Previous Minutes. The minutes of the meeting held on December 8, 1961 were approved.

Department Head - Petroleum Engineering, President Vanderwilt reported to the Board that Mr. Daniel M. Bass, Jr. had accepted the offer to be Head of the Petroleum Engineering Department at a salary of \$12,500 for a nine-month school year. The Board approved this appointment.

Salary Brackets. President Vanderwilt recommended approval of the new salary bracket schedule, copies of which had been distributed to the Board members previously.

Upon motion, seconded, and unanimously passed, the following new salary brackets were approved:

Graduate Center for Basic Studies. President Vanderwilt reviewed the memorandum, copies of which had been sent to the Board members, on the establishment of a center for basic studies. While members of the Board endorsed the purposes and advantages sought, they were unanimous in their feeling that a separate organization was not needed at this time.

Association of Governing Boards. The fact that there was to be a meeting in San Francisco in March was mentioned and at least one Board member stated he might be able to attend.

Housing and Home Finance Agency Loan. President Vanderwilt reported receiving a wire from one of the Colorado senators in Washington, D.C. The wire advised of the approval

of the School's application for a loan of \$1,450,000 for the construction of married student housing and a college union building.

Mr. Steinhauer entered the meeting at this time.

Pledging of Funds Toward Construction of Married Student Housing and College Union. Mr. Steinhauer stated that under our system of financing for the two new projects it was necessary that the net income from the operation of Mines Park not already pledged and the net income from Prospector Park be pledged toward these two new projects.

Upon motion made, seconded, and unanimously passed, the following resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS, the Colorado School of Mines has received approval from the Housing and Home Finance Agency of the U.S. Community Facilities Administration of its application for a loan of \$1,450,000 for construction of 75 married student apartments and a college union building; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Colorado School of Mines has determined to construct these facilities; therefore be it

RESCLVED that effective as of this date all net income from the operation of Mines Park units Nos. 1 to 28, inclusive, and Nos. 37 to 39, inclusive, and the net income from Prospector Park, Nos. 1 to 76, inclusive, be pledged to the construction of and the purchase of furniture and equipment for the above married student housing and college union building; and further

RESOLVED that such funds be temporarily deposited in an account to be known as the Colorado School of Mines Construction Fund Account.

Dr. Parker excused himself from the meeting at this time.

Calmett Property. Mr. Steinhauer reported for the information of the Board that the executor for the Calmett estate was not willing to accept the School's proposal to purchase the property at 19th and Illinois for the appraised price of \$21,000. He stated as his reason that this amount invested would not bring the income presently being received under the lease arrangements with the Frontier Refining Company. The executor had again asked the School to approve the non-conforming usage petition which would allow them to build a

new station on this property in accordance with the correct property lines. The need to rebuild would come with the widening of 19th Street which would remove from use that part of the facilities of the present station located on 19th Street right-of-way.

The hoard again agreed that the School should not sign a non-conforming usage petition for the filling station on the Calmett property at 19th and Illinois.

It was moved, seconded, and unanimously passed that the School renew their offer to purchase the property at the appraised price, subject to availability of funds and the final approval of the Board.

Dr. Parker returned to the meeting.

