Previous Minutes. The minutes of the meeting held on December 13, 1963 were approved.

Joint Budget Committee. President Childs reported on the hearing which had been held on December 16. It appears certain that any increase in the next budget will have to come through increased tuition and/or increased enrollment.

Presidents' Association. President Childs reported on the meeting held the previous day by the Presidents' Association. There had been distributed copies of a bill the Governor was proposing which would set up a coordinating council for higher education.

The members of the Board were of the opinion that such a council, to be effective, must have defined authority, must have at least nine members with each existing governing board represented, and should have equal authority over all schools, including the University of Colorado.

President Childs stated he would collect such comments as the individual Board members cared to make after reading the draft of the proposed bill and attempt to get these to the Governor's Office before the bill was actually presented to the legislature. He stated that three college presidents were meeting with Governor Love that day and would present ideas very similar to those expressed by the Board.

Dedication and Naming of Science Building. President Childs reported to the Board that on May 8, 1964 there was to be a meeting on campus of the Colorado-Wyoming Academy of Science. It had occurred to him that because the meeting is oriented toward students, there could be student recruitment opportunities. He thought that date may be an appropriate one for the dedication.

The name for the science building was discussed and it was the consensus that it might be desirable to maintain the established pattern of naming the campus buildings for individuals who had made significant contributions to the School and/or Colorado mineral development.

The Board suggested that the Alumni Association and the Physics Department staff should be invited to submit appropriate names for the building. The Board agreed that it would be appropriate to plan the dedication for May 8, 1964.

Organization Chart. President Childs distributed copies of the present administrative organization chart and also copies of a suggested change in the organization chart.

The Board members were of the opinion that before a change is made in the organization plan, President Childs should attempt to delegate more responsibility to those responsible to him.

The Board also asked that President Childs give it information on the allocation of his time in order to be sure

that there were not too many demands upon his time to allow him to do his main job.

Monthly Reports. Mr. Steinbauer entered the meeting at this time and distributed copies of the monthly reports as follows: Summary of Budget Appropriation & Disbursements, as of December 31, 1963; Balance Sheet, December 31, 1963; Mill Levy Building Fund, as of December 31, 1963; Experimental Plant, Summary of Budget Appropriation & Disbursements, as of December 31, 1963; College Union Fund, Summary of Budget Appropriation & Disbursements, as of December 20, 1963; Statement of Income and Expense, C.S.M. Self-Maintained Properties, as of December 20, 1963; Statement of Income and Expense, C.S.M. Dormitory System Revenue Fund, as of December 20, 1963; Budget Period, 1963-64 Health and Accident Plan, Associated Students of the Colorado School of Mines, Inc., as of December 31, 1963; and the Athletic Association, Summary of Budget Appropriation and Disbursements, as of December 30, 1963.

Holland Gift of Gold Coins. The meeting recessed for lunch and the members of the Board met Mr. and Mrs. Aaron Holland to express their appreciation for the recent gift of a gold coin collection appraised at approximately \$5,000. The Board accompanied them to the library to show them where the collection has been placed on permanent display.

The meeting reconvened in the President's Office.

Sigma Alpha Epsilon House. Mr. Steinbauer reported that the officers of the association were not anxious to sell the house at this time but wanted to invest approximately \$50,000 to improve and make additions to the present house.

It was the consensus that the School should acquire the property at this time if at all possible. Mr. Steinbauer was instructed to advise the fraternity officials that we wish to acquire the property and negotiations should be attempted. Mr. Steinbauer was also instructed to get an appraisal if this is agreeable and seems indicated.

Meeting with Planning Division re SAE House. Mr. Steinbauer reported on a meeting he had with Mr. Williams of the Planning Division to determine the availability of Capital Construction Funds and Mill Levy Building Funds toward the purchase of the SAE house. Mr. Williams stated that funds to be received during 1965 under the Mill Levy program would not be available until the State Board of Equalization had certified to the assessed valuation in September, 1964. Mr. Williams said he felt the Planning Division would have no alternative other than committing money from both funds since they had previously indicated the School should acquire property in this area.

State Highway Department. Mr. Steinbauer reported that he had met with Mr. George Miles of the Highway Department with regard to the two parcels of land, with three buildings on each parcel, adjoining Highway 6 at 19th Street which the

Highway Department would eventually wish to acquire. The Highway Department representative had told Mr. Steinhauer that they would like to acquire the property before more money was expended to improve the buildings. The representative had told Mr. Steinhauer that they should know by April 1 if money is available. If they will not have the necessary money by April 1, they will have it on July 1. The property would have to be appraised. Mr. Miles told Mr. Steinhauer that they did not like to trade property as had been suggested at the December Board meeting.

