Previous Minutes. The minutes of the meeting held on October 14, 1963 were approved.

Letter of Appreciation - Mrs. Dave C. Johnston. President Childs read a letter from Mrs. Johnston in which she expressed her appreciation for the tribute paid by the Board to the late Mr. Johnston.

In Memoriam - Oscar H. Lentz, Art Williams. It was moved, seconded, and unanimously passed that the following statements be made a part of the Board minutes.

With deep regret, the Board of Trustees of the Colorado School of Mines record the untimely death on September 15, 1963 of Oscar H. Lentz, Jr.

Noted among his colleagues and students for his wide interest in philosophy, sociology, and economics, he did significant research in mineral resources, mineral taxation, and related areas of mineral economics. He served as consultant for the petroleum industry, for the State of Colorado, and for the U. S. Treasury Department.

Oscar H. Lentz, Jr. was a respected teacher and a man of recognized stature in his profession. Therefore,  
BE IT RESOLVED:

First: that in memory of Oscar H. Lentz, Jr. this record and tribute become a part of the minutes of the meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Colorado School of Mines;

Second: that a copy be sent to his family.

The Board of Trustees of the Colorado School of Mines records with a deep sense of loss the death of Art Williams, a member of the Physics Department faculty, on July 1, 1963.

Art Williams had a great gift of gentleness, kindness, and consideration for others; a man who influenced others by the kind of man he was much more than by the things he said.

Art Williams was a respected teacher and a man of outstanding ability in his profession. Therefore, BE IT RESOLVED that in memory of Art Williams, this record and tribute be incorporated in the minutes of the meeting of the Board of Trustees and a copy be sent to his relatives.

New Faculty Contracts. President Childs reported to the Board that because of an unfilled position in the Mining Department, George Bator was carrying a full teaching load. He asked approval of the Board to rewrite Professor Bator's contract accordingly.

Upon motion made, seconded, and unanimously passed, the following new contracts were approved:

Prospective Department Head - Mathematics. President Childs reviewed the qualifications of Dr. Joseph R. Lee as a prospective Mathematics Department Head. Dr. Lee visited the campus last summer and had been interviewed by Dean Kuhn and Dean Jordan who were favorably impressed.

The members of the Board emphasized that the person appointed department head must be able to develop the department as an engineering mathematics department. With this qualification, the Board was willing to let the administration make a decision and offer a contract prior to the next Board meeting.

Gift - Mrs. Aaron Holland. Mr. Stockmar reported for the information of the other members of the Board a gift received from Mrs. Holland consisting of gold coin sets appraised at \$4,680. This gift was made with the understanding that it would be used for display. The Board thought consideration should be given to purchasing a separate facility for the proper display of these coins.

Metallurgy Building Dedication. The members of the Board inspected and indicated acceptance of the drawing of the plaque to be placed in the metallurgy building.

Gift to Metallurgy Department. President Childs reported on a letter which he had received from Mr. W. J. Kroll in which Mr. Kroll stated his intentions of donating to the School 10,000 shares of Kawecki Chemical Company stock to be used in the furtherance of education and research in the field of extractive metallurgy. The gift source was to remain undisclosed. The value of the stock was approximately \$250,000. President Childs asked Board approval to inaugurate an Institute of Extractive Metallurgy at the time of the dedication of the metallurgy building. The Board gave approval.

Part-Time Students. President Childs reported on a recommendation from Dean Kuhn, in which he concurred, that tuition for part-time students be \$12 for resident students and \$36 for nonresident students per semester hour. Summer school tuition would remain unchanged. The maximum load of

10 hours as previously established would remain unchanged for qualification as part-time status.

Four-Year, Five-Year Plan - Year-Round Education.

President Childs reported that the problem of year-round education and also the question of making the degree program five years as opposed to four years had been referred to the Curriculum Committee for discussion and also discussed at the September faculty conference. He told the Board he would like, with Board approval, to appoint a commission of three or four and charge this commission with the responsibility of a detailed study and recommendations on year-round education and also our present degree program. Dr. Childs stated he personally feels the School is underselling our final product because of the lack of understanding in industry of what a Mines' degree is. He stated he felt the degree title should be Master Engineer. He thought extending the degree program to five years would lend more flexibility in the student load and also gain better recognition of the degree in industry.

The Board gave President Childs the authority to form such a commission.

Mr. Steinhauer entered the meeting at this time.

Presidents' Association. President Childs reported for Board information a letter being prepared by the Presidents' Association to Senator Oakley Wade on the report Dr. Russell made to the governor on higher education in Colorado. Among other points made in summary, the letter stated that with the exception of the University of Colorado, other state-supported colleges were in agreement that there was a need for the creation of a metropolitan state college in the Denver area. The Board was not certain that there was such a need, but in view of House Bill 349, it was agreed there was little to be gained by taking exception.