Monthly Statements, Mr. Steinhauer distributed copies of the monthly statements as follows: Summary of Budget appropriation & Disbursements, as of December 31, 1961; Balance Sheet, December 31, 1961; Mill Levy Building Pund, as of December 31, 1961; Experimental Plant, Susmary of Budget Appropriation a Disbursements, as of December 31, 1961; Dining Hall. from November 28, 1861 through December 17, 1961; College Union Fund, Susmary of Budget Appropriation and Disbursements, as of December 29, 1961; Statement of Income & Expense, Mines Park. as of December 20, 1961; Mines Park, Summary of Budget Receipts & Disbursements, as of December 20, 1981; Prospector Park, Statement of Income & Expense, as of December 20, 1961; Prospector Park, Sussary of Sugget Receipts & Disbursements. as of December 20, 1961; Statement of Income & Expense, Mines Bradford Hall & New Dormitory, as of December 20, 1961: Statement of Income & Expense, C.S.M. Houses - Group #1, as of December 20, 1961; Statement of Income & Expense, C.S.M. Houses - Group #2, as of December 20, 1961; Statement of Income & Expense, Mines Park Houses, 29-36 inclusive, as of December 20, 1961; Summary of Budget Receipts & Disbursements, Mines Park Mouses, 29-36 inclusive, as of December 20, 1961; Statement of Income & Expense, C.S.M. Houses Group #1 & Mines Park Houses, 29-36 inclusive, as of December 20, 1961; Statement of Income & Expense, Associated Students of the Colorado School of Mines, Inc., 1961-62 Health & Accident Plan, December 29, 1961; Budget Period, 1961-62 Health and Accident Plan, Associated Students of the Colorado School of Mines, Inc., as of December 29, 1861; and Athletic Association, Sussary of Budget Appropriation-& Disbursements, as of Docember 20, 1961.

The secting recessed for lunch and later resumed in the President's Office.

Mr. Ferwick left the meeting at this time.

Site Proparation - West Campus. Mr. Steinhauer reported that approval had been obtained from the proper state officials for the work done by the architect on site preparation on whe west campus. Bids for the work to be done were to be opened on January 16 and completion time had been specified as sixty days.

Interior Design - College Union. Mr. Steinhauer stated that Mr. Sudler was very interested in obtaining the contract for the interior design of the college union. Mr. Sudler felt he could do a better job if he had the contract for the interior design as well as the general contract. The Board approved letting the firm of James Sudler Associates do the interior design work with the qualification that everything be approved by a representative of the School prior to actual purchase or work.

Meeting with Planning Division. Mr. Steinhauer reported on a resolution adopted by the Planning Division Advisory Board on November 29, 1961 in which they recommended that not more than \$50,000 be approved for land acquisition and that the money be used to acquire property in the two blocks bounded by Arapahoe, Illinois, Fifteenth and Sixteenth Streets and the area of the two blocks bounded by Illinois, Elm, Sixteenth, and Seventeenth Streets.

A meeting with representatives of the Planning Division, State Budget Office, and the Colorado Department of Highways had been held January 5 at which the School presented the later plans and advised the Planning Division of the progress of the plans for the west campus and the HEFA loan. After full discussion, Mr. J. K. Smith, Chief of Planning and Development of the Planning Division, stated he would recommend to Mr. W. M. Williams, Director, approval of the plans as they are now developed and that the area for land acquisition be extended to 19th Street between alm and Cheyenne Streets.

President Vanderwilt reported that he and Mr. Steinhauer had then arranged a meeting for January 8 with the legislative Joint Sudget Committee and had advised them of plans and developments.

Science Building. Mr. Steinhauer reported that the bids were to be opened on January 18, 1962.

<u>Vivian Property Condemnation</u>. Mr. Steinhauer reported that he had been informed by the Attorney General's office that Mr. John C. Vivian had filed a motion with the District Court to vacate the decision of the appraisal commission and that the date for the hearing on this motion had been set for January 32, 1962.

<u>Fraternities</u>. Nr. Steinhauer reported that there were three fraternities who have committed themselves to build on the

west campus, the Betas, Sigma Nus, and Kappa Sigmas. He stated they would all probably start construction at about the same time.

Mr. Steinhauer reported that the Attorney General's office was working on a lease for the fraternities. The lease had been reviewed by the fraternities' lending agencies and had proven acceptable. Copies of the lease had been sent to the home organization of the individual fraternities to see if it met with approval. The lease in its present form provides for an initial charge of 36,000, plus a yearly payment of \$10, covered a period of 75 years, provided that the fraternities could mortgage the leasehold but not the property.

The Board felt that the total cost of the area, including utilities, should be pro-rated and taken care of by the initial charge to the fraternities.

Architectural Committee. Mr. Steinhauer reported on the first meeting of the Architectural Committee for the new fraternity houses. The recommendations made by the Committee were approved by the Board, but the Board instructed the Committee to submit for Board approval the location on the lot of each building, with provision for adequate parking, recreation area, and generalized landscaping.

