<u>Provious Minutes.</u> The minutes of the meeting held on August 10, 1962 were not completed.

New Degrees. President Vanderwilt distributed copies of the new curricula for engineering mathematics, engineering physics, and engineering chemistry which had been approved at the faculty meeting on September 11, 1982 for new degrees to be granted in 1964. He pointed out that only minor changes had been made in these curricule after the Board approval at the August meeting.

There followed a discussion on the new degree designations. It was stressed that the curricula and degree designations should achore to the recommendations of the advisory loard which were approved by the Board of Trustees, i.e. engineering in minerals and allied fields as opposed to the curricula for degrees regularly offered in chemistry, mathematics, and physics in arts and sciences and related colleges. The members of the Board asked that the administration make very clear the understanding that the degrees should be engineering degrees and that accreditation should be obtained, or every attempt should be made to obtain accreditation, under these engineering designations.

Seignan Property - 900 Fifteenth Street. President Vanderwilt reported that a purchase and sale agreement had been executed with the Central Bank and Trust Company for the Marie L. Weignan estate for the property at 800 Fifteenth Street for the sum of 38,500 as authorized by the Board at the August meeting.

<u>Faculty-Student Seminar.</u> This item was deferred until in. Stockmar could be present.

<u>Soll Sample Library.</u> This item was deferred until more information could be obtained.

U. S. Scholarship Program. President Vanderwilt reviewed the solicitations made for this program and asked the opinion of the members of the Board regarding further solicitation. All members agreed that further solicitation probably would not be objectionable to the recipients and the program should be promoted.

Transfer of Title - Cecil M. Green Geophysical Laboratory. President Vanderwilt reported that at the May 29 meeting of the Doard of Directors of the Colorado School of Mines Poundation, it was voted to transfer the title of the Cecil M. Green Geophysical Laboratory to the Colorado School of Mines. The Laboratory is on leased property and is for the use of the Department of Geophysics.

Upon motion made, seconded, and unanimously passed, the Board of Trustees of the Colorado School of Mines accepted the transfer of title to the Cecil H. Green Geophysical Laboratory

and equipment and confirmed its obligation and responsibility for the laboratory.

Emeriti Professors. Upon recommendation of Dean Kuhn and President Vanderwilt, it was moved, seconded, and unanimously passed that Professors Clark F. Barb, Lute J. Parkinson, and Arthur P. Wichmann be named Professors Emeriti in recognition of their long and valuable service to the School.

Monthly Reports. Mr. Steinhauer entered the meeting and distributed copies of the monthly reports as follows: Summary of Budget Appropriation & Disbursements, as of August 31, 1962; Balance Sheet, August 31, 1962; Mill Levy Building Fund. as of August 31, 1962; Experimental Plant, Summary of Budget Appropriation & Disbursements, as of August 31, 1962; Dining Hall, covering period July 1, 1962 through June 30, 1963, from July 29, 1962 through August 25, 1962; College Union Fund, Summary of Budget Appropriations and Disbursements, as of August 20, 1962; Mines Park, Statement of Income & Expense, as of August 20, 1962; Mines Park, Summary of Budget Receipts & Disbursements. as of August 20, 1962; Prospector Park, Statement of Income & Expense, as of August 20, 1962; Prospector Park, Summary of Budget Receipts & Disbursements, as of August 20, 1962; Statement of Income & Expense, Mines Bradford Hall & New Dormitory, as of August 20, 1962; Statement of Income & Expense, C.S.M. Houses -Group #1, as of August 20, 1962; Statement of Income & Expense. C.S.M. Houses - Group #2, as of August 20, 1962; Statement of Income & Expense, Mines Park Houses, 29-36 inclusive, as of August 20, 1962; Summary of Budget Receipts & Disbursements, as of August 20, 1962; Statement of Income & Expense, C.S.M. Houses Group #1 & Mines Park Houses, 29-36 inclusive, as of August 20, 1962; Statement of Income & Expense, 1961-62 Health & Accident Plan, Associated Students of the Colorado School of Mines, Inc., August 31, 1962; Budget Period, 1961-62 Health & Accident Plan. Associated Students of the Colorado School of Mines, Inc., as of August 31, 1962; and the Athletic Association, Summary of Budget Appropriations and Disbursements, as of August 20, 1962. The annual Financial Statement of Operation, July 1, 1961 to June 30, 1962 was also distributed,