Interior Design, College Union. President Childs reported on a visit he had had with Mr. James Sudler and Mr. Joal Cronenwett, architects for the college union, in which Mr. Sudler had expressed his disappointment at not being awarded the contract for the interior design of the college union inasmuch as he was called upon to make decisions which affected the interior design. No reconsideration of the earlier decision to have Kistlers do the interior decorating seemed necessary or desirable.

Architect's Charges. Mr. Sudler and Mr. Cronenwett entered the meeting and Mr. Sudler reviewed for the Board the chronological history of his contracts to design the college union and the married student housing. He stated that, because of circumstances, he was not receiving what he considered his just compensation for the effort expended. He asked for School support in presenting an additional bill to the state as follows: Reprint drawings, \$1,920; kitchen consultant, \$3,000; abandoned work, \$7,468; revise drawings (Project 853R), \$19,250; and overtime wages (Project 853), \$1,795; for a total of \$32,433.

The Board agreed to review the folder of documents prepared by Mr. Sudler and give him an answer after the December meeting.

Mr. Stockmar left the meeting at this time.

The meeting recessed for lunch. The Board reconvened following lunch.

Monthly Reports. Mr. Steinhauer distributed and reviewed the monthly reports as follows: Summary of Budget Appropriation & Disbursements, as of October 31, 1963; Balance Sheet, Colorado School of Mines, October 31, 1963; Mill Levy Building Fund, as of October 31, 1963; Experimental Plant, Summary of Budget Appropriation & Disbursements, as of October 31, 1963; College Union Fund, Summary of Budget Appropriation & Disbursements, as of October 20, 1963; Statement of Income and Expense, C. S. M. Dormitory System Revenue Fund, as of October 20, 1963; Statement of Income and Expense, C. S. M. Self-Maintained Properties, as of October 20, 1963; Budget Period, 1963-64 Health and Accident Plan, Associated Students of the Colorado School of Mines, Inc., as of October 20, 1963; and the Athletic Association, Summary of Budget Appropriation & Disbursements, as of October 20, 1963.

In reviewing the report on the college union, Mr. Steinhauer reported to the Board that beginning September 1, 1964, the college union fee would be raised to \$15 per semester with a pro rata share being charged for the academic summer session and the field courses.

Bid Opening - Bowling Equipment. Mr. Steinhauer reported on the bid opening for the bowling equipment for the new college union. Two companies submitted bids; Brunswick had submitted the low bid of \$53,965.40

Upon motion made, seconded, and unanimously carried, the bid submitted by Brunswick was accepted.

Elizabeth Young Estate. Mr. Steinhauer, as instructed at the last Board meeting, had asked the Attorney General if the School had the right to sign an agreement approving the codicil to Mrs. Young's will. The Attorney General was of the opinion the Board had the right to do so and prepared a letter to be signed to accomplish the release of funds in favor of the codicil. The members of the Board present voted to approve such signatures, and President Childs said he would complete a quorum vote by phone.

Placerville Property. Mr. Steinhauer reported to the Board that he had received a proposal from Mr. Charles E. Frederick to purchase a parcel of land in the Placerville area. Mr. Steinhauer recommended that an attempt be made to trade this property for property the School has need for in future expansion.

The Board felt the trade may have merit and approved having the property appraised if Mr. Frederick was seriously interested in acquiring it.

Previous Minutes. The minutes of the meeting held on November 11, 1963 were corrected to show approval of the tuition established and reported in the minutes for part-time students. The minutes were approved as corrected.

Dedication of the Metallurgy Building. President Childs reported that the date of the dedication had been set for December 28. He reviewed for the information of the Board the program of events scheduled, including the inauguration of the Institute for Extractive Metallurgy.

Budget Hearing. President Childs reported that the budget hearing before the Joint Budget Committee was scheduled for Monday, December 16.

CSM Research Foundation. President Childs stated he was concerned that there was not a closer tie between the School and the Research Foundation. Dr. Parker stated that as a member of the CSM Research Foundation board he would ask that a meeting be called at which time President Childs could be appointed president of the CSM Research Foundation.

Dr. Parker stated that he had served as a representative of the CSM board on the CSM Research Foundation board since its inception and had enjoyed the duty, but he thought perhaps it would serve the best interests of the Research Foundation to rotate such representation.

Because the technical part of the Research Foundation seemed less pressing for change than the organizational part, the other members of the Board were of the opinion that Dr. Parker could best contribute by remaining rather than having several new members on the Board at the same time.

Dr. Parker stated he would be happy to remain on the board if it was felt best. He said he would ask that a meeting be called soon.

