit the school to review the report before it was in final form.

Sponsored Scholarships and Fellowships. President Vanderwilt asked for instructions on the disposition of supporting grants made in connection with scholarships and fellowships. The members of the Board felt that as much as practical these grants should be administered through the CSM Foundation, Inc.

Student Loans. President Vanderwilt reported briefly on the status of loan funds and loan applications. He reported that during the 1959-60 school year National Defense Education Act funds were sufficient to take care of loan applications but this will not be the case in the present school year. Members of the Board expressed the view that all loan funds should be made available for the purpose of which they were intended and if necessary some CSM Foundation funds might well be made available.

Proposed Bill - Residency. Mr. Steinbauer reviewed the draft of a proposed bill to establish residency for tuition purposes. Mr. Steinbauer stated he had several objections to the bill as written. The Board instructed Mr. Steinbauer to consult with the Staff Director of the Presidents' Association about the bill.

Presidents' Association. President Vanderwilt reviewed the work done recently by the Association relative to the report made by the Committee on Education Beyond High School. This recent work dealt chiefly with the proposal to convert Pueblo Junior College to a four-year school. The presidents of the senior colleges and junior colleges, except Pueblo Junior, had agreed on a statement that the junior college, locally financed and controlled to serve local needs, could not become a four-year school and at the same time continue to carry out the unique function it serves as a junior college.

Loper Property, 1222 Seventeenth Street. Mr. Steinbauer reported that he had received an inquiry from Mr. Francis L. Loper as to whether the school would be interested in

purchasing his property. Mr. Steinhauer recommended that an appraisal be made. The Board approved the recommendation.

Houses - Group #1, as of December 19, 1960; Statement of Income & Expense, C.S.M. Houses--Group #2, as of December 20, 1960; Statement of Income & Expense, Mines Park Houses, 29-36 Inclusive, as of December 19, 1960; Summary of Budget Receipts & Disbursements, Mines Park Houses, 29-36 Inclusive, as of December 19, 1960; Statement of Income & Expense, C.S.M. President Vanderwilt reported that he had received a letter from Mr. Keeler stating he was very appreciative and felt honored that the Board desired to confer an honorary degree upon him, but he had personal doubts as to his qualifications. It was the feeling of the members of the Board that Mr. Keeler's letter and the information given confirmed their earlier belief that he was well qualified and would be a worthy recipient of an honorary degree of Doctor of Engineering. President Vanderwilt was asked to convey the Board's confidence in its judgment to Mr. Keeler.

Presidents' Association. President Vanderwilt referred to the Articles of Association, a copy of which had been sent to each Board member under date of January 26 and which he would like to have approved.

Upon motion, seconded, and unanimously passed, the Articles of Association of the Presidents' Association were approved.

President Vanderwilt also stated he would like to have the reaction of the members of the Board to the report made by the Committee on Education Beyond High School. The Board agreed that the report was good in so far as facts gathered but a strong feeling was voiced that statements on policy and recommendations should come through the Presidents' Association expressing judgments of respective boards of control rather than a legislative group. It was suggested that a statement be drawn up for Board approval on items which affected the school either in support of or in rebuttal to such items.

Mr. Steinhauer entered the meeting at this time.

Proposed Bill Establishing Residency for Tuition Purposes. Mr. Steinhauer reported that the bill being written along the line of present practice for presentation to the legislature had been revised to include his suggestions.

Vivian Property. Mr. Steinhauer reported that as instructed at the last Board meeting, he had written a letter to Mr. Vivian in which he stated that the school was making the final offer to buy the property. In reply Mr. Vivian had stated he did not believe the school had the right to condemn the property. He stated he would be willing to negotiate the leasehold interest. Mr. Steinhauer stated that the Attorney General's office had advised him that the leasehold interest was not involved and that we should proceed

with condemnation action. Mr. Montano of the Attorney General's office had asked that he be included in further negotiations, if there were any. Mr. Steinhauer stated he would continue to attempt acquisition of the property. The members of the Board were in accord that the school should proceed in accordance with recommendations received from the Attorney General's office.

Leeper Property - 1222 Seventeenth Street. Mr. Steinhauer reported that this property had been appraised by an appraiser engaged by the school at \$23,500 and by an appraiser engaged by Mr. Leeper at \$29,852. Mr. Steinhauer recommended that a third appraiser be employed and that both parties accept the third appraisal. This was agreeable to Mr. Leeper. The Board authorized this action.

Mr. Fenwick left the meeting at this time, leaving the Board without a quorum.

Science Building. President Vandervilt presented the preliminary plans dated February 2, 1961 prepared by Fuller, Fuller and Fuller, Architects, for the new science building. The preliminary estimate of cost by the architects was (1) \$775,000 for the main building; (2) \$65,000 for equipment, furniture, and fixtures which the Planning Division had not approved and which the Planning Division had requested separate submission at a later date; and (3) \$70,000 for island laboratory tables and technical electrical systems.

According to the architects' time schedule, given by Kenneth Fuller representing the Fullers, the final plans would be ready for bids for construction beginning the fall of 1961 in time for occupancy in September, 1962.