1963-64 Preliminary Budget. Mr. Steinhauer distributed copies of a preliminary budget estimate for 1963-64 in the amount of \$2,895,561 which had been prepared for presentation to the State Controller in October. The budget included salary increases of 12 per cent for the teaching faculty and 10 per cent for non-teaching staff. President Vanderwilt showed the Board graphs which had been made of salaries in each rank at a selected group of schools as compared to salaries at the Colorado School of Mines.

Future enrollment was discussed in relation to total faculty. There was a discussion of faculty costs per student, including costs other than salaries. Concern was expressed that costs were continuing to increase although enrollment was down.

Upon the recommendation of the administration, the members of the Board unanimously approved the budget as a tentative budget for 1963-64.

Bid Opening - Married Student Housing, College Union.

Mr. Steinhauer reported that the bids for construction of the new married student housing project and the college union would be opened at 2:00 p.m., October 2, at the office of the State Purchasing Agent, Room 20, State Capitol Building. Because of the tightness of the time schedule, Mr. Steinhauer asked that President Vanderwilt be authorized to accept the bids providing they are within the budget.

It was moved by Mr. Fenwick, seconded by Mr. Coors, and unanimously passed that President Vanderwilt be authorized to accept on behalf of the Colorado School of Mines, the successful bids for the construction of the new married student housing project and the college union, providing the bids do not exceed the budgeted funds and are in conformance with the approved plans for financing.

Mr. Steinhauer stated that the completion date for the married student housing was September 1, 1963 and the college union, February, 1964. He stated that the bids specified that the contractor would start moving equipment onto location not less than five days after notice of award.

Conversion to Natural Gas. Mr. Steinhauer reported that he had been contacted by the State Planning Division who asked that we have a study made on the merits of converting our coal heating system to natural gas. He said the State had offered funds from the Capital Construction Fund to pay for the study. Mr. Steinhauer stated that a similar study had been made in 1957 and, at that time, it had been decided not to make the conversion.

The need for such a study at this time was questioned and the matter was tabled.

Long-Range Plans. President Vanderwilt reported that as earlier reviewed, the Association of State Institutions of Higher Education in Colorado was working on a long-range plan for voluntary coordination and joint planning in Colorado higher education and, of course, the capital outlay needs were involved. Also, the State Planning Division has requested a five-year projection of needed capital outlay, this to be in one-year stages.

A proposed campus plan was shown to the Board with Mr. Steinhauer's and President Vanderwilt's recommendations on a five-year projection for campus development and new buildings. The Director of the State Planning Division had indicated that the proposed five-year projection was to be subject to review and revision each year. The plan was approved by the Board and Mr. Steinhauer was authorized to submit the five-year projection to the State Planning Division.

President Vanderwilt distributed copies of a statement from the Presidents Association report which pertained to the Colorado School of Mines, covering aims and goals of the School. He asked if the members of the Board could read the statement and give him their thinking for inclusion in the final draft which would be presented later to the Board for further review.

Public Service Right-of-Way. President Vanderwilt presented an amended right-of-way request from Public Service Company for relocation of the power line crossing the west campus. Mr. Greenwald, Director of Plant Facilities at the School, had checked the descriptions and recommended the right-of-way be granted.

On motion made, seconded, and unanimously passed the request was approved and the Board authorized President Vanderwilt or Mr. Steinhauer to sign the necessary documents.

