Student Health Center



Congratulations on your acceptance to Mines! We look forward to welcoming you here in August. In order to ensure a smooth transition, please send the following **required information** via the Mines Health Portal (it's a bubble on your <u>Trailhead</u> main page) **prior to June 15**.

Access complete details regarding the immunization requirements and a "how-to" guide for submitting them. If you are currently under age 18, please have your parent/guardian complete the forms for you.

Required for ALL students

- MMR: Measles, Mumps and Rubella Vaccines (two vaccines both received on or after your first birthday AND at least 28 days apart).
- TB Screening Questions ("Forms" tab found on the Health Portal) Tuberculosis testing results if
 indicated by form.
- Proof of all immunizations must be UPLOADED to the Health Portal so they may be verified.

Additional requirement if you are living on campus

Meningococcal ACWY Vaccine (given within the past four years) or Meningococcal Waiver Form. If your
Meningitis ACWY vaccine is within the last four years and is listed on your immunization record, you do
not need to do anything else. If you choose to waive the Meningitis requirement, please upload this
form after completion.

If you are under age 18 as of August 19, 2019

• Consent to Treat Minor ("Forms" tab found on the Health Portal). Please upload after completion.

Society of Women Engineers (SWE)



During the 2018-2019 academic year, the Mines section of the Society of Women Engineers (SWE) piloted a mentorship program to connect under-class and transfer students with upper-class women at Mines. Pairings were made based on major, experience and other interests outside of schoolwork. Approximately one sponsored event was coordinated each month, with activities ranging from casual on-campus get-togethers (with food) to snowshoeing trips in Rocky Mountain National Park. Groups were encouraged to communicate regularly and meet up for informal chats. Having an older peer who has been through what underclass and transfer students are currently experiencing is a huge help and allows the younger students to more successfully navigate the transition to Mines. Mentors also feel a great sense of pride for helping pave the way for these younger women.