Lotter from Alumnus. Dr. Parker asked for comments from the members of the Board on the letter from Denman S. Galbraith, Class of 1949, copies of which had been sent to the members before the meeting. The members of the Board expressed their appreciation for the obvious interest and sincerity evidenced by the letter and thought such expressions of opinion should be encouraged and given attention. The members of the Board suggested that an appointment be set up to discuss with Mr. Galbraith the contents of the letter and Dr. Parker stated his willingness to set up the appointment and talk with Mr. Galbraith and Dr. Vanderwill about the matters mentioned.

Advisory Board. Dr. Parker stated he felt it was very important that as many of the Board as possible attend the meeting of the Advisory Board on January 15.

The mosting adjourned at 2:30 p.m.

Parker, President of the Board of Trustees, and attested to by David C. Johnston, Secretary of the Board of Trustees.

Previous Minutes. The minutes of the regular meeting of January 12, 1962 were reviewed and correction made; final approval was deferred until a later meeting.

The minutes of the special meeting of January 23, 1962 were approved.

Honorary Degree - George R. Brown. President Vanderwilt reported that in answer to his letter advising Mr. Brown that the Board wished to confer an honorary degree upon him at Commencement, Mr. Brown had replied that he would be very honored to accept.

Academic Leaves. President Vanderwilt reported for the information of the Board that four faculty members had made preliminary requests for academic leaves: Oscar H. Lentz, Economics, 1963-64; John R. Hayes, Geology, 1964-65; Robert J. Weimer, Geology, 1963-64; and John D. Haun, Geology, 1962-63.

President Vanderwilt reviewed the conditions under which academic leaves are granted, i.e., not less than five years of service, a program which is already in progress and which is mutually beneficial to the School and to the faculty members, and an understanding that the faculty member will return to the School and teach at least two years. Stipends to persons on leave are from one-half to three-quarters of their regular salaries.

The Board asked President Vanderwilt to make inquiry of other schools regarding policies for academic leaves.

United States Scholarships. President Vanderwilt reported that of the eight U. S. Scholarships granted last fall, six were to be continued next school year under their original private sponsorship. One sponsor who had financed two scholarships for the present school year was changing to a different program beginning with the 1962-63 school year. Commitments have been made by private sponsors for five new scholarships for entering freshmen for the fall of 1962.

Even though the U.S. Scholarship program is handled through the CSM Foundation, President Vanderwilt asked for an opinion of the propriety of using the supporting grants which accompanied the original student stipends to finance the continuation of the two scholarships which were being dropped by a sponsor. The members of the Board felt this would be proper providing the officers of the Foundation approved.

It was suggested that alumni who had been awarded U. S. Scholarships under the program terminated in 1956 be contacted and invited to contribute to the present U. S. Scholarship program.

Distinguished Achievement Medals. Mr. Johnston, as Chairman of the Committee to make recommendations, reviewed records of men the Committee thought were worthy of the Distinguished Achievement Medal.

After considerable discussion, it was moved, seconded, and unanimously carried that the following alumni receive Distinguished Achievement Medals at Commencement on June 1, 1962:

Charles Whitehead Desgrey, E.M., 1926 Charles Franklin Fogarty, E.M., 1942, D.Sc., 1952 John Anthony Poulin, E.M., 1921 William Page Morris, E.M., 1930 William Edmund Wallis, Geol.E., 1930

The Board restated the policy that although qualification for the Medal somewhat assumed accomplishment in the mineral engineering fields, selection should not be limited to these fields; and further, that an alumnus who had received a Master of Science or Doctor of Science degree but not an undergraduate degree would qualify for a Medal.

It was suggested that a committee made up of faculty and alumni be appointed to review the list with the purpose of eliminating persons on whom we have not been able to get information.

van Diest Gold Medal. President Vandervilt reported that he had been unable to follow through to completion on the committee of alumni to make recommendations for the recipient of the van Diest Gold Medal. He had received within recent months recommendations on two candidates for the Medal. He furnished each member of the Board copies of the information received on the candidates.