Metallurgy Departmental Staff. President Vanderwilt announced the resignation of Professor H. Gordon Poole, Head of the Department of Metallurgy. Dean Kuhn recommended and President Vanderwilt concurred in the recommendation that Professor Poole's resignation be accepted and that his release from his School contract for the 1962-63 school year become effective October 1, 1962; and further that Dr. N. Cyril Schieltz be appointed Acting Department Head, and that an effort be made to obtain a permanent qualified department head.

The Board approved this arrangement.

Architect's Fee for Interior Decorating, College Union.
Mr. Sudler's request for the contract to handle the interior decorating of the college union for a fee of \$6,000 was again discussed. The matter was tabled.

The meeting adjourned at 1:00 p.m.

Provious Minutes. The minutes of the meeting held on September 14, 1962 were approved.

<u>Well Sample Library</u>. Dr. Parker reported that the persons to whom he had talked had felt that the well sample library should not be abandoned, but he wished to discuss the matter with others before he would be ready to make a recommendation.

Graduate Faculty. President Vanderwilt reported on a recommendation from Dean Jordan that the following faculty be appointed to the Graduate Faculty for the 1962-63 school year:

Assistant Professor of Metallurgy

Professor Daniel M. Bass, Jr. Professor of Petroleum Engineering and Head of Department

Professor William J. Chapitis

Dr. Frank A. Hadsell Assistant Professor of Geophysics

Dr. Robert Q. Macleay Assistant Professor of Physics

Dr. Harry T. Pisnick Assistant Professor of Physics

Dr. David W. Trexler Assistant Professor of Geology

President Vanderwilt reported that the names of two who had left the School, Professors Keating and Poole, were being removed from the list.

Upon motion made, duly seconded, and unanimously passed, the new list of Graduate Faculty was approved.

Etatement on objectives - Colorado School of Mines.

President Vanderwilt reviewed the search that had been made of the objectives of the School as defined by Colorado statutes. The act passed by the General Assembly in 1881 and which has remained unchanged since that time reads: "The said school of mines shall

have for its object, to furnish such instruction as is provided for in like technical schools of a high grade, and may, by its board of trustees, confer all degrees appropriate to the courses of study pursued."

The members of the Board agreed that education in the mineral fields was implied, but the School was not limited to the mineral fields and that the curricula could be enlarged to include hydrology and mineral economics; and it would probably be desirable to make these two areas specific parts of our objectives in view of the increasing importance and direct relationship of these two areas to our traditional role in mineral engineering education.

Research Project. President Vanderwilt reported on a research project which had been conducted by Dr. Badgley and Professor Poole, along with two other persons, on geological and thermodynesic aspects of lunar rocks. The results had been of great interest and a further research project was to be initiated on campus supported by federal research funds.

Nr. Fenwick excused himself from the meeting at this time.

Mr. Steinhauer entered the meeting at this time.

Bids - HMFA Project. Mr. Steinhauer reviewed the situation regarding the bid opening for the HMFA project - the married student housing and college union. He reported that only four bids had been submitted and the lowest bid was \$1,885,000 or, eliminating all 14 deductive alternates, \$1,792,000, whereas the construction budget for the project was \$1,510,000.

Mr. James Sudler, architect for the project, entered the meeting at this time with three of his associates.

Mr. Sudler distributed copies of a letter to the Board dated October 10, 1962 in which he attempted an analysis of the bidding on the project. Mr. Sudler stated he was of the opinion that the main reason for the overage in the bids was caused by the uncertainties peculiar to the site. He distributed copies of a revised budget for the project and itemized unusual costs in connection with site preparation. He asked the Board to consider the possibility of treating the site preparation as a separate project and requesting state money in the amount of \$150,000 for this purpose.

The Board members thanked Mr. Sudler for his presentation and told him they would consider the entire problem further. Mr. Sudler and his associates left the meeting.

The Board discussed the problem at some length.

Upon motion, seconded, and unanimously passed, the Board of Trustees rejected all bids received on the HNFA project.

The Board authorized Mr. Steinhauer to make application to the State Planning Division for a sum in the amount of approximately \$150,000 to be paid from the Mill Levy Fund for site preparation and mechanical and electrical installations.