Presidents' Association. President Childs reported on a meeting of the Presidents' Association held the day before at which the Governor had spoken. The Governor had told the presidents of his intention to (1) ask for a coordinating board for all state colleges and universities to coordinate budgets and academic programs; (2) request raise in tuition to 90% of cost of instruction for out-of-state students and 20% for resident students with the exception of CU Medical School and the Colorado School of Mines; the tuition he would request for CSM would be 50% for non-residents and 25% for residents; and (3) change the method of raising funds for capital construction.

It was suggested by the Board that we should work toward improving the image of the CSM to allow the School to maintain its unique position rather than try to conform to other standards. It was also suggested that we attempt to develop funds in order to provide a very liberal loan program. Another point raised was that any increase in tuition may defeat the purpose by lowering enrollment. It was pointed out that much of the revenue

received by the State of Colorado is a result of the contributions of institutions of which CSM is one and a very important one in that the Denver area is a center of engineering talent.

Rocky Mountain Faculty Athletic Conference. President Childs reported on a meeting held by the presidents of the RMFAC. Colorado College is dropping out of the Conference as of September, 1964; Fort Lewis A&M is being taken into the Conference; the Conference is seeking additional members.

ROTC. President Childs reported to the Board that the faculty at the meeting held on November 13, 1963 approved a change relating to Advanced Military Sciences credit. Two years of Advanced ROTC will continue to be given for credit, but 6 of the 12 hours may be used to fulfill graduation requirements and 6 semester hours will remain over and above the requirements for graduation.

After considerable discussion, it was moved, seconded, and unanimously passed that the School grant 6 hours credit for 12 hours Advanced ROTC work.

Degree Offerings. President Childs stated again he was afraid the School was underselling the degrees offered at Mines because of the degree titles. He suggested that a Bachelor of Science degree be granted at the end of 140 hours of work; that the intensive engineering work be moved to the fifth year; and that only those capable be admitted to this fifth year which would result in a degree of Master Engineer. He stated he had appointed a faculty commission to study the situation and make recommendations by the end of the school year.

The question was raised as to whether or not the timing was right for such a change in view of the problem of enrollment and the consideration of the school name change. Also until more effort has been expended on the problem of student retention, it was felt that no change in the character of the degrees would be conclusive. The advisability of bringing the Advisory Board back to the campus to consider the matter was discussed.

President Childs stated he felt it necessary that the Board be advised of the study the faculty was making.

Architect's Charges. It was the consensus that the School was in no way obligated to meet the additional costs but in order to be sure, the Board instructed President Childs and Mr. Steinhauer to refer the matter to the Attorney General to determine the final legal obligation on the part of the School.

Sigma Alpha Epsilon House. President Childs read a letter received from a representative of the SAE fraternity in which it was stated that the fraternity intended, in view of the inability of the School to purchase the house, to proceed with extensive remodeling and additions.

It was suggested that because the acquisition of the SAE house was important in future planning of the campus, an

effort be made to raise funds to purchase the house before the cost of it was increased. Mr. Steinhauer was instructed to contact Mr. Williams of the Planning Division to determine if Mr. Williams would commit the Planning Division to approving the purchase of the SAE house with funds to be received under the Mill Levy Building program. These funds would not be available until sometime near the end of the 1965 calendar year. In addition, Mr. Steinhauer was to inquire of Mr. Williams if the present funds in the Capital Construction Fund for land acquisition could be used as a possible down payment for this property.

Mr. Steinhauer was also instructed to contact the State Highway Department with regard to the purchase by the State Highway Department of Prospector Park units, three on the west and three on the east side of the highway, at the intersection of 19th Street and Highway 6. It was felt that possibly the Highway Department could purchase the SAE house and trade for the property which they will require for the interchange at the above intersection.

Tax Liability on Fraternity Houses. Mr. Steinhauer reported that Mr. Gary Hudiburgh, representing the fraternities, and a representative of the Attorney General had met with the Colorado State Tax Commission on December 6 and from all indications a ruling will be forthcoming from the Attorney General's Office that the fraternity houses built on the west campus are in fact state property and therefore exempt from real estate property tax.

Mr. Coors left the meeting at this time.

The meeting recessed for lunch and later reconvened in the President's Office.

Dormitory System Revenue Fund, as of November 20, 1963; Budget Period, 1963-64 Health and Accident Plan, Associated Students of the Colorado School of Mines, Inc., as of November 30, 1963; and the Athletic Association, Summary of Budget Appropriation & Disbursements, as of November 20, 1963. Copies of the Financial Statement of Operation, July 1, 1962 to June 30, 1963 were also distributed.

The meeting adjourned at 2:15 p.m.