Federal Legislation - Higher Education. President Vanderwilt stated he had been approached by another State college president with regard to contacting members of Congress on the support of federal aid to higher education as contained in proposed HR 8900. He stated that he had declined to endorse such legislation and the Board approved this stand, reaffirming the belief that educational costs should be handled on a local level where at all possible. Mr. Coors agreed to write a letter on behalf of the Board advising Colorado Congressmen that we were not in favor of this proposed bill.

Summer Course in Geochemical Exploration. President Vanderwilt reviewed the course held on campus the summer of 1961 by Professor Harold Bloom. Reports had been very favorable and plans were being made to hold another such course in the summer of 1962. The course is self-supporting and is open to industrial and non-industrial students. The course met with Board approval.

West Campus Development. Mr. Steinhauer and Messrs. Sudler and Cronenwett of the James Sudler Associates firm joined the Board at 11:30 a.m. to discuss specifics for the west campus planning.

After discussion it was agreed that each fraternity should have made available to it by the School on the peripheral roadway space for approximately ten cars and that each fraternity would provide on its lot a minimum of fifteen spaces or a number that, including the ten furnished by the School, would equal 60 per cent of the total number of students planned for in the fraternity house.

The meeting recessed for lunch at which time Mr. Coors excused himself from the remainder of the meeting.

After lunch the meeting resumed and the question of the location of utilities was discussed. Because the location of some of the utilities has been changed since the application was submitted to HHFA, there is some question of whether or not the cost of these changes will be covered in certain areas. The Board instructed the architect and Mr. Steinhauer to inquire of the HHFA as to whether the proposed relocation of the peripheral road and the utilities to serve the fraternity sites could be covered within the existing project. If this were not acceptable to HHFA, then the architects were requested to prepare an estimate of the cost for placing the roadway and utilities under a separate contract.

It was suggested that consideration be given to charging the fraternities an annual fee of \$50 to \$100 rather than the \$10 originally planned. There was no action taken pending decision from HNFA on the inclusion of all utilities, etc. in the project.

The Board instructed Mr. Steinhauer to advise the fraternities that it would be impossible for their buildings to be ready for occupancy by September 1, 1962 because of the work yet to be done on the sites.

For the record, the Board agreed that (1) fraternities would have utilities brought to their sites; (2) curbs and gutters would be put in by the School; (3) roads would be graveled and the School hopes to have them blacktopped; (4) there will not be any top soil furnished by the School; and (5) the fraternities will be responsible for their own planting and landscaping.

Mr. Sudler recommended to the Board that thought should be given to the employment of a landscape expert in the near future in order to utilize the natural materials and terrain to the best ultimate advantage.

Mr. Sudler reported for the information of the Board that in conversations with the staff of the Planning Division it had been suggested to him that the School should proceed with the site preparation of the entire 35 acres purchased from Rubey Clay Company. The Planning Division personnel had informed Mr. Sudler that this would be possible under a change order to the contract under which the site preparation was now being done and they were of the opinion that this could be done at a favorable price because of the location of the equipment on the site at the present time.

The Board instructed Mr. Steinhauer to investigate this possibility with the Planning Division immediately and if approval were assured, the entire area should be done at this time.

Mr. Sudler also registered his concern over the fact that a contract covering his services on this project has not been signed by all the state officials, even though he has worked over a year on the project. Mr. Stockmar offered to do what he could to expedite the contract.

Mr. Budler and Mr. Cronenwett left the meeting at this time.

It was agreed by the Board that the employment of a landscape specialist should be deferred until work was farther along on the project.

Association of Governing Boards. It was moved, seconded, and unanimously passed that membership in the Association should be continued at least one more year and that the annual dues in the amount of \$150 for the 1962 calendar year be said.

<u>Remaities Seminar</u>. Mr. Stockmar discussed his idea for a program related to humanistic-social studies which would involve participation by the entire faculty and student body. He stated he was more than ever convinced that such a program might be a worthwhile experiment. He said he had gotten in touch with Dr. Anton G. Pegis of the English Department who had responded enthusiastically to the idea and had volunteered to prepare a plan as to how it could operate on our campus. Mr. Stockmar said he felt it should be undertaken immediately, if the Board approves, and that action should be taken at the March meeting to implement the program.