Taxes on Fraternity Houses. Mr. Steinhauer reviewed for the information of the Board events which had transpired since the last Board meeting. He read a letter received from the County Assessor under date of December 27 in which the Assessor had stated he was not going to exempt the fraternities who had built on the west campus from assessment of ad valorem taxes.

Mr. Steinhauer reported that Mr. Gary Hudiburgh representing the fraternities and the School had filed an appeal with the County Commissioners acting as a county Board of Equalization. If an adverse opinion is received from the County Commissioners, Mr. Steinhauer stated the next step would be to appeal to the District Court.

Billing from James Sudler - Interior Design, College Union. Mr. Steinhauer reported on an invoice received from James Sudler Associates in the amount of \$1,233.81 covering work he states he performed in connection with the interior design of the college union. Mr. Steinhauer reviewed correspondence with Mr. Sudler which included a condition that the fee would be agreed upon before work was started.

The matter was tabled until the other claim being made by Mr. Sudler was resolved and until the Board had an opportunity to review the previous correspondence.

Letter from Anti-Discrimination Commission. President Childs reported on a letter received from the State of Colorado Anti-Discrimination Commission in which they asked the School what specific arrangements had been made to assure that off-campus housing was free of discrimination.

It was the consensus that we can not and should not infringe upon the rights of our students in making the selection of where they wish to live. The School has never attempted to maintain an approved list of housing and our responsibility ends in the rental of School property. We should not presume to tell others to whom they should rent or tell students where they should live.

Distinguished Achievement Medals. The files on candidates were given to the committee who is to make the preliminary selection for consideration of the Board at the March meeting.

The meeting adjourned at 4:15 p.m.

Previous Minutes. The minutes of the meeting held on January 10, 1964 were approved.

Science Building Name. President Childs reviewed names which had been recommended by various persons for the science building.

Upon motion made, seconded, and unanimously passed, the science building was designated the Paul Meyer Hall for Dr. Paul Meyer, an early day professor of mathematics. The dedication was scheduled for June 26, 1964, rather than May 8 as had been previously discussed. The dedication would be planned to coincide with a national convention of physicists being planned in Denver.

New Savings Accounts. Upon motion made, seconded, and unanimously passed, the following resolutions were adopted:

RESOLVED that Gurnett Steinhauer, Treasurer, and Orlo E. Childs, President, are hereby authorized to open a savings account for the Colorado School of Mines, Guggenheim Legacy Fund, and to invest its funds from time to time with World Savings and Loan Association and that said association is hereby authorized to act without further inquiry in accordance with writings bearing the signatures of Gurnett Steinhauer, Treasurer, and Orlo E. Childs, President, unless and until it has been notified of any change of officers and of further authorization for other individuals to so sign, together with a specimen of the signature of each such individual.

RESOLVED that the funds of the Colorado School of Mines, Restricted Funds, be and the same are hereby authorized to be added to or paid into a savings account in Majestic Savings and Loan Association and that said institution be and it is hereby authorized to pay withdrawals until further written notice to it signed in the name of this organization as indicated by the signatures of Gurnett Steinhauer, Treasurer, and Orlo E. Childs, President, and said institution is authorized to supply any endorsement for the Colorado School of Mines, Restricted Funds, on any check or other instrument tendered for this account and it is hereby relieved of any liability in connection with collection of such items which are handled by it without negligence and it shall not be liable for the acts of its agents, sub-agents or others or for any casualty. Withdrawals may not be made on account of such items until collected, and any amount not collected may be charged back to this account, including expense incurred, and any other outside expense incurred on account of this account may be charged to it.

Commencement Site. President Childs presented some cost figures involved in staging the 1964 Commencement at Red

Assistant to the President for Public Relations and Development. President Childs reported that he had offered the position of Assistant to the President for Public Relations and Development to Anton G. Pegis who had accepted. He told the Board he was making a place for Mr. Robinson within the public relations department, putting him in charge of public services such as making arrangements for meetings on campus, etc.

The Board approved these new appointments.

Meeting of American Institute of Professional Geologists. Dr. Parker reported that campus facilities were used last fall for an organizational meeting of the American Institute of Professional Geologists. The organization would like to have the second annual meeting on the campus. The members of the Board were of the opinion that it would be proper and most appropriate for such a professional meeting to be held on campus.

Monthly Reports. Mr. Steinhauer entered the meeting and distributed copies of the monthly reports as follows: Summary of Budget Appropriation & Disbursements, as of January 31, 1964; Balance Sheet, January 31, 1964; Hill Levy Building Fund, as of January 31, 1964; Experimental Plant, Summary of Budget Appropriation & Disbursements, as of January 31, 1964; College Union Fund, Summary of Budget Appropriation & Disbursements, as of January 20, 1964; Statement of Income and Expense, C.S.M. Self-Maintained Properties, as of January 20, 1964; Statement of Income and Expense, C.S.M. Dormitory System Revenue Fund, as of January 20, 1964; Budget Period, 1963-64 Health and Accident Plan, Associated Students of the Colorado School of Mines, Inc., as of January 31, 1964; and the Athletic Association Summary of Budget Appropriation & Disbursements, as of January 20, 1964.

