Previous Minutes. The minutes of the meeting held on December 9, 1964 were approved.

Department Name Change. President Childs reported on a recommendation from Professor Fisher in which Dean Kuhn concurred that the name of the English Department be changed to "Department of Humanities and Social Sciences." The staff of the department and Dean Kuhn all felt this name was more descriptive of the courses taught within this department. President Childs also approved this change.

It was moved, seconded, and unanimously passed that the name of the department presently called the "Department of English and Other Humanistic-Social Studies" be changed to "Department of Humanities and Social Sciences."

Monthly Reports. Mr. Steinhauer entered the meeting and reviewed the monthly reports as follows: Summary of Budget Appropriation & Disbursements, as of December 31, 1964; Balance Sheet, December 31, 1964; Mill Levy Building Fund, as of December 31, 1964; Experimental Plant, Summary of Budget Appropriation & Disbursements, as of December 31, 1964; College Union Fund, Summary of Budget Appropriations and Disbursements, December 20, 1964; Statement of Cash Receipts & Expenditures, C.S.M. Self-Maintained Properties, as of December 20, 1964; Statement of Income and Expense, C.S.M. Dormitory System Revenue Fund, as of December 20, 1964; Office of Research Services, Statement of Cash Receipts and Disbursements, July 1, 1964 to December 31, 1964; Budget Period, 1964-65 Health and Accident Plan, Associated Students of the Colorado School of Mines, Inc., December 31, 1964; and the Athletic Association, Summary of Budget Appropriation and Disbursements, as of December 31, 1964.

Prospector Park Buildings. Mr. Steinhauer reported to the Board that the Prospector Park buildings east of Jones Road which were on the property of Jefferson Clay Company would be demolished soon by the inmates of the reformatory at Buena Vista at no cost to the School. The School would be allowed to take what salvage we want.

Boettcher and Company Proposal. It was moved, seconded, and unanimously passed that approval be given the proposal submitted by Boettcher and Company dated January 8, 1965 with reference to refunding our present bond issues. Dr. Ben H. Parker, President, and Mr. Joseph Coors, Secretary, were authorized to execute this agreement on behalf of the School. A copy of this proposal is attached to these minutes.

Under the Item 1 A, the provision for enabling legislation to lease property is included.

Faculty Assessment for Use of College Union. President Childs reviewed for the Board the actions taken by the faculty with respect to assessing themselves for the use of the college union and in particular the faculty lounge. After some discussion, the matter was tabled for the time being.

Wild Horse Park. Mr. Steinhauer reviewed for the Board the latest developments in regard to the desire by the Army to purchase Wild Horse Park. Mr. Steinhauer had been contacted by a Mr. Patrick Bault of Grenada Mills, California who is interested in acquiring government land in California and is willing to enter into negotiations whereby Mr. Bault could obtain land for us and the government would trade to him land of comparable value in California for the acreage at Wild Horse Park.

The Board members were of the opinion that Mr. Bault should be asked to name a total price he would be willing to pay for all the property the School owns at Wild Horse Park. It was felt this may be an opportunity for the School to acquire alternate mobilized facilities for field camp work and also property needed in our campus planning.

Rezoning. Mr. Steinhauer reported that he had received from the City of Golden a copy of a petition to rezone two parcels of ground, one in Block 115 across from the property we anticipate acquiring at 19th and Illinois and the other in Block 114 between Cheyenne and Illinois between 19th and 20th Streets.

It was moved, seconded, and unanimously carried that the School should oppose this rezoning.

Upon motion made, seconded, and unanimously passed, the following resolutions were adopted:

Audit. President Childs and Mr. Steinhauer reviewed for the Board the action which has been taken to clarify with the proper State officials questions which had arisen as a result of the audit by Stone, Gray and Company. Answers to specific questions asked had not yet been received.

Application Fee. President Childs reviewed for the Board a recommendation he had asked Mr. Steinhauer to prepare with regard to a nominal charge for processing applications for enrollment and evaluations of credentials for transfer students.

It was moved, seconded, and unanimously passed that a charge of \$10 would be made to all new nonresident students to cover the cost of processing applications, effective with applications for the 1966-67 school year.

Landscaping - West Campus. Mr. Steinhauer presented a drawing of proposed landscaping for the Prospector Village portion of the west campus. It was the consensus that planting of grass and low shrubbery should be done as soon as feasible. Other planting should be done whenever practicable.

Trade - Property Adjacent to Clear Creek. Mr. Steinhauer read a letter dated January 7, 1965 from Clifford H. Evans wherein Mr. Evans stated his desire to purchase the property at 19th and Illinois and trade with the School for the property adjacent to Clear Creek, Block D and 1/2 in south Golden.

The Board authorized Mr. Steinhauer to accept the offer made by Mr. Evans and arrange for the introduction into the legislature of permissive legislation to accomplish this.

Gentlemen:

Pursuant to our letter dated July 8, 1964, we have submitted our "Plan and Discussion for Refunding Revenue Bonds and Loans" (hereafter referred to as the "Plan"). It is our understanding that the Board desires Boettcher and Company to proceed with the Plan at once since our Plan will require amendatory legislation to clarify several matters which we have previously discussed at two informal meetings.