The Board reviewed the drawings but recommended that the architects modify the plans to the extent that the item of \$70,000 could be absorbed in the original estimated cost of \$775,000 which had been approved by the Planning Division. It was suggested that the preliminary plans be presented to the other Board members as soon as convenient for their consideration.

Clay Pit Area. Mr. Steinhauer reviewed the meeting held on February 9 in the President's Office with Mr. Neil Wood and Mr. John McFarland of the A. P. Green Company which had been arranged and was attended by Mr. Coors. The possibility of acquiring approximately 35 acres of land belonging to the A. P. Green Company was discussed. This ground would be acquired for the purpose of trading it to the Rubey Clay Company for approximately 35 acres of clay pit land west of the campus. The possibility was also discussed of acquiring a parcel of land owned by the State Industrial

School for exchange with the A. P. Green Company for their 35 acres.

The Board discussed the need for an appraisal of values of the properties involved as a first step in planning a course of action. Mr. Steinbauer was requested to obtain as soon as possible appraisals on (1) the land owned by the Rubey Clay Company included in the area between Elm Street and Highway 6 (a) from Nineteenth Street to the Welch Ditch and (b) from Welch Ditch to north; (2) the half-block area adjacent to Nineteenth Street owned by Rubey Clay Company; (3) the land belonging to the A. P. Green Company which was adjacent and east of Highway 6 consisting of approximately 35 acres described as the ground containing commercial clay; and (4) the property contained in the parcel owned by the State Industrial School described as the  $W\frac{1}{2}$  of the  $SW\frac{1}{4}$  of S2, T4S.

The meeting adjourned at 12:30 p.m.

The Board of Trustees met in special session on February 22, 1961, at 3:00 p.m., in the President's Office, Colorado School of Mines.

Present: Messrs. Coors, Fenwick, Johnston, and Parker.

Absent: Mr. Stockmar.

President Vanderwilt attended the meeting.

The purpose of the meeting was to report developments and discuss plans for the clay pit area.

Mr. Steinbauer brought Mr. James Sudler, Architect, and two of his associates into the meeting for a discussion of preliminary plans and site preparation. Mr. Sudler discussed the problems involved in building in the clay pit area, particularly as related to foundations and the type of construction that would be required on any ground that had been disturbed. In his opinion, the site is possible to build upon; there were, however, many limitations which must be considered and provisions made for additional costs for extraordinary work that would not occur on a normal building site.

Mr. Sudler and his associates left the meeting and Mr. Steinbauer reviewed for the Board the progress to date on site acquisition. He stated that he and President Vanderwilt had met with State Senator Roy McVicker, Representative Kenneth R. Fenwick, and Representative Ruth Stockton to explore the possibility of the school acquiring a tract of land from the State Industrial School for use in a trade to acquire the clay pit area. He and President Vanderwilt had also met with Mr. Williams of the State Planning Division, and in a separate meeting with Dr. James Galvin, the State Director of Institutions. All persons contacted were encouraging and at the suggestion of Dr. Galvin a meeting was arranged with the Governor.

Mr. Steinbauer and President Vanderwilt met with the Governor on February 21. The Governor was very sympathetic to the project but indicated he would favor outright purchase of needed land because until he had completed a study of all state properties he would be reluctant to release the Industrial School ground.

Mr. Steinbauer read to the Board the last letter received from the federal Housing and Home Finance Agency in

February 22, 1961

which it was stated that funds in the amount of \$2,275,000 were being reserved, good for ninety days, for the housing facilities and college union.

Mr. Steinbauer reviewed the appraisals of the parcels of land which may be involved in a possible trade arrangement: For the land owned by A. P. Green Company, approximately 35 acres, \$48,750 for surface rights; the land owned by the State Industrial School, approximately 70 acres, \$200,000; the land owned by Rubey Clay Company between Elm Street and Highway 6 from Nineteenth Street to Welch Ditch, appraised on the basis that it was filled and suitable for building, approximately 23 acres, \$69,000 or \$3,000 per acre; the clay pit area owned by Rubey Clay Company from Welch Ditch to north, approximately 12 acres, \$8,250 or \$750 per acre. Should the half-block area adjacent to Nineteenth Street, between Elm and Highway 6, be zoned commercial, the appraisal on the 23 acres south of the Welch Ditch would be increased by approximately \$10,000.

These appraisals, made by Mr. John Burt, were discussed at length and the various possibilities for acquiring this land were reviewed.

It was moved, seconded, and passed, that Mr. Steinbauer be directed to contact Mr. Parfet of Rubey Clay Company and offer to buy the entire clay pit area at the appraised price of \$87,250, explaining to Mr. Parfet that no value was given to the remaining clay in the area but that the value of this clay would be offset by the cost to the school of preparing the site for building. Should this proposal be unacceptable to Mr. Parfet, Mr. Steinbauer was further authorized to discuss other possibilities by which the area may be acquired.

The meeting adjourned at 5:30 p.m.