Legislative Report. President Childs reported to the Board that the bill setting up a coordinating council had been revised and was being debated on the floor that day. He reported that the appropriation bill had been reported out and Mr. Steinhauer distributed copies of a summary he had prepared based on budget figures as recommended by the Governor, the Joint Budget Committee, and the School. President Childs stated he was not asking for action on tuition at this time but only wished the Board to have information and indications of what might be expected. The Board asked that some compilation be made of past enrollments as compared to inquiries and applications. The Board also asked that information be gathered on tuition histories at other state schools.

Enrollment. The Board asked that consideration be given to advertising through selected commercial periodicals. President Childs stated that an Admissions Council was being formed to get more people involved in recruiting students and visiting high schools. It was President Childs' position that more effective advertising would result from faculty and alumni participation in admissions activities.

Housing for Women Students. President Childs reported that only five women students had registered for the second semester. He stated that even though the Board had previously

Rocks. There was a discussion of physical arrangements and Dr. Childs stated he would like to have the Commencement at Red Rocks. The Board gave approval.

Presidents' Seminar at Harvard. President Childs reported on an institute being held at Harvard June 16 through June 24 for new college and university presidents and their wives. He asked the Board members if they felt this would be worthwhile and it was the consensus that much could be gained from such attendance.

The cost to the School will be \$300 and the Board felt this would be a justifiable state expense. If the state is not willing to pay this, the Board would agree to request this amount from CSM Foundation funds.

Mineral Economics Institute. President Childs reported that the Rocky Mountain Association of Geologists had appointed a committee under Tom Niastand to solicit funds aiming at \$100,000 to be used over a five-year period to support research and professional faculty activities in mineral economics. The fiscal arrangements would be handled through the CSM Foundation. The Board gave full approval of this effort.

President Childs reported that he was still seeking a strong candidate to chair a department of mineral economics and would have a recommendation in due course.

Cornerstone Ceremony - College Union. President Childs stated that in March or April the cornerstone of the college union would be put into place and he asked if the Board considered it appropriate to have a ceremony. The Board members were of the opinion that some public relations value may be obtained from such a ceremony.

New Faculty Appointments. President Childs reviewed the second semester temporary faculty appointments. Upon motion made, seconded, and passed, the Board approved the following appointments:

approved the use of the Dean's house for women students, he did not think it would be economically feasible for this house to be remodeled and set aside for such use. The Board agreed it would be better to defer assigning space until more experience was gained on which to base action.

Dean's House. It was the consensus that the new Dean of Students should live on campus and this requirement should be made a part of the employment contract.

Taxes on Fraternity Houses. Mr. Steinhauer reported that a formal meeting had been held on January 28 before the State Tax Commission in reference to our appeal on the assessed taxes on the two fraternity houses in the west campus area. At this meeting all three members of the Tax Commission were present and the School was represented by Mr. Gary Hudiburgh, attorney, and Mr. Steinhauer. Also present at this meeting were representatives of the fraternities and Mr. Dave Braden, Assessor, and Mr. Walt Brown, City Manager of Golden.

The Tax Commission refused to rule on our appeal that the two fraternity houses were state property in that according to state statute they lacked jurisdiction in this determination. Our appeal that these fraternities were educational organizations and exempt from taxation was denied.

The appeal is now pending before the Jefferson County Commissioners and a decision from them is not expected prior to the last week in June.

It was the consensus of the Board members present that should this appeal be denied, the fraternities and the School should carry the appeal to the District Court. Further, it was the feeling of the Board that the fraternities should not pay the 1963 taxes or if they did pay 1963 taxes, they should be paid under protest.

Mr. Steinhauer reported that he had received an invoice from Mr. Hudiburgh for professional services rendered in representing the School on the tax appeal. The School's share of the bill was \$275.

It was moved, seconded, and unanimously passed that funds in the amount of \$275 be withdrawn from the Guggenheim Fund to pay this bill.

Sigma Nu Fraternity House. Mr. Steinhauer reported that the architectural committee of the School had unanimously approved the final plans for the proposed Sigma Nu house and recommended that the Board of Trustees give its final approval of these plans. In connection with the final plans, the construction budget and the operating budget for the fraternity were presented.

It was moved, seconded, and unanimously passed that the operating budget, construction budget, and final plans be approved.