1. In accordance with our "Plan", a copy of which has been provided to each Board member, we hereby submit the following proposal for your consideration and acceptance. Boettcher and Company will perform but not necessarily limit themselves to the following services:

- A. Retain on your behalf, Messrs. Dawson, Nagel, Sherman & Howard of Denver, recognized municipal bond attorneys for the preparation of enabling legislation and all legal proceedings incident to the issuance of any refunding bonds;
- B. Prepare comparative maturity schedules setting forth payments designed to fit your requirements, and advise with you as to the most advantageous maturity schedules and prior redemption features;
- C. Furnish the blank printed bonds with steel engraved borders, ready for signature;
- D. Provide the final approving opinion of Messrs. Dawson, Nagel, Sherman & Howard as to the legality of the issuance of the refunding bonds;
- E. Make ourselves available for consultation and meeting at any time during the course of the entire procedure and agree to assist you in every way possible in making this a secure and successful bond issue;
- F. We will assist you to establish the refunding escrow requisite to the refunding in a National Bank possessing full trust powers, said bank to be approved by you and us. In connection with the refunding escrow, we will also retain on your behalf Arthur Young & Company, certified public accountants, to verify all proposed transactions in the refunding escrow.
- G. We will present all our findings and pertinent financial data in person to Standard & Poor's Corporation of New York in an effort to obtain a rating of at least "A" on the refunding and future improvement issues.

2. Following the enactment of enabling legislation (probably in the Spring of 1965) and assuming that the refunding is economically feasible at that time, Boettcher and Company will submit to the Board of Trustees a proposal to underwrite the refunding issue at an average rate of interest based upon the then prevailing market conditions for tax-exempt issues of similar quality, type and maturities. In the event the Board elects not to accept the proposal, Boettcher and Company will then perform the following services:

- A. In consultation with your officials, we will prepare a sales prospectus and a notice of sale completely covering all pertinent financial data, to the end that any prospective bidder may be fully informed and in a position to give you his best competitive bid. We will cause the prospectus and notice of sale to be circulated widely among prospective bidders, all to the end that the best possible competitive bids will be received;
- B. We will also conduct a public competitive sale, assist you in the tabulation of the bids and the award of the bonds.

3. Regardless of which method you select to accomplish the refunding (acceptance of our purchase proposal or advertised public sale) prior to the delivery of the refunding bonds, it will be necessary for us to purchase the requisite U. S. Treasury obligations necessary for the establishment of the refunding escrow. It is expressly understood that you will purchase from us, using the par proceeds of the refunding bonds and other monies which may be on hand, the requisite U. S. Treasury obligations at our purchase price plus accrued interest to the date of delivery to you.

4. In the event that we are able to purchase some of the existing issues from the Housing and Home Finance Agency of the U. S. Government subsequent to the accomplishment of the refunding of the outstanding indebtedness (as indicated in our "Plan"), we will assist the college in remarketing these issues and all amounts obtained from the sale thereof in excess of their cost will be remitted to the college.

5. For all financial services outlined above, the Trustees agree to pay Boettcher and Company a fee in the amount of \$10.00 per \$1,000 par amount of Refunding Revenue Bonds (based on an issue of more than \$2,000,000) issued in behalf of Colorado School of Mines. The fee shall be net to Boettcher and Company, it being understood and agreed that Boettcher and Company shall pay only the travel and incidental expense of its own personnel and its own overhead expense, and the Trustees shall pay all other costs and expenses incurred in connection with the Refunding Revenue Bonds, which fee and costs can be paid from bond proceeds or funds released as a result of the refunding.

6. Assuming a refunding issue of more than \$2,000,000, the major fees to be paid by the Trustees pursuant to the refunding are estimated as follows:

- A) Municipal bond attorneys (Dawson, Nagel, Sherman & Howard): \$4,400.00
- B) Printed bonds (Northern Bank Note Company): \$450.00
- C) Escrow Bank: \$4,100.00
- D) Certified Public Accountants (Arthur Young & Company): \$250.00

In the event that the enabling legislation is prepared and for any reason subsequently not introduced to or passed by the 1965 Colorado General Assembly, Boettcher and Company hereby agrees to pay Messrs. Dawson, Nagel, Sherman & Howard up to \$750.00 for their work in preparing the legislation. In the event the fee of Messrs. Dawson, Nagel, Sherman & Howard exceeds \$750.00 before the legislation is finally prepared and introduced, the Trustees will be so notified in order that they can decide whether to continue with the preparation of the legislation.

7. The fees to Boettcher and Company referred to in paragraph 5 shall be due and payable by you to us only after the refunding bonds have been delivered to the successful purchaser, the proceeds from the refunding bond issue have been received by you, and the refunding program herein described is fully consummated. If the Trustees accept the proposal of Boettcher and Company outlined in paragraph 2, Boettcher and Company agrees to waive the fee stated in paragraph 5.

8. In the event the Trustees do not issue refunding bonds as outlined for any reason whatsoever, the Trustees of the School of Mines shall be under no obligation to Boettcher and Company and this agreement shall be held null and void.