Utilities, Nest Caspus. Ar. Steinhauer stated that the utilities to serve the south portion of the west caspus where the fraternities are building were included in the contract which had just been rejected by the Board. He stated that about three sonths ago \$32,000 had been authorized from the Mill Levy Fund which could be used for the utilities and bids were being advertised under a separate project. Mr. Steinhauer stated that the bids were to be opened on October 23 and he asked the Board to authorize the acceptance of the low bid, if it is within the \$32,000 budget.

Upon motion, seconded, and unanimously passed the Board of Trustees authorized President Vanderwilt or Mr. Steinhauer to accept, on behalf of the School, the low bid if it is within the \$32,000 budget.

Appointment to the Student Health Committee. Upon the recommendation of the school physician and with the concurrence of President Vanderwilt, the Board approved the appointment of Dr. Carl L. Hiltrop for a three-year term on the Student Health Committee.

Long-Range Plans for Capital Outlay. President Vanderwilt reported that as authorized at the September meeting of the Board, he, Mr. Steinhauer, Dean Kuhn, and Mr. Greenwald appeared before the Advisory Board of the State Planning Division on September 26, 1962 and discussed the request for funds from the Capital Construction Fund of the State which had been previously submitted for (1) land acquisition, \$250,000; (2) Science Building equipment, \$71,000; and (3) lighting for Brooks Field, \$30,000.

Bequest - Elizabeth F. Adami. Mr. Steinhauer reported on a letter received from a New York attorney advising the School of a bequest in the amount of \$10,000 from the estate of Elizabeth F. Adami, the income from which was to be used for student scholarships.

Construction Loan - HNFA Project. Mr. Steinhauer reported that the Denver United States National Bank had agreed to grant a construction loan in the amount of \$1,250,000 at 2-5/8 per cent, simple interest on an unsecured basis.

The Board asked Mr. Steinhauer to notify Denver United States National that there had been a delay in the project but that we did wish to accept the loan.

Summary of Budget Appropriation & Disbursements, as of September 20, 1962; Mines Park, Statement of Income & Expense, as of September 20, 1962; Mines Park, Summary of Budget Receipts & Disbursements, as of September 20, 1962; Prospector Park. Statement of Income & Expense, as of September 20, 1962; Prospector Park, Susmary of Budget Receipts & Disbursements, as of September 20, 1962; Statement of Income & Expense, Mines Bradford Hall & New Dormitory, as of September 20, 1962; Statement of Income & Expense, C.S.M. Houses - Group #1 as of September 20, 1962; Statement of Income & Expense, C.S.M. Houses -Group #2, as of September 20, 1962; Statement of Income & Expense, Mines Park Houses, 29-36 inclusive, as of September 20, 1962; Summary of Budget Receipts & Disbursements, Mines Park Houses, 28-36 inclusive, as of September 20, 1962; Statement of Income & Expanse, C.S.M. Houses, Group #1 & Mines Park Houses, 29-36 inclusive, as of September 20, 1962; Statement of Income & Expense, Associated Students of the Colorado School of Mines, Inc., 1962-63 Health & Accident Plan, September 28, 1962; Budget Period, Associated Students of the Colorado School of Mines, Inc., 1962-63 Health & Accident Plan, as of September 28, 1962; and the Athletic Association, Susmary of Budget Appropriation & Disbursements, as of September 20, 1962. Copies of the semiannual report on student loans were also distributed.

<u>Faculty-Student Seminar</u>. Mr. Stockmar stated he continued to think the idea had a great deal of merit but that it would have to have the enthusiastic support of the faculty and administration in order for it to succeed.

Physical Fitness of Students. The Board inquired of the progress of the study being made on the physical fitness of students and the question of required physical education last reported on at the April 1962 Board meeting. President Vanderwilt stated he would have the item on the November agenda.

The moeting adjourned at 4:00 p.m.