Required Physical Education. The Board instructed President Vanderwilt to refer to the Curriculum Committee the matter of requiring physical education for all students.

Monthly Reports. Mr. Steinhauer distributed copies of the monthly reports as follows: Summary of Budget Appropriation & Disbursements, as of January 31, 1962; Balance Sheet, January 31, 1962; Mill Levy Building Fund, as of

Summary of Sudget Appropriation & Disbursements, as of January 19, 1962; Statement of Income & Expense, Mines Park, as of January 19, 1862; Mines Park, Summary of Budget Receipts & Disbursements, as of January 19, 1962; Prospector Park, Statement of Income & Expense, as of January 19, 1962; Prospector Park, Summary of Budget Receipts & Disbursements, as of January 19, 1962; Statement of Income & Expense, Mines Bradford Hall & New Dormitory, as of January 19. 1962; Statement of Income & Expense, C.S.M. Houses - Group #1, as of January 19, 1962; Statement of Income & Expense, C.S.M. Dr. Parker excused himself from the meeting at this time.

<u>Calmett Property</u> President Vanderwilt reported that, as instructed by the Board, he had informed Mr. Robert Fleming, attorney representing the Calmett estate, that the School was not willing to sign a nonconforming permit for the property at 18th and Illinois.

Mr. Steinhauer reported that he had been contacted by Mr. Fleming who stated that his client would be willing to negotiate for a sale of the property to the School at the appraised price, providing the School would allow the Calmetts the use of the property until such time as 19th Street is widened or until five years have elapsed. This proposal was subject to the approval of Frontier Refining Company.

Dr. Parker was called back into the meeting at this time and informed of the proposition. Dr. Parker stated it would be the decision of the Land Department of Frontier as to whether such a lease arrangement could be worked out.

It was moved, seconded, and passed that Mr. Steinhauer be authorized to proceed with such negotiations, subject to satisfactory contract.

Dr. Parker abstained from voting on the matter.

Property Acquisition. Mr. Steinhauer reported that it seemed certain that the legislature was going to appropriate the sum of \$50,000 for land acquisition by the School under the Capital Construction Fund. He reported that the Green property at 1020 19th Street had now been acquired by the CSM Foundation and he recommended that the School buy the property from the Foundation at the purchase price of \$20,000.

Mr. Steinhauer also reported that the Smith property at 1220 17th Street had become available for purchase and had been appraised by one appraiser at \$12,500. Mr. Steinhauer said it would be necessary to have the property appraised by someone approved by the State.

The Board authorized Mr. Steinhauer to proceed with acquisition of the Green property at \$20,000 and the Smith property if that could be acquired for \$12,300.

Science Building. Mr. Steinhauer reported that contracts had been prepared as follows:

F. J. Kirchhof Construction Company - \$563,432 (general contract work)

Howard Electric Company - 86,000 (electrical work)

McCarty-Johnson, Inc. - 78,198 (plumbing and heating work)

On motion made, seconded, and unanimously passed, Dr. Parker was authorized to sign the contracts on behalf of the School.

Vivian Property Condemnation. Mr. Steinhauer reported that on January 22 a hearing had been held in District Court to vacate the decision rendered by the Appraisal Commission on the value of the Vivian property. The motion was denied. The attorney for Mr. Vivian indicated the matter would be carried to the Colorado Supreme Court.

Beta Theta Pi Fraternity House Plans. Mr. Steinhauer reviewed the plans and specifications for the proposed Beta Theta Pi house. The Board expressed dissatisfaction with the proposed plans in so far as questionable fire resistant construction was concerned. Also, in view of the location of the proposed chapter room, the Board expressed disapproval of only one access as planned and questioned whether this was in accordance with the safety code. Mr. Steinhauer said he would take the plans back to the fraternity and talk with them about construction.

The meeting adjourned at 5:30 p.m.