Previous Minutes. The minutes of the meeting held on January 8, 1965 were approved.

A question was asked concerning the college union assessment for faculty members which appeared in the January minutes. President Childs explained that there would be no assessment for the 1964-65 school year, but any faculty member could make voluntary contributions.

Emeritus Status. President Childs reported that Dean Kuhn had recommended that Dean William V. Burger and Dr. Augustus S. Houghton be granted emeritus status. It was moved, seconded, and passed that Dean William V. Burger be granted emeritus status.

Regarding Dr. Houghton, it was stated that the Board of Trustees had adopted a policy some years back whereby emeritus status would be granted only to persons of high academic rank and more than average length of service. The Board reaffirmed this policy and, therefore, were unable to grant emeritus status to Dr. Houghton.

Western Inter-State Commission for Higher Education. President Childs reviewed the development and programs of WICHE. The Colorado School of Mines is not a member of the organization but President Childs suggested we may wish to participate in view of our specialized engineering courses.

It was the consensus that the School should not participate in the program at this time but we should keep informed of all developments.

Monthly Reports. Mr. Steinhauer distributed copies of the monthly reports as follows: Summary of Budget Appropriation & Disbursements, as of January 31, 1965; Balance Sheet, January 31, 1965; Mill Levy Building Fund, as of January 31, 1965; Experimental Plant, Summary of Budget Appropriation & Disbursements, as of January 31, 1965; College Union Fund, Summary of Budget Appropriation & Disbursements, as of January 20, 1965; Statement of Income and Expense, C.S.M. Dormitory System Revenue Fund, as of January 20, 1965; Statement of Cash Receipts & Expenditures, C.S.M. Self-Maintained Properties, as of January 20, 1965; Budget Period, 1964-65 Health and Accident Plan, Associated Students of the Colorado School of Mines, Inc., as of January 29, 1965; and the Athletic Association, Summary of Budget Appropriation & Disbursements, July 1, 1964 to June 30, 1965.

Wild Horse Park. Mr. Steinhauer reviewed a telephone conversation he had held with Mr. Patrick Bault of Grenada Hills, California at which time Mr. Bault indicated he would be willing to buy all of our property in the Wild Horse Park area at the appraised price and he was furnished with the description of our property in the area. Subsequent to this conversation, Mr. L. Y. Lawton, Assistant Chief of the Real Estate Division of the Omaha office of the Corps of Engineers, came to Golden and discussed the proposed purchase of this land by the Army. Mr. Lawton expressed the desire that the School deal directly with the Corps of Engineers, rather than enter into a three-way deal which would involve Mr. Bault.

It was the feeling of the Board that we should make our own appraisal of the area inasmuch as the Army has indicated that its appraisals will not be shown to us. However, our appraisal could be made after the Army has made its firm offer to us. In the meantime, Mr. Steinhauer was instructed to confer with Mr. Howard Schults of the State Land Board to see if the Land Board had an appraisal of its holdings in this area.

Rezoning. Mr. Steinhauer reported the results of his appearance at the meeting of the Golden Planning Commission held January 27, 1965 regarding the rezoning from resident to commercial of the southeast and southwest corners of the intersection of 19th and Illinois. In spite of the protests made by the School and adjacent property owners, the Planning Commission voted unanimously to recommend rezoning to the City Council. Mr. Steinhauer was asked by the Board to appear at the March 11, 1965 meeting of the City Council at which time there will be an open hearing for discussion of this rezoning.

Audit. President Childs read the letter he had prepared to be sent to Mrs. Bailey, Chairman of the Ethics Committee of the Certified Public Accountants Society. The Board approved the forwarding of this letter to Mrs. Bailey.

Legislation - Exchange of Property. Mr. Steinhauer reported that Senate Bill No. 119 authorizing the transfer of Block D 1/2 on the south side of Clear Creek to Mr. Clifford H. Evans in exchange for the south half of Lots 11 and 12, Block 102, had been reviewed by the State Affairs Committee and had been reported out of committee. There appeared to be no objection to the passage of this bill.

Mr. Evans had asked that the School process a quiet title suit on Block D 1/2 and it was agreed that the Attorney General would be asked to process such a suit. In the event the Attorney General refused to do this, it would be Mr. Evans' responsibility if he wants it done.

Contract with Bronco Football Team. The proposed contract between the Colorado School of Mines and Empire Sports, Inc. was read. The contract covers the use of School facilities as a training camp for the Bronco football team from approximately July 10, 1965 to September 10, 1965.

It was moved, seconded, and passed that President Childs be authorized to sign this contract on behalf of the School.

Property Adjacent to the Experimental Plant. Mr. Steinhauer pointed out on a map of the Clear Creek area a piece of ground of approximately 2.70 acres on the south side of Clear Creek owned by the George W. Parfet Estate and which is adjacent to the Experimental Plant. It was previously believed that the property belonged to the School but courthouse records indicate otherwise. The Colorado School of Mines Research Foundation has been using this ground and Mr. Steinhauer recommended that the Research Foundation be requested to purchase this property
